State EOC Active Workgroups

Homelessness

Purpose: Strategically address and respond to the needs of Ohio's families, youth, & adults experiencing homelessness or at imminent risk of homelessness.

Update: The Housing & Homelessness Committee is splitting work into smaller working groups. The Medicaid Office will be included in the working group.

COHHIO developed a document to give guidance to hotel and motels as isolation, quarantine, respite or emergency shelters for non-congregant options. In addition, COHHIO shared an example of a screening tool that could be modified to assist shelters and housing programs when screening in a COVID-19 environment. Example was offered to shelter & housing stakeholders.

OhioMHAS senior leadership met with ODH Preparedness and shared workforce surge data collected in surveys with state's credentialing & licensing boards. The teams shared information to identify chemical dependency, counselors and social workers & psychology-licensed members.

Mass Fatality

Purpose: To assemble stakeholders within mass fatality/fatality management to develop statewide strategies & unified effort in the management of decedents.

Update: Continued to work in developing a statewide strategy. A clinician outreach communication activity (COCA) was shared to appropriate stakeholders on Guidance for Certifying Deaths Due to COVID-19. The workgroup has identified a branch director to support operations.

Workgroup Details:

Lead Agency: Ohio Department of Health

Participating Partners: Ohio Emergency Management Agency, Ohio Department of Health, Ohio State Coroners Association, Ohio Mortuary Operational Response Team, Ohio Board of Funeral Directors and embalmers, Ohio Funeral Directors Association.

Medical Surge

Purpose: Planning for needs to address forecast Medical Surge needs.

Update: The workgroup continues to coordinate & implement Alternate Care Site plan to meet facility, equipment, staffing, and process needs. Three state sites have been selected for use, one location is operational.

Lead Agency: Ohio Department of Health | Participating Partners: Ohio National Guard, ESF-4, Ohio EMA Regional Office

Personal Protective Equipment

Purpose: To determine and allocate appropriate PPE for COVID-19 responders.

Update: The group has established a list of needed PPE to acquire through donation or procurement. Efforts continue to identify a plan to allot the state's current stock.

Participating Partners: Department of Administrative Services, Emergency Management Agency, Ohio Department of Health, Emergency Medical Services, Fire Marshall, Mental Health and Addiction Services, Department of Natural Resources, Department of Aging, and Department of Medicaid.

Purpose: To discuss and implement Quarantine Planning considerations.

- Collaborated with Ohio EMA & ODRC. ODRC stated they would research a supplemental transportation contract to lessen the impact on local resources.

ESF-4 | Firefighting (cont.)

- Their Director of Infectious Disease visited the facility & their internal process was changed to transport inmates before their symptoms intensified with a vehicle from Pickaway Correctional Institute.
- Received a mission request to provide a Fatality Management Incident Commander to assist in the EOC; mission is being processed.

Planned Actions:

- Continue to monitor the Pickaway Correctional Institute to make sure the situation is improving.
- The State Emergency Response System is informally working to identify additional resources in case they are needed.

- Researched and purchased 3,850,000 gowns, and 2,135,000 gloves.
- Prepared controlling board request for 4/27 hearing date.
- Worked with ODH Warehouse and JobsOhio on delivery dates.
- Worked with DAS and OHNG to update the PPE dashboard.
- Completed 11 missions, most notable of which was the delivery of PPE to ODRC from the donations warehouse and the ODH warehouse.
- DAS continued to source and vet PPE for potential purchase.
- Received a request from the OHNG (Title 32) for PPE and other equipment.
- A resource request form detailing the request for submission to FEMA was prepared and given to the executive team for review.

Planned Actions:

- Research for PPEs & work with ODH warehouse & JobOhio on deliverers.

- Ohio National Guard

Actions Taken:

- Worked with ESF 1/7/8 PPE work group on future logistics for pre-planning missions.
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ESF-7 | Logistics (cont.)

- Worked with three local companies wanting to donate PPE items, totaling just over 127 individual/business like donors.

Planned Actions:

- Continuing to work and follow-up with three companies wanting to donate PPE like items this week, early next week.

