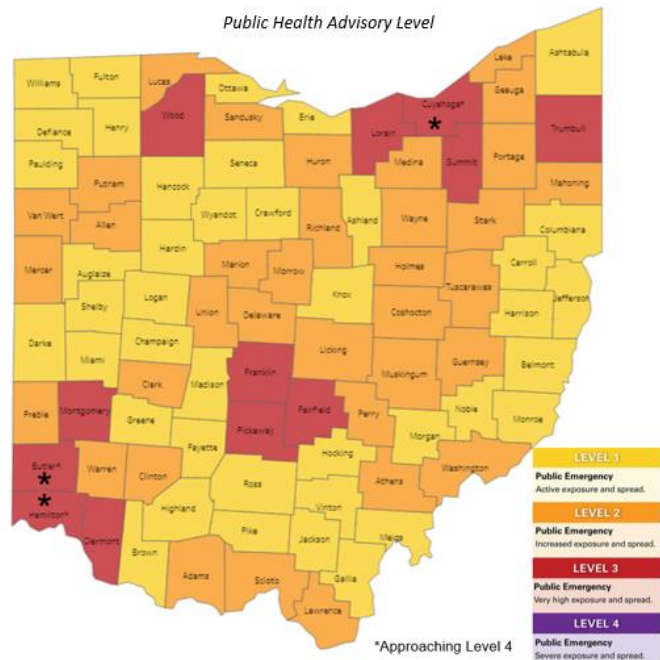
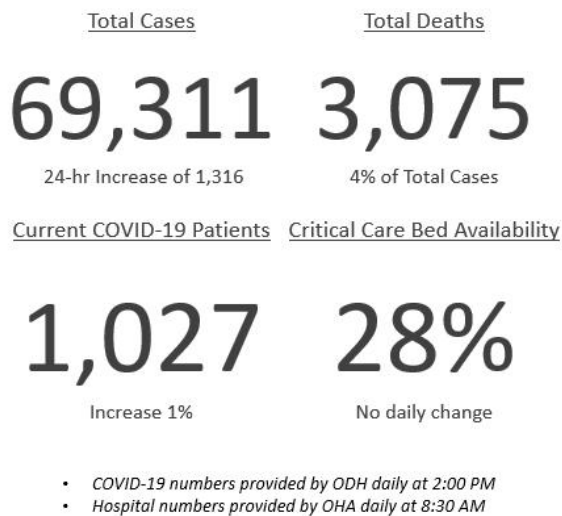
### Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 1,316 (69,311) total new cases, 160 (9,209) hospitalizations, and 36 (2,259) ICU Admissions were above their respective 21-day averages. Six (3,075) deaths was below the 21-day average.

In the last 24 hours, no new hot spots have been identified by ODH.

Warehouse capacity continues to be monitored as inbound supplies increase. State stockpiling and storage strategies continue to be developed through ESF-7 and the State EOC Unified Command.

## State Community Lifeline Status

In-state Response | Ongoing External Support | Assistance Needed

### Primary Lifeline



- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase.
- 7-day moving average of case by onset date steadily increased from mid-June to early July.
- Positivity rate has increased slightly since late June;
- Reproduction number is now ranging between 1.03-1.12 in the three clinical zones.
- ED visits in mid-June show an increase; COVID diagnoses and total bed use continue to increase.
- Limited access to nursing homes & similar facilities continues.
- Personal Protective Equipment, Mass Fatality, and Medical Surge workgroups continue efforts.
- One RRF remains in-progress; 12 addressed and are no longer active.



- The Agriculture workgroup continues to monitor for issues of concern.
- All major pork processing plants impacting Ohio's processing are operating (statewide & nationally).
- Pork depopulation planning continues on account of processing interruption.
- Restaurants are open per the ODH Dine Safe Ohio Order (current as of May 21)
- Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues.
- [Potential quarantine locations](#) have been identified.
- Homelessness workgroup continues to update plans for response.



- First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19.
- Limited access to jails & detention facilities continues.
- ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across their statewide facilities.



