Executive Summary

ODH-confirmed COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations, and deaths continued to trend upward. According to ODH, 475 (+72) of the 1,933 (+280) confirmed cases are currently hospitalized.

The State Emergency Operations Center (EOC) continues to advocate for PPE conservation efforts, while continuing to source, acquisition, and focus on distribution efforts. Medical surge plans continue to be reviewed and potential needs assessed.

On Saturday, March 28, a request for a major disaster declaration was submitted to FEMA by ESF-14. This request was for Disaster Unemployment Assistance, Crisis Counseling, a major declaration for Public Assistance (Category B), direct federal assistance to allow federal agencies to provide assistance to the state, and 100% funding for Public Assistance.

ESF-8 reports that the third shipment of PPE has arrived at the warehouse and is scheduled to be delivered to the counties on Wednesday, April 1.

The State Emergency Operations Center (EOC) maintains Full Activation, with Emergency Support Functions 1, 5, 6 (Lead Agency only), 7, 8, 13, and 15 being required at the EOC. All other ESFs are contributing virtually.

- ODH collaborated with the Veterans Administration Hospitals Region V Liaison to discuss current and potential VA hospital resources for use.
- ODH finalized COVID-19 strike team activation process and associated documentation/materials.

National Emergency Declaration for COVID-19

- On March 13, 2020, a federal emergency disaster was declared for the Public Assistance Program. This declaration is limited to costs incurred by state and local government and in very limited circumstances, non-profit organizations, for Category B, emergency protective measures.
- On March 19, 2020, U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) has approved Ohio's request to allow small businesses and nonprofits in Ohio to apply for low-interest, long-term loans of up to \$2 million through the SBA's Economic Injury Disaster Loan program.
