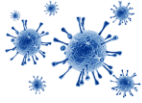
**Current Situation:**

Public Health – Dayton & Montgomery County, the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and World Health Organization (WHO) are closely monitoring an outbreak of respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus (termed “COVID-19”) first identified in Wuhan City, Hubei Province, China in December 2019 and which continues to expand.

**Current Updates:**

- **MOST IMPORTANT MESSAGE OF THE DAY: DO EVERYTHING YOU CAN TO CONSERVE PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE).**
- Globally the World now has 2,736,979 cases and 192,125 deaths from COVID-19.
- ODH has expanded testing groups to include category 2A, which includes individuals who are asymptomatic but are housed in a congregant location such as a long-term care or jail.
- Governor DeWine will release his plan for re-opening the state during the daily news-brief on Monday, April 27, 2020.
- In anticipation of release of the plan Public Health is increasing the number of staff housing the COVID-19 informational phone line. The info line is 937-225-6127.

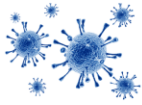

## Coronavirus



- A second drive-thru COVID-19 testing site opened in Montgomery County. It is a partnership between Kroger Health and Kettering Health Network. It will be open Monday through Saturday from 8:30 AM to 5:30 PM. More sites to follow in the coming month.
- Montgomery County will have a conference call with congregate locations (long-term care facilities, jails, behavior health, assisted living, intermediate care, and residential care facilities) on Monday, April 27, 2020 at 9:00 AM. Representatives from Public Health, GDAHA, Emergency Management and EMS will be on the call.
- Homemade masks continue to be a need, especially for first responders who need them for victim's family members, detainees, or visitors to hospitals.
- Public Health was involved in a conference call with Dayton Correctional Institutions over COVID-19 Response and Recovery.
- Public Health generated a letter for congregate locations on accessing collection test kits for COVID-19. This letter was e-mailed to all congregate locations.
- Public Health continues to highly recommend the wearing of handmade masks when out and about in the community, such as grocery shopping.
- A virtual volunteer reception center continues to look for volunteers to register at [www.declare.org/givehelp](http://www.declare.org/givehelp)
- The Montgomery County EOC continues to run virtually, it can be reached at 937-225-6316. Hours are from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM.
- ODH information line remains open, the number is 1-833-4-ASK-ODH and is open seven days a week.
- Public Health continues to monitor all sources (ODH, CDC, WHO, European Center for Disease and Prevention and Control (ECOC) for the latest information.
- Public Health maintains its one-week operational period for this response.
- Public Health will continue to share the situational report with other local health departments, Montgomery County Emergency Management, Greater Dayton Area Hospital Association and Dayton Metropolitan Medical Response System partners.