- No current impacts to the lifeline requiring EOC support.



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## State EOC Objectives

1. Coordinate the State’s response to limit COVID-19 spread and maintain Lifeline stability.
2. Provide mission support to identify, prevent, mitigate and respond to COVID-19 hot spots.
3. Develop PPE procurement, warehousing, and allotment strategies to meet current and projected needs.
4. Share timely, clear, and consistent information to the whole community, especially as it pertains to recovery programs.

### *Actions Taken:*

- Recap of Ohio Expo Center, Kasich building operations for 7/14/2020:
  - Downloaded 1 trailers for a total of 24 pallets containing the following items:
  - Received 24 pallets of RB Sigma Clear lvl 1 Disposable Poly Protection Gown size small. (72,000 Gowns )
- Shifted operations to the Kasich building and began receiving/transferring loads to the new warehouse. Transferred 268 pallets of Gentox gowns from the Lausche building to the Kasich building. There are currently 1,264 pallets in the Lausche building. Current projections are completely vacating the Lausche building by next Friday, July 24 at the latest.
- Received three pallets of donated Cardinal Health gowns from FEMA at the RSS today. Will move them to ACF for storage.
- Began working with ODH on distribution of ~600K surgical masks (one time use) to OPI to be used by the Minority Health Strike Force to build kits for marginalized and minority communities.
- Working with warehouse staff on PPEs being received, working with suppliers that has send in invoice for their PPEs they have shipped. Working with DAS IT staff for data entry of the PPE inventory.
- Appropriation approved by Controlling Board to transfer fund over to FY21. Will be updating the EOC budget page.
- Continue to work with the warehouse and suppliers on deliveries.

### *Planned Actions:*

- Continue coordinating overflow warehouse operations and work the distribution of the surgical masks to OPI.
- Will be updating the budget page with the new appropriation balance.

## 8 | Public Health

- Ohio Department of Health

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*Actions Taken:*

- Zone 1 – The number of COVID-19 positive cases continues to increase for the third week in a row with numbers for the zone reaching May 2020 levels.
- Recently there has been a significant spike in COVID-19 suspected patients over the last two days; jumping from 295 on Monday to 499 today. The cause of the increase is yet to be determined.
- ODH and DAS met today to discuss next steps for securing the identified Zone 2 Attentive Care site.
- See attached Healthcare Resources Situation Report.
- During this operational period ESF-8 Desk has not initiated any mission requests today with State partners.

*Planned Actions:*

- ESF-8 Partner Touchpoint will be conducted.
- ODH continues to collaborate on daily RFIs and planning efforts with federal and state stakeholders and ESF-8 partners to provide guidance and direct information.

- Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities

*Actions Taken:*

- Continuing with mass testing of all residents and staff at the State operated Developmental Centers with the assistance of the Ohio National Guard.
- To date Warrensville, Mount Vernon, and Tiffin Developmental Centers have had COVID-19 testing completed.

