

### **Executive Summary**

ODH-confirmed COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations, and deaths continued to trend upward. According to ODH, 1,104 (+98) of the 4,043 (+304) confirmed cases are currently hospitalized. The five day average of those hospitalized being admitted to the Intensive Care Unit is 30 per day.

Two Alternate Care Site locations have been selected for state establishment (Franklin and Cuyahoga Counties), with additional potential sites across the state being evaluated for final approval. Potential locations continue to be evaluated by the Joint Engineering Assessment Teams (led by Ohio National Guard) to determine final suitability.

State EOC Workgroups continue to plan and support County EMA medical surge needs, to include increasing medical and mortuary service capacity, addressing personal protective equipment needs, quarantine, and congregate care needs.

- Long Term Care Facilities



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### State EOC Active Workgroups

#### Homelessness

Purpose: To develop guidance and support for local communities as they support the distinct needs of these Ohioans and the staff at congregate care facilities.

Update: Committee continues to meet and discuss housing need impacts due to COVID-19. Addressing housing and homelessness needs and coordinating agency and partner activity in planning for community needs through continued meeting and discussion and strategic planning across state agencies.

Workgroup Details: Lead Agency: Ohio Mental Health and Addiction Services Participating Partners: Coalition of Homelessness and Housing in Ohio, Ohio Housing Finance Agency, Governor's Office, Ohio EMA, Department of Developmental Disabilities

### Mass Fatality

Purpose: To assemble stakeholders within mass fatality/fatality management to develop statewide strategies and unified effort in the management of decedents.

Update: Progress has been made in the identification of facility locations for fatality management. Site visits to these facilities will be taking place next week in Franklin and Hamilton County.

Workgroup Details: Lead Agency: Ohio Department of Health Participating Partners: Ohio Emergency Management Agency, Ohio Department of Health, Ohio State Coroners Association, Ohio Mortuary Operational Response Team, Ohio Board of Funeral Directors and embalmers, Ohio Funeral Directors Association.

### Medical Surge

Purpose: Planning for needs to address forecast Medical Surge needs. Alternate Care Site Support in support of Med Surge

Update: Continues to coordinate and implement Alternate Care Site plan to meet facility, equipment, staffing, and process needs. Currently conducting assessment of potential ACS locations. County EMAs, local health partners, and state-led Engineer Assessment Teams are coordinating site assessment and approval. Recommended sites are being submitted to the State EOC for final approval.

#### Workgroup Details:

Lead Agency: Ohio Department of Health Participating Partners: Ohio National Guard, ESF-4, Ohio EMA Regional Office

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#### Personal Protective Equipment

Purpose: To determine and allocate appropriate PPE for COVID-19 responders.

Update: The group has established a list of needed PPE to acquire through donation or procurement. An initial plan for allotment of donated resources has been approved. A PPE tracking form is being developed and will be provided following its approval. A daily 15 minute sync has been established to supplement current meeting times.

Workgroup Details:

Lead Agency: Ohio Department of Health

Participating Partners: Department of Administrative Services, Emergency Management Agency, Ohio Department of Health, Emergency Medical Services, Fire Marshall, Mental Health and Addiction Services, Department of Natural Resources, Department of Aging, and Department of Medicaid.

### Quarantine

#### Purpose: To plan and implement quarantine planning considerations.

Update: Fifty five (55) locations were added to the list of potential quarantine sites.

Workgroup Details:

Lead Agency: Ohio Emergency Management Agency Participating Partners: DAS, ODH, MHAS, OHNG, DOE (Education), ODNR, SFM, ODOT, ODA, Ombudsman, ODRC, ODJFS, Ohio SILC, ARC, Salvation Army, Ohio VOAD, Ohio EMA Ops, ESF-5, ESF-6, ESF-7, ESF-8.

### Transportation

Purpose: To discuss and implement mass transit and mobility needs.

Update: The group continues to plan against anticipated transportation needs associated with the forecast medical surge.

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### State EOC Objectives

- 1. Coordinate the State's response to limit spread of COVID-19; and maintain medical care.
- 2. Provide timely, clear, and consistent messaging to the public, stakeholders and media on the status of COVID-19 and actions the public can take to keep themselves safe.
- 3. Determine how state agencies will continue delivery of essential services to Ohioans while following COVID-19 public health guidelines.
- 4. Identify supply bottlenecks that threaten community lifelines and tools the state can provide to improve the supply situation.
- 5. Determine what emergency authorities and programs are now available through the National Emergency and Public Health Emergency Declarations
- 6. Purchase 1,00,000 sets of PPE weekly until the surge occurs

### Ohio COVID-19 Pandemic (DR-4507)

- Declared on March 31, 2020. Incident Period: January 20, 2020 and continuing
- Public Assistance (Assistance to State, Local, Tribal and Territorial governments and certain private-non-profit organizations for emergency work and the repair or replacement of disaster-damaged facilities) has been designated for all 88 counties.


