
Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, increases in total cases (+623) and ICU admissions (+30) were higher than the five-day average, while hospitalizations (+94) and total deaths (+28) were consistent with the five-day average. According to ODH, 2,331 of the 8,414 confirmed cases have been hospitalized.

On-hand PPE was distributed to ODRC facilities to support ongoing operations. ODRC reports 20 facilities have at least one positive COVID-19 case involving either a staff member or an incarcerated adult.

State EOC Workgroups continue to plan and support County EMA efforts in the realms of protective equipment, medical surge, mortuary services, quarantine plans, congregate care, and homelessness.

Homelessness

Mass Fatality

Purpose: To assemble stakeholders within mass fatality/fatality management to develop statewide strategies & unified effort in the management of decedents.

Update: The workgroup discussed current needs for communication and guidance, planning updates, and mobilization of state assets to include two mobile cooling units as a preparatory step. The workgroup will continue to collaborate on the development of a strategic COVID-19 plan in support of a local response.

Purpose: To discuss and implement Quarantine Planning considerations.

Update: No new locations were added to the potential quarantine sites dataset. Quarantine Resource/Location Map can be found at: <u>https://arcg.is/1K9P9i</u>. The Ohio Department of Health, in collaboration with the colleagues within the Quarantine workgroup, are working to streamline the vetting process to pre-screen potential quarantine sites and reduce duplication of efforts. ODH is updating the Quarantine Station Site Considerations Checklist to include the vetting process as it applies to the COVID-19 testing and will share with local health departments as this resource is ready. The workgroup's next meeting is scheduled for April 21st, at 1pm.

- 1. Coordinate the State's response to limit spread of COVID-19; and maintain medical care.
- 2. Provide timely, clear, and consistent messaging to the public, stakeholders and media on the status of COVID-19 and actions the public can take to keep themselves safe.
- 3. Determine how state agencies will continue delivery of essential services to Ohioans while following COVID-19 public health guidelines.
- 4. Identify supply bottlenecks that threaten community lifelines and tools the state can provide to improve the supply situation.
- 5. Determine what emergency authorities and programs are now available through the National Emergency and Public Health Emergency Declarations
- 6. Purchase 1,000,000 sets of PPE weekly until the surge occurs

Ohio COVID-19 Pandemic (DR-4507)

- Declared on March 31, 2020. Incident Period: January 20, 2020 and continuing
- Public Assistance (Assistance to State, Local, Tribal and Territorial governments and certain private-non-profit organizations for emergency work and the repair or replacement of disaster-damaged facilities) has been designated for all 88 counties.