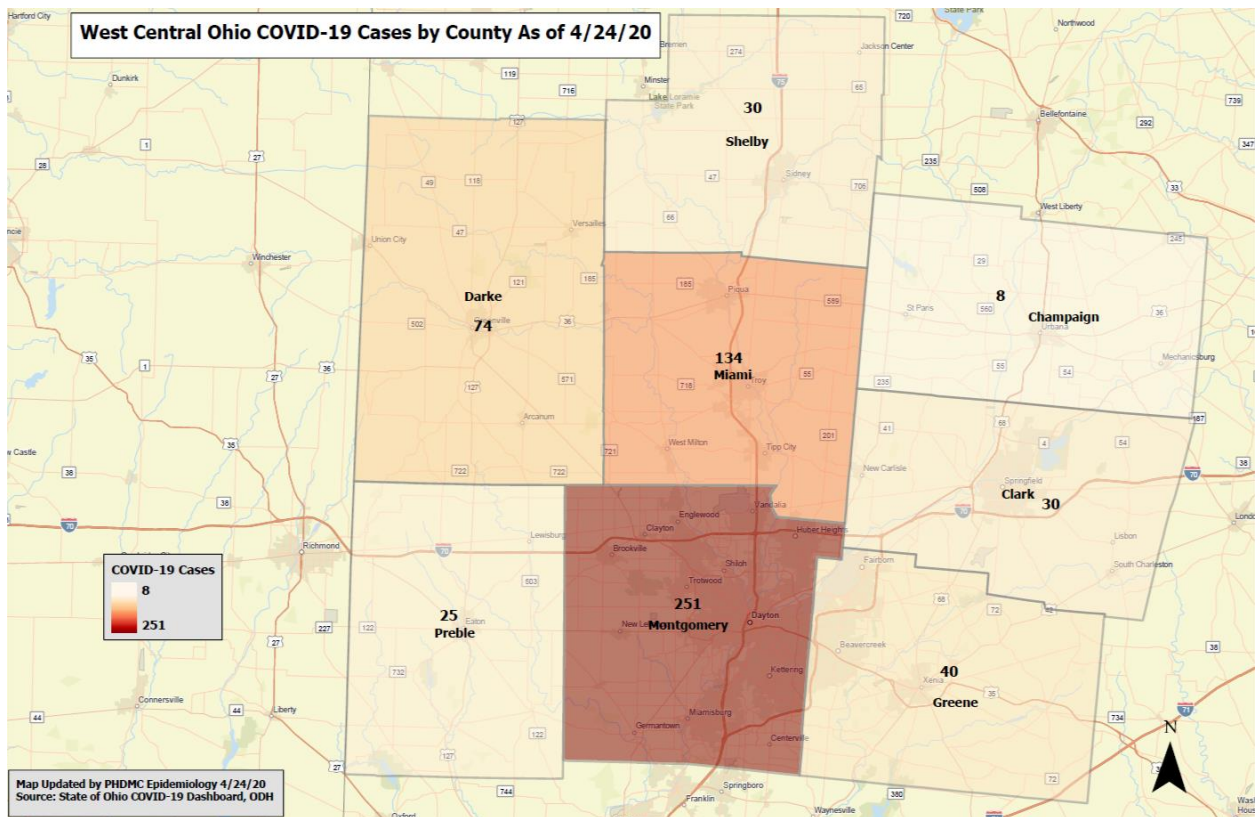

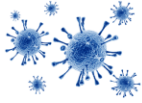

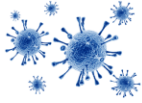

### World Health Organization Update:

- WHO has published an interim guidance ‘COVID-19 and Food Safety: Guidance for competent authorities responsible for national food safety control systems’. The guidance document provides advice and recommendations for national food safety authorities to optimize food control functions and prioritize critical services that preserve the integrity of food safety systems.
- WHO has published an interim guidance ‘Water, sanitation, hygiene, and waste management for the COVID-19 virus’. This interim guidance is the second edition and supplements existing infection prevention and control documents by summarizing the latest evidence on COVID-19 in water supplies and sanitation. It highlights WHO guidance on water, sanitation, hand hygiene and health care waste which is relevant for viruses (including coronaviruses).
- WHO’s Health Security Learning Platform offers a number of online courses to help enhance knowledge on specific issues related to the implementation of the International Health Regulations (2005). A new course, “Operational considerations for managing COVID-19 cases/outbreak in aviation”, is available and is the topic for today’s ‘Subject in Focus’,

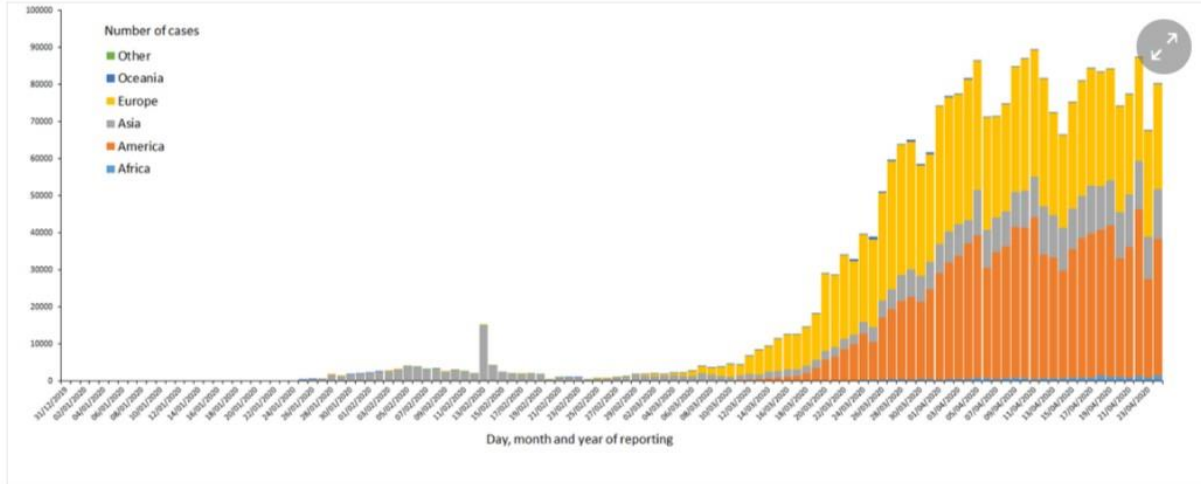

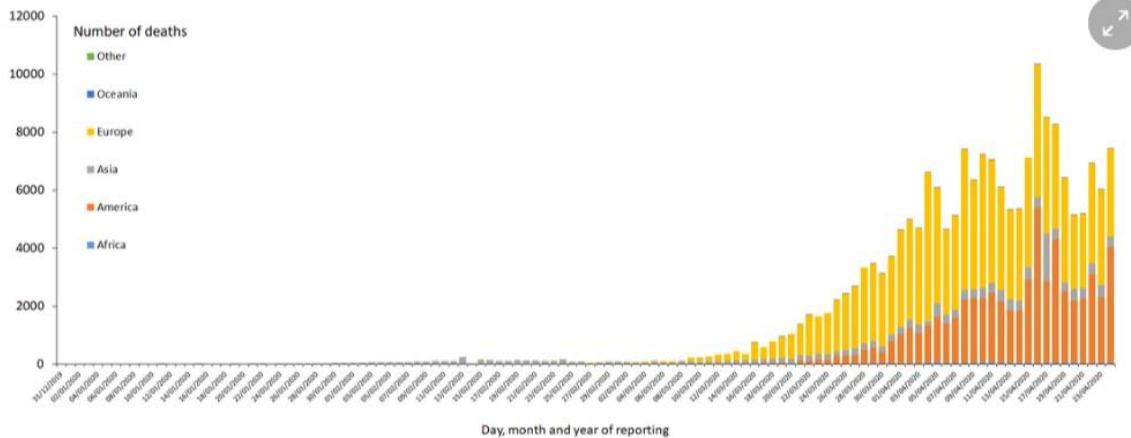
## Distribution of COVID-19 cases worldwide, as of 24 Apr 2020

Cases reported in accordance with the applied case definition and testing strategies in the affected countries. The case definition in China (Hubei province) was updated on 13 and 20 February 2020

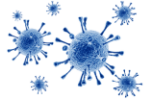
## Distribution of COVID-19 deaths, worldwide, as of 24 Apr 2020
