COVID-19 Staff Screening Assessment

All of the following have been identified as findings related to COVID-19 by health agencies

- Oral Temperature Assessment ($\geq 100.4^{\circ}\text{F}$)
- Signs/symptoms of acute seasonal flu or COVID-19 (i.e. coughing, sore throat, shortness of breath, chills, headache, vomiting, muscle aches, diarrhea)
 - o **NOTE:** *seasonal allergies, chronic respiratory issues (i.e. smoker's cough, sneezing, runny nose, etc...) are not alone related to COVID-19*
- Contact with someone with known or suspected seasonal flu or COVID-19

If a member of the department presents with any of the above criteria the member should be isolated from other personnel (distance, mask, etc...). Notice should be made immediately to the Deputy Chief (Health & Safety Officer), or their designee, for guidance and instruction. Possible outcomes include, but are not limited to:

- Member is sent home to self-monitor (home quarantine)
- Member is referred to the Sidney/Shelby County Health Department for monitoring/testing
- Contact is made with Occupational Medicine for further medical evaluation or advice

Upon completion of this staff screening assessment, the screening log sheet (SDFES_COVID-19_SCRLOG) shall be completed and forwarded to the Deputy Fire Chief (Health & Safety Officer) for retention and communication to community partners (i.e. nursing homes, jail, shelters) that on-duty staff has been screened and responding personnel are asymptomatic at the start of the shift. Members will again be screened upon completion of their shift.
