Current Situation:

Public Health – Dayton & Montgomery County, the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and World Health Organization (WHO) are closely monitoring an outbreak of respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus (termed "COVID-19") first identified in Wuhan City, Hubei Province, China in December 2019 and which continues to expand.

Current Updates:

- President Trump declared a National Emergency in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- ODH confirmed and additional eight cases today of COVID-19.
- The World Health Organization declaredCOVID-19 a pandemic on Wednesday.
- On March 11, 2020 the U.S. government blocked foreign nationals from 26 European countries from entering the country for the next 30 days.
- Currently ODH, as of today has the capability to test 500 people a day.
- Gov. DeWine suggested the following updates during a press conference this week:
 - All large gatherings cannot exceed 100 individuals (private and public)
 - All schools K-12 will close by end of school day Monday, March 16, 2020.
 - Religious institutions should consider limiting practices to spread germs, those in high-risk should stay home.
 - ODH will soon update its current order limiting visitors to nursing and assisted living homes to reflect that no visitors will be admitted.
 - Daycares currently remain open for the time being.
 - Visitation at Ohio's adult and juvenile correction facilities are suspended.





- Public Health opened a COVID-19 informational phone line. It is in place to answer general questions about COVID-19. It is opened Monday through Friday from 8 AM to 4 PM. It can be reached at 937-225-6217.
- Public Health will be conducting a conference call with high-risk populations (longterm care, hospice, dialysis, home care, etc.)
- The city of Dayton declared a state of emergency on Thursday.
- Public Health has established a presenters group that will provide presentations on COVID-19 to interested agencies. Based on the size of the group the most of these presentations will be completed virtually. Please contact 937-225-6026 to schedule a presentation.
- Montgomery County is planning on establishing a Unified Command early next week.
- ODH information line remains open, the number is 1-833-4-ASK-ODH and is open seven days a week.
- Public Health continues to monitor all sources (ODH, CDC, WHO, European Center for Disease and Prevention and Control (ECOC) for the latest information.
- Public Health maintains its one-week operational period for this response.
- Public Health will continue to share the situational report with other local health departments, Montgomery County Emergency Management, Greater Dayton Area Hospital Association and Dayton Metropolitan Medical Response System partners.

CDC Update (Situation in the US):

CDC is closely monitoring an outbreak of respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus named COVID-19. The outbreak first started in Wuhan, China, but cases have been identified in a growing number of other international locations, including the United States. CDC will update the following U.S. map daily. Information regarding the number of people under investigation will be updated daily.



- Four new countries/territories/areas (French Polynesia, Turkey, Honduras and Côte d'Ivoire) have reported cases of COVID-19 in the past 24 hours.
- The Clinical Unit continues to convene clinicians around the globe, twice weekly by teleconference (COVID-19 Clinical Network) to share knowledge and experiences from clinicians caring for COVID-19 patients and highlight operational challenges and technical questions.
- At the Member States information session held today, WHO Director-General reiterated that countries should not give up on stopping the outbreak now that WHO has characterized it as a pandemic. A shift from containment to mitigation would be wrong and dangerous. This is a controllable pandemic.
- On 11 March, ICAO and WHO issued a joint statement to reminding all stakeholders of the importance of existing regulations and guidance.






Distribution of COVID-19 cases worldwide
