## **Executive Summary**

Over the past 24 hours, total cases (+392) fell below the five-day average, and ICU admissions (+42), hospitalizations (+103), and total deaths (+53) were all above the five-day average. 2,882 of the 14,117 total cases have been hospitalized.

The State EOC continued to identify, monitor, and respond to COVID-19 hot spots, with a strong focus on Long-Term Care facilities and incarcerated populations. Planning for an April 24<sup>th</sup> distribution of state-procured PPE was finalized with state and county partners.

A request for specimen collection kits was placed with FEMA and awaits approval. FEMA continues to work towards filling one outstanding (in-progress) request for PPE.



# State Community Lifeline Status



### In-state Response | Ongoing External Support | Assistance Needed

#### Primary Lifeline: Health & Medical

- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase. A request for federal assistance in obtaining testing kits is awaiting FEMA approval.
- Statewide bed and ventilator capacity are projected to meet 30-day medical forecast needs.
- Forecast PPE needs for medical, first responders, and behavioral health needs continue to drive state procurement efforts. One request for federal assistance is currently In Progress
- One local Alternate Care Site (State-supported) is operational in Columbus for Med Surge needs.
- An Attentive Care site has been established in Columbus to address Mass Fatality needs.
- Response & planning continues to support needs of critical populations.
- Mass Fatality, Medical Surge, and Personal Protective Equipment workgroups continue efforts.
- Nine requests for Federal assistance have been submitted and addressed.
- Ohio National Guard members on Title 32 Orders are supporting stabilization of the lifeline.

#### Communications

No current impacts to statewide communications.

#### Energy

No current impacts to statewide utilities.

#### Food, Water, Sheltering

- Food continues to be available per current Public Health Order
  - Restaurants are restricted to carry-out and delivery only.
- Limited access to nursing homes & similar facilities continues.
- Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues.
- Homelessness and Quarantine workgroups continue to update plans for response.

#### **Hazardous Materials**

No current impacts to statewide communications.

#### Safety & Security

- First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19
- Limited access to jails & detention facilities continues.
- ODRC staff and incarcerated populations have tested positive in 22 facilities.
- 331 ODRC staff members and 3,762 inmates have tested positive.
- DYS reports first youth positive case at Cuyahoga Hills Juvenile Detention Facility.

#### 8 | Public Health

- Ohio Department of Health
  - Lead Agency for PPE Workgroup
    - Purpose: To determine and allocate appropriate PPE for COVID-19 responders.
  - Lead Agency for Mass Fatality Workgroup
    - Purpose: To assemble stakeholders within mass fatality/fatality management to develop statewide strategies & unified effort in the management of decedents.
  - Lead Agency for Medical Surge Workgroup
    - Purpose: Planning for needs to address forecast Medical Surge needs.

#### Status Update:

- Zone 1 (Northwest, Northeast, Northeast Central)
  - Local and regional partners are continuing to monitor and respond to outbreaks in congregate care settings such as prisons and long-term care facilities.
  - Many hospitals are working with long-term care facilities to assist with staffing and resource shortages. Hospitals are continuing to communicate regularly with local partners such as local public health, emergency management, and long-term care facilities.
  - Gathering local health department primary POC information to share with hospitals in their jurisdiction for support of congregate initiative. Sorting nursing home and congregate settings across the region to see which hospitals support them routinely.
  - Supported Zone 1 leadership call with ODH.
  - Supported call with CareSource to see how they could support nursing home outreach in the region.
  - St. Elizabeth Youngstown Hospital is reporting 48 confirmed COVID patients, which is the largest count in the region today.
- Zone 2 (Central, Southeast, Southeast Central)
  - COTS shared registration information for hospitals with triage, treatment or testing tents to apply for site specific weather alerts at no cost from AccuWeather.
  - OSUMC continues to have the largest surge of COVID positive patients with that population being inmates from the State prisons. Many hospitals have volunteered to assist OSU with taking COVID patients and inmates if needed to assist with their surge.
  - COTS facilitated a Zone 2 CEO call today with the discussion of Surge Transfer center operations and returning to normal hospital operations.
     OSU will be training ONG EMTs to conduct swabbing at prisons.
  - COTS is working to tweak the UH playbook for coalitions and COVID.

