Executive Summary

ODH-confirmed COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations, and deaths continued to trend upward. According to ODH, 403 (+59) of the 1653 (+247) confirmed cases are currently hospitalized.

The State Emergency Operations Center (EOC) continues to advocate for PPE conservation efforts, while continuing to source, acquisition, and focus on distribution efforts. Medical surge plans continues to be reviewed and potential needs assessed. ESF-8 (Public Health) continues to monitor hospital bed availability by region. Many hospitals have noted they are planning alternative care sites within their facilities.

A draft Quarantine Station Support Plan has been drafted by the workgroup for review on March 30th; the support plan caters to individuals for who self-quarantining within their own home is not a viable option.

The State Emergency Operations Center (EOC) maintains Full Activation, with Emergency Support Functions 1, 5, 6 (Lead Agency only), 7, 8, 13, and 15 being required at the EOC. All other ESFs are contributing virtually.



The RSS reports, the second truck of the 3rd/final PPE shipment has been received and downloaded at the RSS, Additionally, there are three advance shipping notices that the RSS has received but estimated times of arrival have not been provided.

- ODH requested Ohio Mortuary Operational Response Team (OMORT) to provide representation at the State EOC in and effort align their planning efforts with medical surge planning.
- ODH conducted a call with the Ohio Board of Funeral Directors and Embalmers to discuss challenges on Emergency Rule implementation.
- ODH collaborated with Ohio National Guard on March 29th on medical surge advance planning with data from OHA and submitted hospital plans. Additional planning is forthwith.
- ODH Participated in one (1) Long Term Care Strike Team call on March 29th with Inn at Glennellen (Mahoning County).
- Fatality Management Purpose: Build an operational plan for fatality management in response to COVID-19 Make up of Group:

State EOC Objectives

- 4. Identify supply bottlenecks that threaten community lifelines and tools the state can provide to improve the supply situation.
- 5. Determine what emergency authorities and programs are now available through the National Emergency and Public Health Emergency Declarations

National Emergency Declaration for COVID-19

- On March 13, 2020, a federal emergency disaster was declared for the Public Assistance Program. This declaration is limited to costs incurred by state and local government and in very limited circumstances, non-profit organizations, for Category B, emergency protective measures.
- On March 19, 2020, U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) has approved Ohio's request to allow small businesses and nonprofits in Ohio to apply for low-interest, long-term loans of up to \$2 million through the SBA's Economic Injury Disaster Loan program.
