Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, total cases (+1,380) continued to spike above the five-day average. ICU admissions (+5), hospitalizations (+46) and total deaths (+20) were all lower than the five-day average. 2,565 of the 11,602 total cases have been hospitalized.

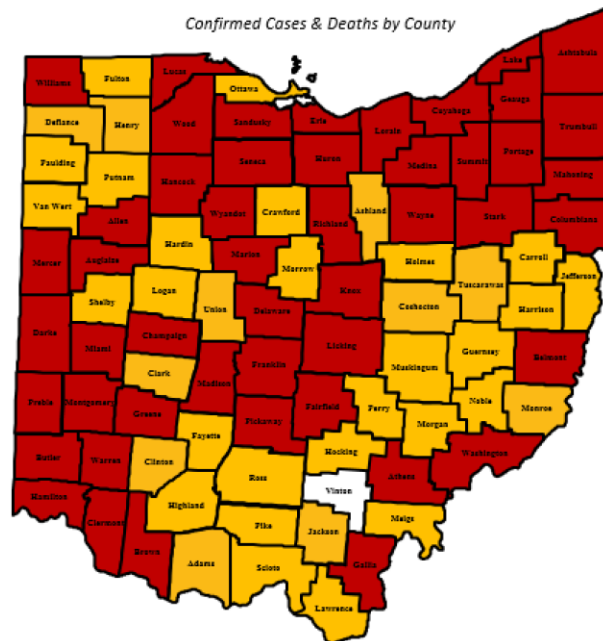
Focused testing at ODRC facilities is highlighting the total number of cases across the staff and inmate populations; 2,644 cases have been confirmed, 244 of those being associated with staff and the remaining 2,400 being inmates. 1,828 of inmates infected are at the Marion Correctional Institution.

FEMA continues to respond to two requests made by the State of Ohio for PPE. 550,510 N95 masks have been received from FEMA for in-state distribution. Additional supplies have been requested to support OHNG personnel on Title 32 orders.

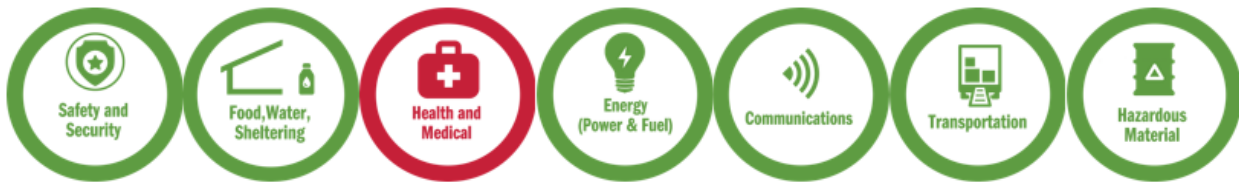

Primary Lifeline: Health & Medical
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase. Statewide bed and ventilator capacity are projected to meet medical surge needs at forecasted peak. Forecast PPE needs for medical, first responders, and behavioral health needs continue to drive state procurement efforts; two requests have been made for federal assistance. One request is currently In Progress. One local Alternate Care Site (State-supported) is operational in Columbus for Med Surge needs. An Attentive Care site has been established in Columbus to address Mass Fatality needs. Response & planning continues to support needs of critical populations. Mass Fatality, Medical Surge, and Personal Protective Equipment workgroups continue efforts. Seven requests for Federal assistance have been submitted and addressed. Ohio National Guard members on Title 32 Orders are supporting stabilization of the lifeline.

