Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, the increase in new cases (+354), hospitalizations (+89), ICU admissions (+23), and deaths (+6), were all lower than the five-day average. According to ODH, 1,948 of the 6,604 confirmed cases are currently hospitalized.

The State EOC continued response efforts on April 12 with limited staffing onsite. Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) allocation planning took place in addition to continued acquisition efforts.

State EOC Workgroups continue to plan and support County EMA efforts in the realms of PPE, medical surge, mortuary services, quarantine plans, congregate care, and homelessness.

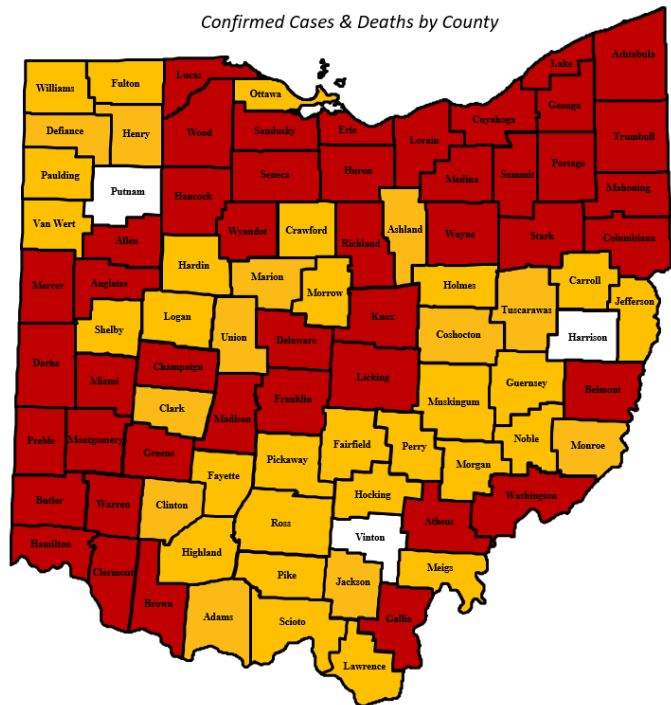

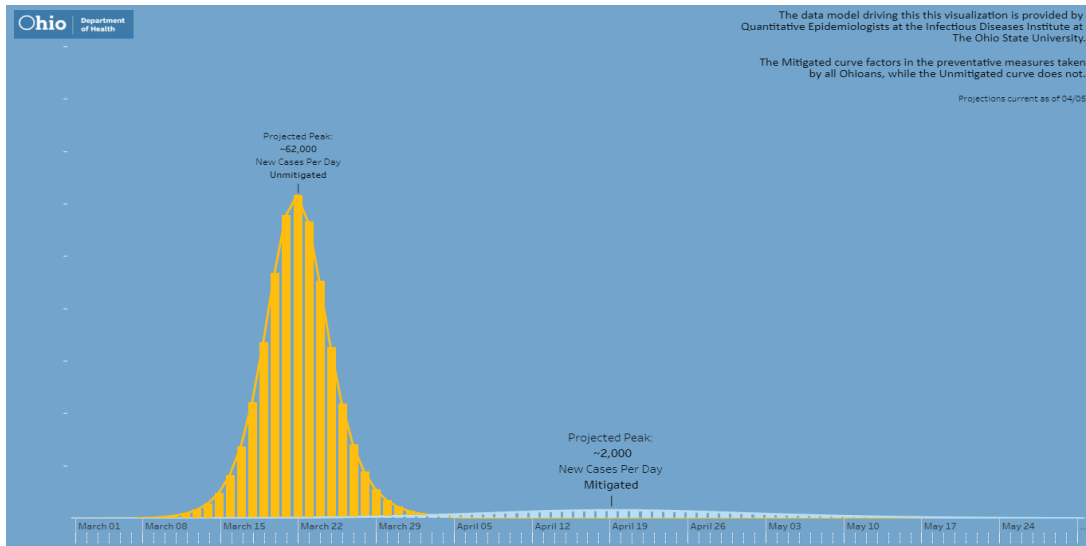

Homelessness

Purpose: Strategically address and respond to the needs of Ohio's families, youth, and adults experiencing homelessness or at imminent risk of homelessness.

