Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, total new cases (+724) and hospitalizations (+112) were above their five-day averages, while ICU admissions (+21) and deaths (+38) were below their five-day averages. 3,533 of the 18,027 total cases have been hospitalized over the course of this incident. Current models show current medical capacity capable of handling COVID-19 caused stressors.

The State EOC focused on the procurement, reception, storage, and distribution of PPE and began to plan to PPE push missions in the coming weeks. Efforts also continued to identify, monitor, and respond to COVID-19 hot spots, with a strong focus on long-term care facilities, state-managed facilities and incarcerated populations.



State Community Lifeline Status

- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase.
- Statewide bed and ventilator capacity are projected to meet 30-day medical forecast needs.
- Limited access to nursing homes & similar facilities continues.
- Forecast PPE needs continue to drive state procurement efforts.
- Mass Fatality, Medical Surge, and Personal Protective Equipment workgroups continue efforts.
- One local Alternate Care Site (Population: 0) is operational in Columbus for Med Surge needs.
- An Attentive Care Site (Population: 0) has been established in Columbus to address Mass Fatality needs.
- Twelve requests for Federal assistance have been submitted and addressed.
- One request for Federal Assistance is awaiting FEMA approval.

 - Two ODRC staff members and inmates have died due to COVID-19.
 - Five DYS staff members and 16 youth from Cuyahoga Hills Juvenile Correctional Facility are COVID-19 positive.


