Current Situation:

Public Health – Dayton & Montgomery County, the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and World Health Organization (WHO) are closely monitoring an outbreak of respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus (termed "COVID-19") first identified in Wuhan City, Hubei Province, China in December 2019 and which continues to expand.

Current Updates:

- MOST IMPORTANT MESSAGE OF THE DAY: DO EVERYTHING YOU CAN TO CONSERVE PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE).
- The Montgomery County EOC is now running virtually it can be reached at 937-225-6316. Hours are from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM.
- ODH released a Director's Order to stay at home. This went into effect at 11:59 PM March 23, 2020 and can be found at coronavirus.ohio.gov.
- Public Health added a physician's/medical providers portion to our webpage it can be found at: https://www.phdmc.org/physicians-medical-providers
- There is a <u>very limited supply of PPE</u> and we will work to ensure all healthcare and response organizations get a portion of what's available.
- Strategic National Stockpile (SNS) allocation has arrived in Montgomery County. There was a limited amount of PPE provided from this source. This will be combined with PPE resources within the region and will be shared with partners shortly.
- Public Health COVID-19 informational phone line remains open. It is in place to answer general questions about COVID-19. It is opened Monday through Friday from 8 AM to 6 PM. It will now be open





- Public Health continues to conduct news briefings with partners on a daily basis, Monday through Friday.
- ODH information line remains open, the number is 1-833-4-ASK-ODH and is open seven days a week.
- Public Health continues to monitor all sources (ODH, CDC, WHO, European Center for Disease and Prevention and Control (ECOC) for the latest information.
- Public Health maintains its one-week operational period for this response.
- Public Health will continue to share the situational report with other local health departments, Montgomery County Emergency Management, Greater Dayton Area Hospital Association and Dayton Metropolitan Medical Response System partners.

CDC Update (Situation in the US):

CDC is closely monitoring an outbreak of respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus named COVID-19. The outbreak first started in Wuhan, China, but cases have been identified in a growing number of other international locations, including the United States. 
- Four new countries/territories/areas from the South-East Asia Region [1], and Region of the Americas [3] have reported cases of COVID-19.
- WHO has delivered a new shipment of emergency medical supplies to the Islamic Republic of Iran as part of COVID-19 response measures. Details can be found on the WHO Regional Office for the Eastern Mediterranean.
- The WHO WhatsApp Health Alert has now attracted 10 million users since launching Friday, and the COVID-19 Solidarity Response Fund has raised more than US\$70 million, in just 10 days.
- WHO and FIFA launched a joint campaign to equip the football community to tackle COVID-19. This awareness campaign calls on all people around the world to follow the five key steps to stop the spread of the disease.
- WHO and its partners are constantly working to strengthen the chains of essential COVID-19 supplies. As global demand rises, WHO and its partners aim to ensure assistance to areas most in need.





Distribution of COVID-19 cases worldwide, as of 23 Mar 2020


Distribution of COVID-19 cases worldwide, as of 23 March 2020