8 | Public Health

- Ohio Department of Health

Status Update:

- Zone 1 (Northwest, Northeast, Northeast Central)
 - Hospitals are communicating regularly with local partners such as local public health, emergency management, and long-term care facilities. Hospitals are continuing to report below average ED and inpatient censuses. One regional hospital is assisting a local nursing home that is experiencing an outbreak by providing food service and staffing support.
 - Supported strike team call with Louis Stokes VA and CCBH. Concern over workforce numbers as mandatory testing for VA patients and staff of LTC areas is set to start today. Assuming some will be asymptomatic positive.
 - St. Elizabeth Youngstown Hospital is reporting 46 confirmed COVID patients, which is the largest count in the region today. Summa Health System is also showing an uptick in confirmed and PUI patients. Other hospitals remain with stable number of confirmed patients.
- Zone 2 (Central, Southeast, Southeast Central)
 - Continue to expand the SE/SEC Regional Surge Plan.
 - SE/SEC hospitals who requested beds through their local EMA to expand their internal hospital surge capacity. Shipment of the beds are almost complete.
 - Developed a flow chart algorithm for patient transfer processes. Region 7 is working on a specific rotation plan to share patients and then transfer to region 4 (Columbus) if needed. This is awaiting feedback from the region hospitals which is expected back by today.
 - Began discussions on Mass Fatality Planning. SE/SEC looking at resources needed and working with their local coroners to review their plans. Looking at their cache body bags to determine the quality. A regional plan was shared with the hospitals.
- Zone 3 (West Central, Southwest)
 - Gather and report data as requested for the Ohio Department of Health.
 - Task force determined SW region will begin updating bed availability on surgenet every 4 hours 24/7 beginning 4/4/20. Assisting with Surge Net access requests from hospitals, rehab facilities, transportation workgroup and EMS when requested.
 - Continued to refine number of additional med/surg and critical care beds in hospitals. Will use this information to determine when thresholds are met to move to next level of surge.
 - Gathering information on testing activity in the region via survey.

ESF-8 | Public Health (cont.)

- Task Force/Steering Committee Update
- Task Force meetings reduced to M, W, and F until daily meetings are necessary.
- Additional operational workgroups: Data, Supply Chain, PIO, SNF, Outlying/Specialty Hospitals, Vulnerable Populations, Transportation, Clinical Protocols, ACS (Duke and Liberty), Psychiatry, Crisis Standards of Care The Health Collaborative leveraging staff resources for project management and support of work groups.

Actions Taken:

- Participated in a FEMA LNO Call yesterday.
- A coordination call with Department of Administrative Services, Jobs Ohio, Ohio Department of Health and Department of Public Safety occurred to determine the solution needed to keep an accounting of all the various PPE sources to the warehouse.
- A COVID -19 Specimen collection kit and WebEOC Mission reconciliation was completed and was shared with the ODH RSS warehouse staff for further strategy development.
- The ODH RSS warehouse received three (3) shipments yesterday: Two from FEMA with small sized N95 masks), One (1) came from Ford with additional face shields.
- Working with DAS and ODH Fiscal to lease refrigerated trailers to expand county coroner storage capabilities.
- Sent a follow-up survey to professional boards and has since received approximately 7,500 replies.
- Continues to monitor Statewide Hospital Resource Utilization Statistics including hospital bed availability.

Planned Actions:

- Will participate in the Transportation Workgroup.
 - Continues to collaborate on daily RFIs and planning efforts with federal and state stakeholders and ESF-8 partners to provide guidance and direct information.
- Ohio Department of Aging/State Long-Term Care Ombudsman

- Prepared information for regional ombudsman representatives regarding Health Care Isolation Centers and COVID-19 Tool Kit for long-term services and supports.
- Referred nursing facility to ODH Bureau of Infectious Disease for technical assistance.

State EOC Objectives

1. Coordinate the State's response to limit spread of COVID-19; and maintain medical care.
2. Provide timely, clear, and consistent messaging to the public, stakeholders and media on the status of COVID-19 and actions the public can take to keep themselves safe.
3. Determine how state agencies will continue delivery of essential services to Ohioans while following COVID-19 public health guidelines.
4. Identify supply bottlenecks that threaten community lifelines and tools the state can provide to improve the supply situation.
5. Determine what emergency authorities and programs are now available through the National Emergency and Public Health Emergency Declarations
6. Purchase 1,000,000 sets of PPE weekly until the surge occurs
