Executive Summary

ODH-confirmed COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations, and deaths continued to trend upward. According to ODH, 679 (+94) of the 2,547 (+348) confirmed cases are currently hospitalized.

Alternate Care Site location assessments are being conducted by County EMAs and healthcare regions in preparation to meet medical needs associated with projected hospitalization surge. Potential locations will be evaluated by the Joint Engineering Assessment Teams (led by Ohio National Guard) to determine final suitability.

Workgroups continue to plan for assessed medical surge, personal protective equipment, quarantine, and congregate care needs.

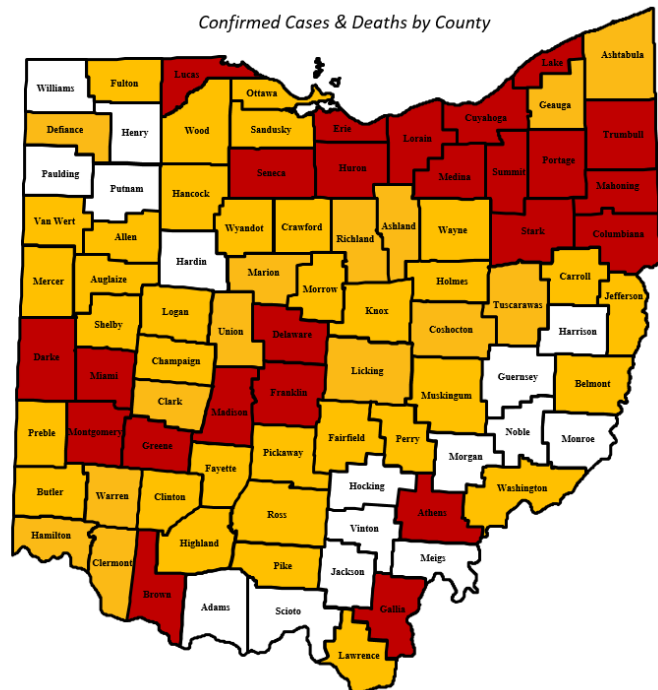

1 | Transportation

- Will lead a transportation work group with ESF-6 partners and EMS regarding Mass Transit and Mass mobility.

- Continued work with various volunteer groups to secure support for missions.
- Salvation Army reports a significant number of meals / boxed meals provided (~33k total), a variety of other kits, support for spiritual and emotional care for ~1300 contacts, and 1241 volunteers contributing 5495hrs for these efforts.

 - Rocky Knoll (Summit Co)

ESF-8 | Public Health (cont.)

- Developed a COVID-19 staffing survey; the purpose of this survey is to identify additional licensed personnel who could support potential hospital and behavioral health surge from COVID-19.
 - Intended for health care professional licensing boards, for dissemination to their licensees and contacts

Planned Actions:

- Continue to monitor Statewide Hospital Resource Utilization Statistics, including hospital bed availability.
- ODH and Ohio EMA is scheduling the pickup of the deployed mobile cooling unit from the Franklin County Coroner's Office.
 - A mission for ESF-1 will be forthcoming.
- Planning another LTC Strike Team Call for April 2nd.

- State Long-Term Care Ombudsman/ Ohio Department of Aging

Actions Taken:

- Participated in the Transportation questions meeting today.
 - Department leadership explained during the call that our aging population is one that is highly vulnerable.
- The Regional Area Agencies on aging coordinated transportation in various situations, via our contracted service providers and for our seniors. These service providers may also overlap other systems as well.

Planned Actions:

- Regional ombudsman will continue to reach out to residents and family members to address concerns and answer questions.

 - Topics discussed include current conditions, future projections, prioritization of enforcement efforts, and resource shortages.
 - Each state's strategic response to COVID-19 was also discussed, which included topics such as supply needs, personnel procedures, academy training and teleworking procedures.
 - Discussion revealed Ohio remains at the forefront in planning and execution of our response to COVID-19, both at the Governor's level and OSHP.
- Continued to provide site security for the Ohio Department of Health.
- Continued coordination/participation with EOC partners through participation in the COVID-19 Quarantine Working Group.
- Troopers in cooperation with Ross County Health District, the Chillicothe Police Department and the Ross County Sheriff's Office distributed informational cards about COVID-19 to the homeless in Ross County.
- Supporting Butler County Head Start by distributing meals to locations throughout the county.
- Packaging and distributing food for Meals on Wheels in multiple counties, including but not limited to Marion, Franklin and Madison counties.
- Distributed meals at the Wilmington City School District.
- Conducted spot checks of commercial heavy hauler blanket overweight permits.

Planned Actions:

- Dayton Post units will be assisting the Ohio National Guard and the Dayton Police Department with traffic control during food distribution from the Dayton Food Bank.

 - CIMS users were experiencing outages and errors during the first half of the day. Due to the high usage of CIMS the server was running out of RAM which was causing the errors and outages. After working with CIMS IT and the server team, normal functionality has been restored. However, this
