

### **Executive Summary**

Over the past 24 hours, 47 deaths (1,483) was above the 21-day average. 471 total new cases (25,721), 79 hospitalizations (4,618), and ICU Admissions 16 (1,248) were below the 21-day averages. 4,618 of the 25,721 total cases have been hospitalized over the course of this incident.

The second portion of this week's 88-county PPE push was completed. An additional push has been approved for the week of May 17. A push of cotton masks will be conducted on Friday, May 15. The state has pushed a total of 16,666,194 pieces of PPE since March 29.

Cascading effects continue to be monitored and identified. There are no ongoing significant impacts to critical infrastructure. ESF-11 reports that all major pork processing plants impacting Ohio's processing are operating across both the state and the nation.

  - Small uptick in med/surg beds noted. Unsure if COVID or regular patients.
     Will monitor. Attended the Surgenet/OHTrac meeting today and worked on Supplemental grant application.
  - St. Elizabeth Youngstown reporting 30 positive patients again today while Cleveland Clinic Akron General's cases decline slightly. Many hospitals still reporting challenges with PPE conservation and shortages of testing media.
- o Zone 2:
  - Worked through inmates from North Central Corrections in Marion needing to be transported to OSU vs, the contracted hospital in Toledo.
  - Calls to the Surge Transfer Center were up to 21 in the past 24 hours.
  - Participated on daily surge call. Numbers remain steady in the zone. Discussions regarding congregate care centers outreach and working locally with nursing homes who are reporting they cannot take COVID positive patients back from the hospital.
  - Continue to share surge data information with SE/SEC hospitals who have prison systems in their counties from the daily surge call.
  - Acuity Specialty Hospital is reporting a critical need of PAPR shields. Email was sent to all SE/SEC region hospitals requesting assistance.
- o Zone 3:

Request for assistance with communication to the other healthcare facilities from Stillwater Center (LTC abd DoDD). Indicate they had services denied because their resident could not wear a mask, and when another resident was hospitalized they were unable to have their caregiver present.

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
