Current Situation:

Public Health – Dayton & Montgomery County, the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and World Health Organization (WHO) are closely monitoring an outbreak of respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus (termed "COVID-19") first identified in Wuhan City, Hubei Province, China in December 2019 and which continues to expand.

Current Updates:

- MOST IMPORTANT MESSAGE OF THE DAY: DO EVERYTHING YOU CAN TO CONSERVE PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE).
- Globally the World now has 3,090,844 cases and 215,063 deaths from COVID-19.
- Governor DeWine released his initial plans for re-opening the state during the daily news-brief on Monday, April 27, 2020.
- All agencies should maintain 6 feet between people, if not possible, install barriers.
- Perform daily symptom assessment, stay home if sick, conduct regular handwashing, stagger or limit arrivals, work from home if possible.

 Requirements
- On May 1st same day surgeries can begin if there is no overnight stay.
- On May 4th manufacturing, distribution and construction can re-open.
- On May 13th consumer, retail and services can re-open.
- The following business and operations are to remain closed:
 - K-12 schools and daycares





- Restaurants and bars
- Personal appearance/beauty services
- Older adult day care services and senior centers

- Churches should remain closed as gathering of more the ten individuals is still not recommended.
- Public Health along with other response partners held a conference call with congregate locations on Monday, April 27th at 9:00 AM. These meetings will be conducted weekly, at the same time each week.
- The Public Health COVID-19 informational phone line remains open Monday through Friday to answer general questions. The info line is 937-225-6127.
- An e-mail was forwarded to congregant locations informing them to share information on all staff and clients that were under isolation at their location.
- The EOC continues to provide PPE to response organizations. Requests for PPE can be made at this link: https://surveys.phdmc.org/s3/COVID-19-EOC-Resource-Request.
- Homemade masks continue to be a need, especially for first responders who need them for victim's family members, detainees, or visitors to hospitals.
- Public Health continues to highly recommend the wearing of handmade masks when out and about in the community, such as grocery shopping.
- A virtual volunteer reception center continues to look for volunteers to register at Www.declare.org/givehelp
- The Montgomery County EOC continues to run virtually, it can be reached at 937-225-6316. Hours are from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM.
- ODH information line remains open, the number is 1-833-4-ASK-ODH and is open seven days a week.
- Public Health continues to monitor all sources (ODH, CDC, WHO, European Center for Disease and Prevention and Control (ECOC) for the latest information.
- Public Health maintains its one-week operational period for this response.
- Public Health will continue to share the situational report with other local health departments, Montgomery County Emergency Management, Greater Dayton Area Hospital Association and Dayton Metropolitan Medical Response System partners.



CDC Update (Situation in the US):

CDC is closely monitoring an outbreak of respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus named COVID-19. The outbreak first started in Wuhan, China, but cases have been identified in a growing number of other international locations, including the United





States. CDC will update the following U.S. map daily. Information regarding the number of people under investigation will be updated daily.

 - o Global Pandemic Notice


World Health Organization Update:

- WHO has published the 'R&D Blueprint: COVID-19 Experimental Treatments', which lists drug and non-drug experimental treatments for COVID-19.
- WHO has called on countries to ensure that usual immunization is maintained wherever possible and surveillance for vaccine-preventable diseases is not disrupted during the ongoing pandemic. The WHO Regional Office for Europe explores this in an article.
- WHO Director-General Dr. Tedros, in his regular media briefing yesterday, highlighted "As lockdowns in Europe ease with declining numbers of new cases, we continue to urge countries to find, isolate, test and treat all cases of COVID-19 and trace every contact, to ensure these declining trends continue".
- WHO continues to source millions of dollars of medical equipment and supplies to help Member States access global markets, which are overwhelmed by unprecedented demand. WHO is also supporting design and installation of COVID19 treatment centers in a number of countries.






Distribution of COVID-19 cases worldwide, as of 28 Apr 2020