- RHC participated on Zone 2 call with all hospital CEOs. Conversations regarding with returning to normal and prison surge.
- Hospitals in areas with major prison systems are making plans to deal with prison surge should the state hospital OSU continue to be overwhelmed with inmates.

### Zone 3 (West Central, Southwest)

- Virtual Healthcare Coalition meeting with Infection Control and LHD Epi's. LHD Epi's gave an overview of outbreak in their respective counties. Hospital Infection Control reported on items specific to their hospital. Discussions included who is tracking employee Covid-19 positive cases, steps they are taking to begin recovery and return of some elective surgeries. Several shared length of time they are waiting between patients to allow for adequate air changes in surgical suites and isolation rooms. David Gerstner requested the Infection Control team discuss the amended EMS bulletin which references the notification of EMS when a patient is positive. The team will share with others at their facility and come prepared at next meeting to discuss regional approval.
- Participated in the COVID -19 task force virtual tour and discussion of both KHN and PH command centers (bed and resource management). Will be working on a plan to assist hospitals to utilize these centers.
- Gather and report data as requested for the Ohio Department of Health.
- Task force determined SW region will begin updating bed availability on SurgeNet every 4 hours beginning 4/4/20.
- Assisting with Surge Net access requests from hospitals, rehab facilities, transportation workgroup and EMS when requested.
- Continued to refine number of additional med/surg and critical care beds in hospitals. Will use this information to determine when thresholds are met to move to next level of surge.
- Task Force/Steering Committee Update.
- Task Force meetings reduced to M/W/F until daily meetings are necessary.
- Reviewed occupancy data for four core health systems.
- Reviewed testing survey results. Identified some limitations like test cartridges, reagent and nasopharyngeal swabs.
- SNF Workgroup update-looking for representation from hospitals, congregate care facilities and public health for build out of the HCIC plan in Zone 3.
- Additional operational workgroups: Data, Supply Chain, PIO, SNF, Outlying/Specialty Hospitals, Vulnerable Populations, Transportation, Clinical Protocols, ACS (Duke and Liberty), Psychiatry, Crisis Standards of Care.

 The Health Collaborative is leveraging staff resources for project management and support of work groups.

#### Actions Taken:

- o All Zone calls occurred, and ODH will continue to coordinate and collaborate.
- Currently, the RSS warehouse is pulling emergency PPE orders for four requesting counties: Holmes, Stark, Henry and Jackson.
- ODH also conducted a call with FEMA, HHS, and OSU about Tableu Hemodialysis machine availability.
- ODH initiated an RRF with Ohio EMA for specimen collection kits.
- ODH continues to monitor Statewide Hospital Resource Utilization Statistics including hospital bed availability.
- Mass Fatality Workgroup discussed the guidance distribution from the previous day to identify any questions stakeholders may have.
  - Planning continues with the biggest objective being delivery of refrigerated trucks to local jurisdictions.

- Collaborate on daily RFIs and planning efforts with federal and state stakeholders and ESF-8 partners to provide guidance and direct information.

  - They are providing a list and will breakdown to indicate those that serve men.

     Force Team.
    - The team's next meeting is April 23<sup>rd</sup>.

Ohio Emergency Medical Services

#### Actions Taken:

- Participated in the daily conference call regarding PPE procurement and distribution.

- Worked with ESF-1 on providing Lucas County EMA with guidance on transporting individuals to dialysis treatments that are positive for COVID-19.
  - Contacted the mobility manager in Lucas County who indicated a local taxi company is going to designate vehicles just for COVID -19 transports; still working on confirming this.