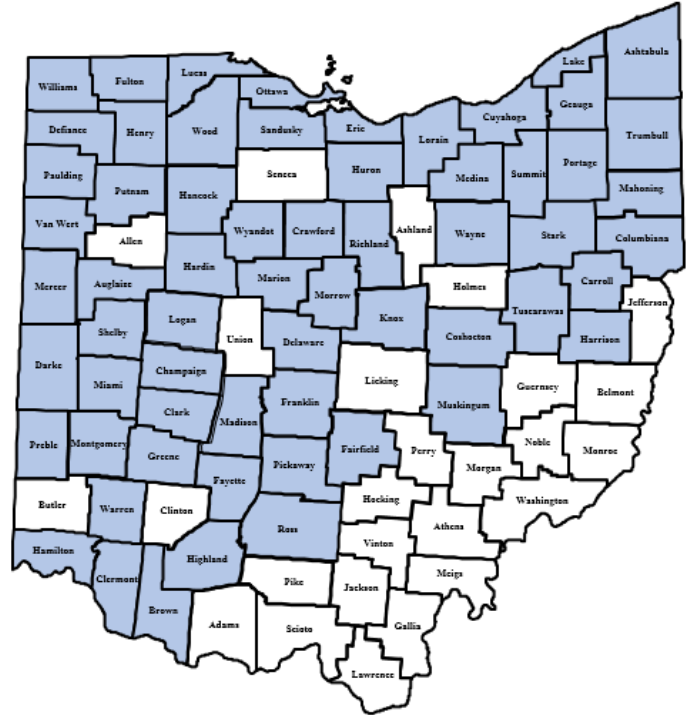

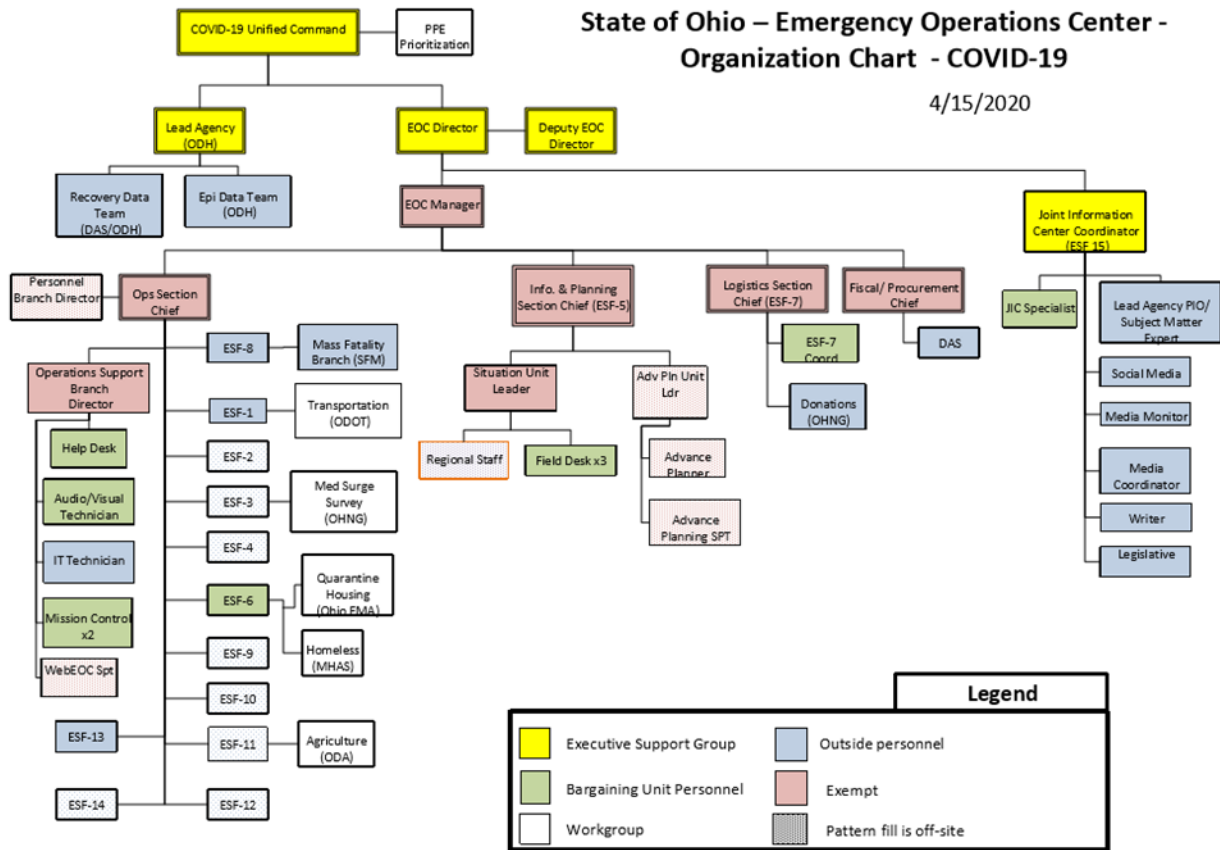
