Executive Summary

ODH-confirmed COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations, and deaths continued to trend upward. According to ODH, 344 (+68) of the 1406 (+269) confirmed cases are currently hospitalized.

ESF-8 (Public Health) and ESF-1 (Transportation) executed delivery of a second SNS allotment to the counties. ESF-8 received notification from Assistant Secretary of Preparedness and Response of a third PPE push on March 29.

Quarantine site assessment guidance is expected from ESF-8 within the next 24 hours. ESF-14 (Recovery & Mitigation) has received 104 requests for Public Assistance (EM-3457-OH); the draft request letter for a major disaster declaration has been signed by the Governor and sent to FEMA Region V.

The State Emergency Operations Center (EOC) maintains Full Activation, with Emergency Support Functions 1, 5, 6 (Lead Agency only), 7, 8, 13, and 15 being required at the EOC. All other ESFs are contributing virtually.

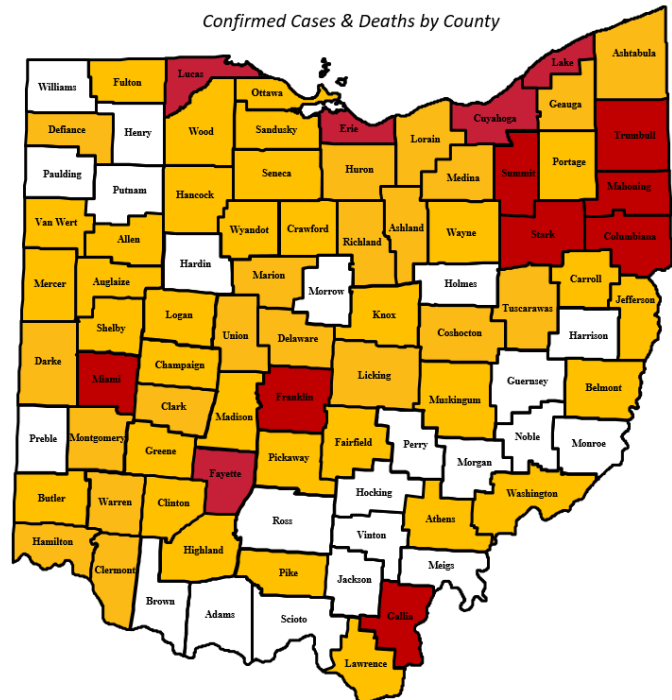

ODH adapted the guidance from Tier 1 by identifying the front-line occupations in the priority tier that require allocation of PPE. These occupational groups include:

- Coordination with Ohio AIRS.
- Sourced planner support for Homeless Work Group.

ESF-6 | Mass Care (Cont.)

- Compiled Draft-Final version of Quarantine Station Plan, sent to Workgroup Lead for distribution to stakeholders.
- Worked through a number of coordination efforts on projects including the Quarantine Site Plan, phone service for telehealth, Ohio AIRS / 2-1-1 follow-up with counties.

Planned Actions:

- 24-hrs: Mission support, situational awareness, and coordination with relevant partners.
- 48-hrs: Full distribution of Quarantine Station Plan and guidance to locals for sites. Guide for civilians to work with OHNG finalized for distribution.

- Research more about OMORT as to how much it is going to be.
- Notified that there will be a delivery from FEMA Depot Atlanta, arriving 2AM on 3/29 at the ODH warehouse.

8 | Public Health

- Ohio Department of Health

Actions Taken:

- The Receipt, Store and Stage (RSS) Warehouse completed shipment of the second push of personal protective equipment (PPE) to the counties. This shipment was executed, in coordination with Ohio Department of Transportation.
- Received notification from of a third PPE push for March 29.
- Submitted a request for federal medical stations.
- Collaborated with ONG on medical surge advance planning with data from Ohio Hospital Association (OHA) and submitted hospital plans.

ESF-8 | Public Health (Cont.)

- Participated in a Long Term Care Strike Team calls today with Manor Care - Cuyahoga Co.
- Since this incident began, ODH has received twenty eight (28) Mission/RFIs and completed fifteen (15); during this operations period ESF-8 Desk has not initiated Mission Requests with State Partners.

Planned Actions:

- Working with Ohio Hospital Association (OHA) to refine bed availability and resource capacity across Ohio hospitals.
 - Continue to monitor Hospital Bed availability by region.
 - Continue to collaborate with state partners on medical surge, PPE, and fatality management planning.
- Ohio Department of Aging (ODA) and State Long-Term Care Ombudsman (SLTCO)
Actions Taken:
 - State Ombudsman participated in three county Long-Term Care Strike Team calls with impacted nursing facilities.
Planned Actions:
 - One county LTC Strike Team call may be held on Sunday 3/29/2020. Four are anticipated on 3/30/2020.
 - Regional ombudsman will continue to reach out to family members to address concerns and answer questions.

- Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities

Actions Taken:

- In an effort to eliminate potential barriers to the authorization and delivery of needed services, the Department has temporarily lifted standard requirements for authorization for waiver services.
- Distributed guidance to stakeholders that explains when covered entities may disclose PHI to law enforcement, paramedics, other first responders, and public health authorities without the person's Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) authorization.
- Participated in strike force team meetings with Woodlands and Manor Care.
- Assisted with PPE requests.
- Monitored bed availability in State Developmental Centers.

Planned Actions:

- Working on development of DODD regional support teams.

9 | Search and Rescue

Actions Taken:

- Nothing new to report. No current missions

11 | Agriculture

- Delivered food and supplies to the elderly and people without transportation.

State EOC Objectives

1. Coordinate the State's response to limit spread of COVID-19; and maintain medical care.
2. Provide timely, clear, and consistent messaging to the public, stakeholders and media on the status of COVID-19 and actions the public can take to keep themselves safe.
3. Determine how state agencies will continue delivery of essential services to Ohioans while following COVID-19 public health guidelines.
4. Identify supply bottlenecks that threaten community lifelines and tools the state can provide to improve the supply situation.
5. Determine what emergency authorities and programs are now available through the National Emergency and Public Health Emergency Declarations

National Emergency Declaration for COVID-19

- On March 13, 2020, a federal emergency disaster was declared for the Public Assistance Program. This declaration is limited to costs incurred by state and local government and in very limited circumstances, non-profit organizations, for Category B, emergency protective measures.
- On March 19, 2020, U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) has approved Ohio's request to allow small businesses and nonprofits in Ohio to apply for low-interest, long-term loans of up to \$2 million through the SBA's Economic Injury Disaster Loan program.
