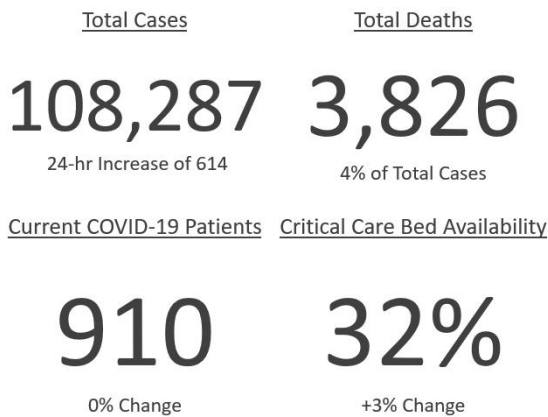

Executive Summary

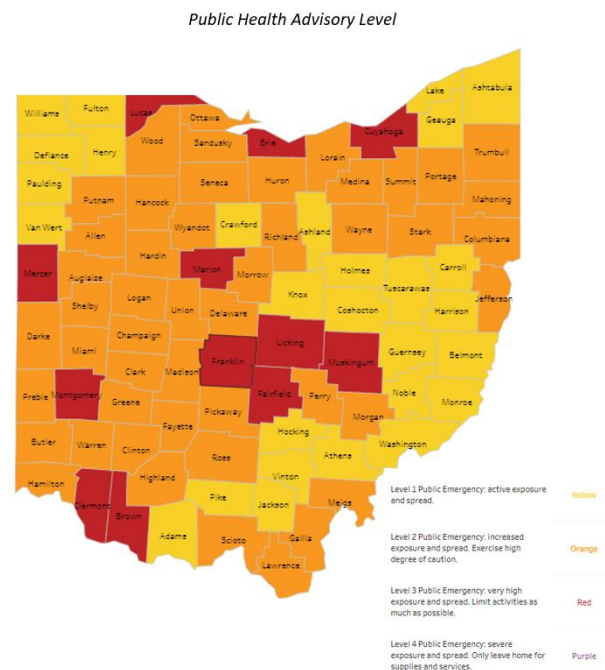
Over the past 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 613 (108,287) total new cases, four (2,771) ICU admissions, two (3,826) deaths, and 26 (12,236) hospitalizations were all below 21-day averages.

Warehouse capacity continues to be monitored as inbound supplies increase. State stockpiling and storage strategies continue to be developed through ESF-7 and the State EOC Unified Command.

State Community Lifeline Status

In-state Response | Ongoing External Support | Assistance Needed

Primary Lifeline



- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase.
- 7-day moving average of case by onset date steadily increased from mid-June to early July, with a modest decrease in recent weeks.
- Positivity rate has plateaued in recent weeks.
- Reproduction number is now ranging between 0.89-1.08 in the three clinical zones.
- ED visits showed a sustained increase from mid June to Mid July, followed by a sustained decline through early August.
- Limited access to nursing homes & similar facilities continues.
- Personal Protective Equipment, Mass Fatality, and Medical Surge workgroups continue efforts.
- One active RRF remain in-progress; 13 addressed and are no longer active.



- The Agriculture workgroup continues to monitor for issues of concern.
- All major pork processing plants impacting Ohio's processing are operating (statewide & nationally).
- Pork depopulation planning continues on account of processing interruption.
- Restaurants are open per the ODH Dine Safe Ohio Order (current as of May 21)
- Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues.
- Potential quarantine locations have been identified.
- Homelessness workgroup continues to update plans for response.



- First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19. (ODH Order)
- Limited access to jails & detention facilities continues.
- ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across their statewide facilities.



- No current impacts to the lifeline requiring EOC support.

4. Share timely, clear, and consistent information to the whole community, especially as it pertains to recovery programs.

- Continued Ombudsman response to consumer concerns about visitation and quality in long-term care facilities.

- Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction

Actions Taken:

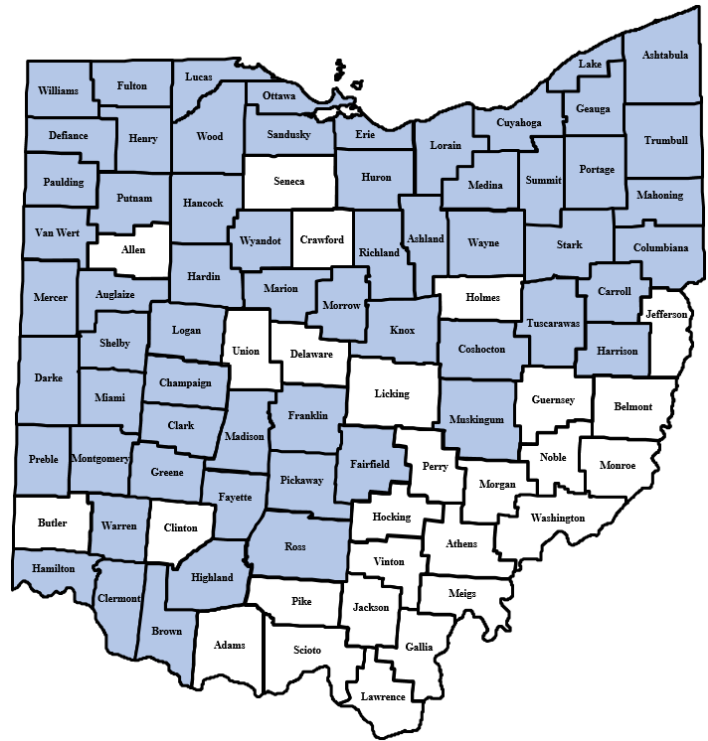
- ODRC continues to work towards incident objectives.