8 | Public Health

- Ohio Department of Health

Status Update (By Healthcare Region)

- *Northwest:*
 - Many regional hospitals have opened tents to provide testing to healthcare providers & first responders. Hospitals are reporting difficulty finding placements for patients in long-term care facilities who are not currently a patient at a facility. Some hospitals are utilizing telehealth services for urgent-care clinics.
- *Northeast:*
 - Held evening EM call.
- *Northeast Central:*
 - St. Elizabeth Youngstown Hospital reported 47 confirmed COVID patients, which is the largest count in the region yesterday. Most hospitals are reporting lower than normal ED volume and are on full lockdown, allowing no visitors.
- *Central:*
 - Initiated a new daily Surge Call with the new coordinated transfer center leadership team.
 - The three Franklin County Hospital Systems reported out on their inpatient numbers and occupancy.
 - OSU is working on treatment guidelines with the corrections department.
 - Broad testing is occurring at the Pickaway and Marion Prisons.
 - OSU is working on an inmate surge plan.
 - Transfer volumes are low and are still in normal transfer patterns.
 - There has been an increase in census in past 72 hours.
 - Regional CEO Call for regions 4, 7, & 8
 - The Task Force for the ACS no longer needs to meet. The ACS is ready to go if needed.
- *Southeast / Southeast Central:*
 - Continue to expand the SE/SEC Regional Surge Plan.
 - SE/SEC hospitals who requested beds through their local EMA to expand their internal hospital surge capacity will likely receive these beds this week.

ESF-8 | Public Health (cont.)

- Local EMA is working with Ohio National Guard to coordinate with local EMAs for shipment.
- Working on a flow chart algorithm for patient transfer processes. Region 7 is working on a specific rotation plan to share patients & then transfer to Region 4 (Columbus) if needed.
- COTS hosted a Zone 2 call with hospital CEOs. Discussed Dr. Acton's message on the Governor's press conference Sunday regarding surgeries. Some patients who were waiting on elective surgeries are getting worse & now becoming more urgent. Dr. Thomas (OSU) will be following up with Dr. Acton. New CDC guidance recommendations that anyone coming into a hospital should wear a surgical mask. Many hospitals have instituted this, but some are concerned due to shortage of PPE.
- Began discussions on Mass Fatality Planning. SE/SEC looking at resources needed & working with their local coroners to review their plans. Looking at their cache body bags to determine the quality. A regional plan was shared with the hospitals.
- *West Central:*
 - Nothing Significant to Report
- *Southwest:*
 - Gather and report data as requested for the Ohio Department of Health.
 - Task force determined SW region will begin updating bed availability on SurgeNet every 4 hours 24/7 beginning 4/4/20.
 - Assisting with SurgeNet access requests from hospitals, rehab facilities, transportation workgroup and EMS when requested.

Actions Taken:

- Participated in the FEMA/HHS LNO Call.
- Continued to work with Ohio EMA and DAS on allocating mass fatality resources, to include refrigerated trucks.
- Making final preparations to send a follow-up survey to responding licensees who have indicated a willingness to support potential medical surge from COVID-19.
 - This survey will further define the skills and availability of respondents, to support their deploy ability.
- The RSS Warehouse worked with JobsOhio on the new data sharing website for resource tracking, the projected beta test is Friday 4/17.
- Participated in the ESF-8/ESF-7 coordination meeting.
- During this operational period ESF-8 Desk has initiated two Mission Requests with State Partners.

Planned Actions:

- Continues to monitor Statewide Hospital Resource Utilization Statistics including hospital bed availability

ESF-8 | Public Health (cont.)

- Continue to collaborate on various RFIs and planning efforts with stakeholders and ESF-8 partners to provide guidance and direct information.
- Ohio Department of Aging/State Long-Term Care Ombudsman
 - Actions Taken:*
 - The State Ombudsman's office met with regional volunteer coordinators to provide guidance on recruitment and retention of volunteers to assist with calls to long-term care facility residents and families.
 - It also updated scripts for ombudsman calls to residents and families.
 - Planned Actions:*
 - Continued communication and technical assistance to regional ombudsmen.

- Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services
 - Actions Taken:*
 - Delivered coronavirus behavioral health posters that were distributed & posted throughout the state EOC as resource to staff and emergency response partners
 - Have scheduled a behavioral health clinician to be on site as needed to the EOC. Also have a therapy dog who will accompany OhioMHAS First Responder coordinator in visits to the EOC.
 - Participation in Housing and Homelessness, Transportation, Workforce, Medical Surge planning and, Quarantine and Isolation working groups.
 - Planned Actions:*
 - Department meets daily with morning huddles and regularly scheduled meeting with provider agencies, boards and community partner including mental health and substance use organizations.
 - Our communications office are getting messages out to community that although there are social distancing and other minimal contacts recommended Ohio behavioral health organizations are open for business.
 - Want to make sure that tele-health though widely embraced and encouraged is not the only path to accessing behavioral health care.

- Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities
 - Actions Taken:*
 - Established a new submission deadline of June 12, 2020 for the county board cost projections to allow more time to prepare due to this event.
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ESF-8 | Public Health (cont.)

- Developed a recruiting toolkit for recruitment of direct support professionals (DSPs) as maintaining staffing levels during this event is critical for our system.
- Attempting to house Developmental Center residents in single rooms as much as possible to limit potential spread of COVID-19.

Planned Actions:

- Continue to monitor and support system partners as required.
- Evaluating changes to our system and considering the long term impacts.