Update: The workgroup is working on a plan to expand the scope of its efforts to include youth homelessness. The team is developing recommendations and a guideline document to support quarantine sites.

Update: The workgroup met to discuss changes to state planning and determined the Ohio Mortuary Operational Response Team will not be utilized for COVID-19 response. Planning continues with the Ohio National Guard.

 - *Northwest:*
 - Hospitals are continuing to update SurgeNet twice daily and the OHA Resource Tracker once daily.
 - Hospitals continue to evaluate surge capacity and are exploring methods to rapidly respond to surge in their communities.
 - *Northeast:*
 - Nothing to report.
 - *Northeast Central:*
 - St. Elizabeth Boardman Hospital is reporting 43 confirmed COVID patients, which is the largest count in the region today. St. Joseph in Trumbull County

ESF-8 | Public Health (cont.)

- is reporting 10 or 13 ventilators are in use. Additional capacity exists in the region. Most hospitals are reporting lower than normal ED volume and are on full lockdown, allowing no visitors.
- *Central:*
 - Participated in ODH call.
- *Southeast / Southeast Central:*
 - Continue to expand the SE/SEC Regional Surge Plan.
 - Reviewed and analyzed new ODH/OSU data and shared this information with the SE/SEC hospitals. The region will continue to push forward with surge beds despite the lower expected number of cases which the region appears to be able to surge. Based on the data per county we have 11 counties who do not have ICU capabilities but do have the total capacity in the region to be able to accommodate the ICU patients.
 - All SE/SEC hospitals have submitted their 213 RR forms to local EMA for resources needed to open the additional space hospitals identified for their surge.
 - Next SE/SEC hospital call on Thursday April 9, 2020 at 12:00 p.m.
 - Provided a guidance document and the 213RR and COVID-19 document to all healthcare coalition members regarding requesting PPE through local EMA.
 - Began discussions on Mass Fatality Planning. SE/SEC looking at resources needed and working with their local coroners to review their plans. Looking at their cache body bags to determine the quality. A regional plan was shared with the hospitals.
- *West Central:*
 - Nothing to report.
- *Southwest:*
 - Task force determined SW region will begin updating bed availability on Surge Net every 4 hours 24/7 beginning 4/4/20. Assisting with Surge Net access requests from hospitals, rehab facilities, transportation workgroup and EMS when requested.
 - Task Force/Steering Committee Update:
 - Data Workgroup-Validating THC data with hospital systems
 - Updated committee on Duke progress/status
 - Discussion on activation thresholds
 - Additional operational workgroups: Data, Supply Chain, PIO, SNF, Outlying/Specialty Hospitals, Vulnerable Populations, Transportation, Clinical Protocols, ACS (Duke and Liberty), Psychiatry, Crisis Standards of Care The Health Collaborative leveraging staff resources for project management and support of work groups.

ESF-8 | Public Health (cont.)

 - Completed/closed forty six (46).
 - Eight (8) in progress
 - Twenty six (26) being assigned primary for specimen collection kits and pharmaceuticals.
- During this operational period ESF-8 Desk has not initiated any Mission Requests with State Partners.

- Continue to monitor Statewide Hospital Resource Utilization Statistics including hospital bed availability.

 - Continue to collaborate on various RFIs and planning efforts with stakeholders and ESF-8 partners to provide guidance and direct information.

State EOC Objectives

1. Coordinate the State's response to limit spread of COVID-19; and maintain medical care.
2. Provide timely, clear, and consistent messaging to the public, stakeholders and media on the status of COVID-19 and actions the public can take to keep themselves safe.
3. Determine how state agencies will continue delivery of essential services to Ohioans while following COVID-19 public health guidelines.
4. Identify supply bottlenecks that threaten community lifelines and tools the state can provide to improve the supply situation.
5. Determine what emergency authorities and programs are now available through the National Emergency and Public Health Emergency Declarations
6. Purchase 1,000,000 sets of PPE weekly until the surge occurs

Ohio COVID-19 Pandemic (DR-4507)

- Declared on March 31, 2020. Incident Period: January 20, 2020 and continuing
