

## **Executive Summary**

Over the past 24 hours, 384 total new cases (24,081), 51 hospitalizations (980), 5 ICU admissions (1,200) and 10 deaths (1341) were below their 21-day averages. 4,351 of the 24,081 total cases have been hospitalized over the course of this incident.

State EOC operations were virtual on Sunday, May 10. A statewide PPE push will be conducted on Monday, May 11. Procurement of PPE will be focused on coveralls and gloves. Hot spot prevention and identification will remain one of the EOC's top objectives for the course of the upcoming week.



# State Community Lifeline Status

Primary Lifeline

- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase.
- Statewide bed and ventilator capacity are projected to meet 30-day medical forecast needs.
- Forecast PPE needs continue to drive state procurement efforts.
- Limited access to nursing homes & similar facilities continues.
- Personal Protective Equipment, Mass Fatality, and Medical Surge workgroups continue efforts.
- One local Alternate Care Site (Population: 0) is operational in Columbus for Med Surge needs.
- Twelve requests for Federal assistance have been submitted and addressed.
- One request for Federal Assistance is awaiting FEMA approval.
- Ohio National Guard members on Title 32 Orders are supporting stabilization of the lifeline.
- The Agriculture workgroup continues to identify and address issues of concern.
- Pork processing has been impacted by the closure of national processing plants.
- Restaurants are restricted to carry-out and delivery only.
- Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues.
- Potential quarantine locations have been identified.
- Homelessness workgroup continues to update plans for response.
- First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19.
- Limited access to jails & detention facilities continues.
  ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across their statewide facilities.
- A hot spot at the Cuyahoga Hills Juvenile Correctional Facility is impacting both residents & staff.

  - Initial guidance indicated Ohio's allocation will be distributed over time and not all at once.

- Lead Agency for Medical Surge Workgroup
  - Purpose: Planning for needs to address forecast Medical Surge needs.

#### Actions Taken:

- Since this incident began, ESF 8 desk has received Two Hundred Eleven (211) missions/RFIs.
- ESF-8 has completed/closed one hundred sixty four (164) and have forty seven (47) in progress or being planned.
  - Of the 47 in progress thirty five (35) are for specimen collection kits, medical supplies, and pharmaceuticals.

- o Three hospitals in west central have requested demobilization of tents.
  - Waiting for dry weather.
  - Butler County EMA Tech Rescue team will support demobilization of tents in Butler County.
- ODH will be developing a one page proposal detailing suggested distribution of initial quantity (20 cases) of Remdesivir.
- Coordination with Ohio Pharmacy Services on Specimen Collection Kit planning.
- o Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) Distribution.