Planned Actions:

- ODRC has 1022 staff COVID-19 positive, 905 staff recovered, 117 active positives and 5 deaths.
- ODRC has 182 incarcerated adults COVID-19 active positive, 4,363 recovered and 77 deaths, 22,717 total tested.
- ODRC Special Operations team members working at Chillicothe Correctional Institution for a security mission and Allen Correctional Institution, Chillicothe Correctional Institution, Madison Correctional Institution and Southern Ohio Correctional Facility for medical missions.
- Ohio State Highway Patrol assisting with perimeter security at Chillicothe Correctional Institution activated July 23, 2020.
- ODRC continues to have hot spots with staff and inmate positive COVID-19, most of the hot spot institutions reflect the hot spots (counties) in the State of Ohio.

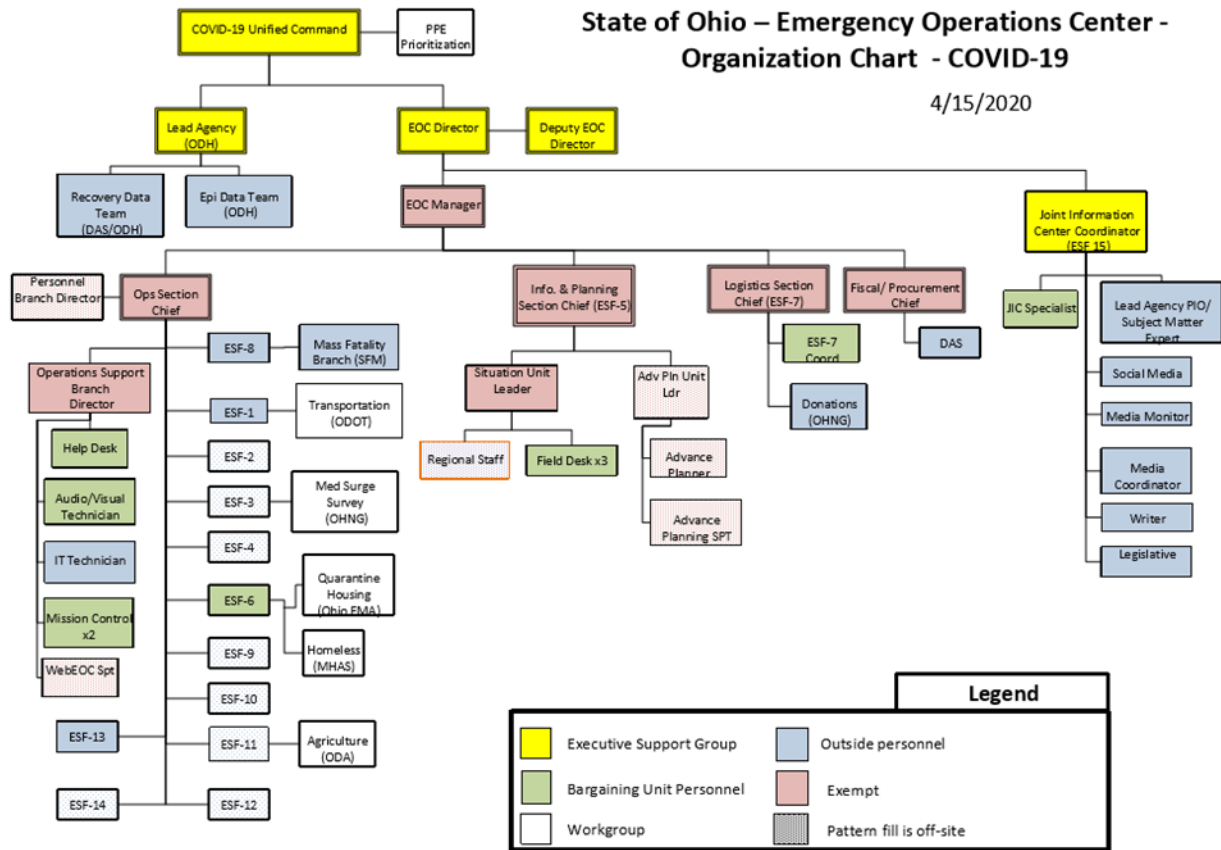
