Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, total cases (+1,317), ICU admissions (+33), hospitalizations (+88), and total deaths (+38) were all above the five-day average. 2,653 of the 12,919 total cases have been hospitalized.

The State EOC continued to identify, monitor, and respond to COVID-19 hot spots, with a strong focus on Long Term Care facilities and incarcerated populations. State-acquired PPE was distributed to five counties in which COVID-19 hotspots have been identified. Solutions to ODRC staffing impacts are being planned and addressed by EOC Emergency Support Functions.

FEMA continues to respond to one outstanding request made by the State of Ohio for PPE.

- Nine requests for Federal assistance have been submitted and addressed.
- Ohio National Guard members on Title 32 Orders are supporting stabilization of the lifeline.

8 | Public Health

Ohio Department of Health

Status Update:

- Zone 1 (Northwest, Northeast, Northeast Central)
 - Hospitals are communicating regularly with local partners such as local public health, emergency management, and long-term care facilities. Hospitals are continuing to report below average ED and inpatient censuses. Hospitals are reaching out to their local long-term care facilities to plan for the transfer of patients both to and from long term care facilities. Some hospitals are also able to provide resources such as PPE to these agencies.
- Zone 2 (Central, Southeast, Southeast Central)
 - Hospital admissions for COVID positive patients is still on the rise in the region. Nothing new to report.
- Zone 3 (West Central, Southwest)
 - Gather and report data as requested for the Ohio Department of Health.
 - Task force determined SW region will begin updating bed availability on surgenet every 4 hours 24/7 beginning 4/4/20. Assisting with Surge Net access requests from hospitals, rehab facilities, transportation workgroup and EMS when requested.

ESF-8 | Public Health (cont.)

- Continued to refine number of additional med/surg and critical care beds in hospitals. Will use this information to determine when thresholds are met to move to next level of surge.
- Task Force/Steering Committee Update
- Task Force meetings reduced to M, W, F until daily meetings are necessary.
- Additional operational workgroups: Data, Supply Chain, PIO, SNF, Outlying/Specialty Hospitals, Vulnerable Populations, Transportation, Clinical Protocols, ACS (Duke and Liberty), Psychiatry, Crisis Standards of Care The Health Collaborative leveraging staff resources for project management and support of work groups.
- Reviewing Health Care Isolation Center Plan and accompanying attachments.
- Observing uptick in COVID-19 cases across the state and closely monitoring cases in Southwest Ohio.

Actions Taken:

- Participated in a FEMA LNO Call.
- Will be participating in the Transportation Workgroup
- The RSS warehouse pulled emergency PPE orders for five requesting counties.
 - These counties are Geauga, Stark, Mahoning, Ashtabula, and Columbiana.
- As of April 20th, there have been 8,400 respondents to the follow-up survey to licensees. Approximately 94% have indicated that are still available to support.

- Continues to monitor Statewide Hospital Resource Utilization Statistics including hospital bed availability.

- o Participated in Long-Term Care Strike Team calls in Hamilton and Miami Counties.
- State LTC Ombudsman communicated with Columbiana County EMA and ODH regarding long-term care facility cases and PPE needs.
- Ombudsman convened a teleconference with regional representatives to hear concerns and provide updates and guidance.