- Ohio Emergency Medical Services

Actions Taken:

- Participated in the daily conference call regarding PPE procurement and distribution.
- Received a mission from Montgomery County to address changing the paramedic “Scope of Practice” to allow paramedics to perform COVID 19 testing.
 - The procedure is out of the paramedic Scope of Practice.
 - Consulted the State Medical Director and Interim Director.
 - prepared and sent a response on the process needed to amend the scope of practice to Montgomery County.

Planned Actions:

- Participate in conference call today with Northeast Central Ohio Emergency Preparedness Coordinators regarding the transportation of COVID 19 patients in their region.

- Ohio Department of Education

Planned Actions:

- Continuing to develop new & update existing information and policy documents for schools regarding services to students during closures.

- Troopers from the Cleveland District delivered PPE equipment to area hospitals and agencies who are in need.

State EOC Objectives

1. Coordinate the State's response to limit spread of COVID-19; and maintain medical care.
2. Provide timely, clear, and consistent messaging to the public, stakeholders and media on the status of COVID-19 and actions the public can take to keep themselves safe.
3. Determine how state agencies will continue delivery of essential services to Ohioans while following COVID-19 public health guidelines.
4. Identify supply bottlenecks that threaten community lifelines and tools the state can provide to improve the supply situation.
5. Determine what emergency authorities and programs are now available through the National Emergency and Public Health Emergency Declarations
6. Purchase 1,000,000 sets of PPE weekly until the surge occurs

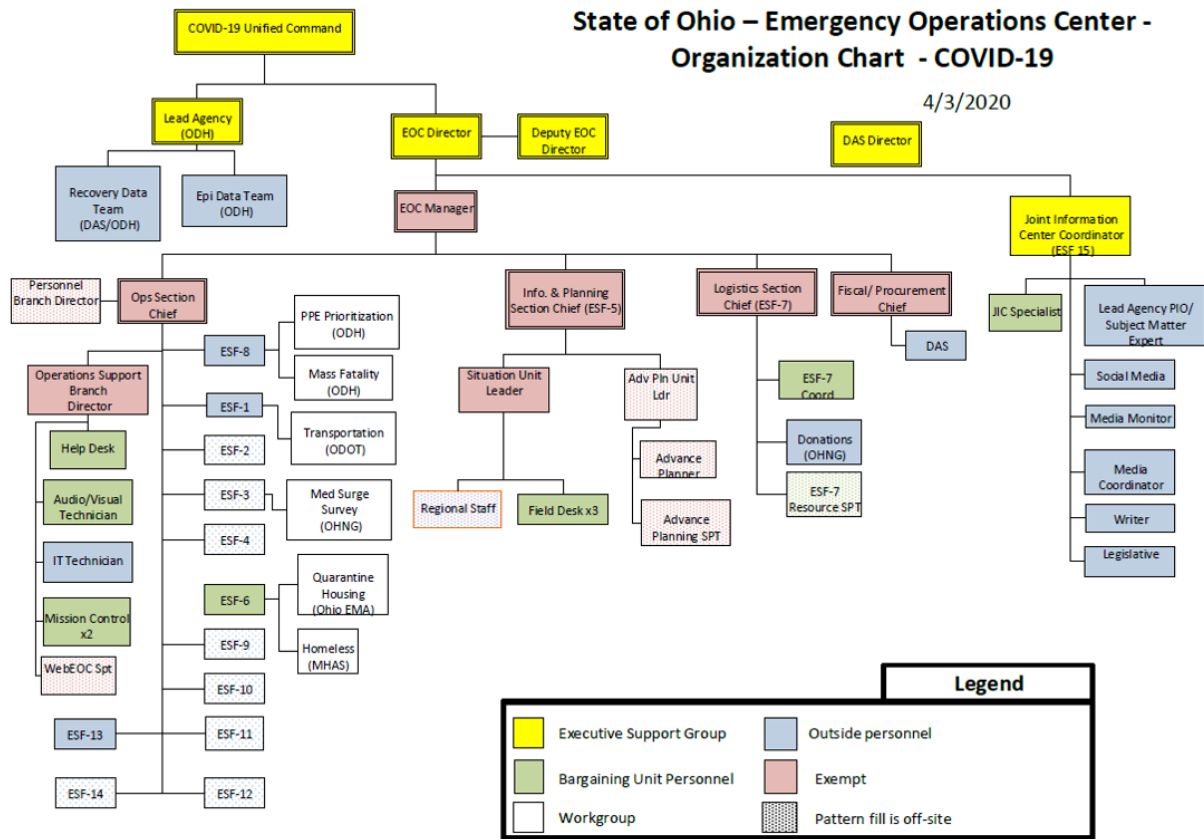
