Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, ODH reported 449 (27,923) total new cases, 15 (1,625) deaths, 51 (4,921) hospitalizations, and 5 (1,305) ICU Admissions; all daily reported metrics were below their respective 21-day averages.

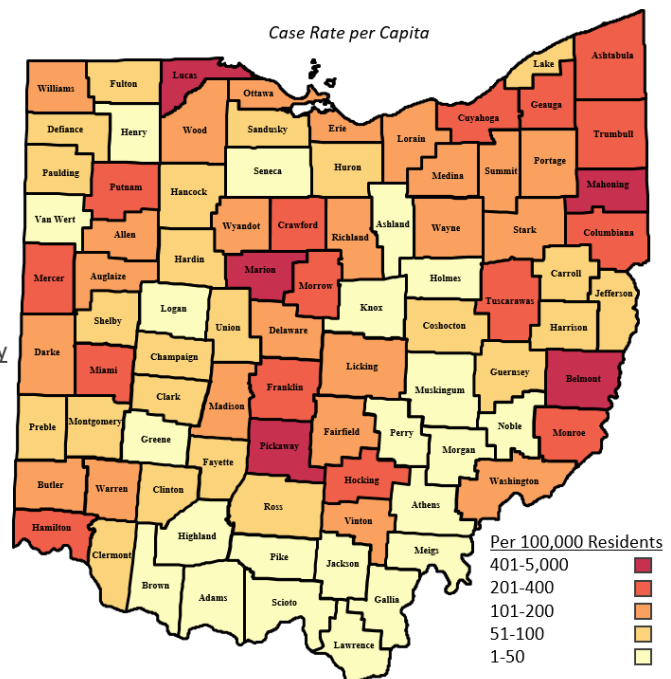
Partner reports in today's reports are inclusive of activity reported over Saturday and Sunday. Updated Objectives have been added to the report. A statewide PPE push will take place once again this week; PPE allocation to each county will be determined in part by County EMA feedback.

The National Weather Service's Excessive Rainfall forecast highlights significant risk likely as two-to-three inches of rain are expected across the Southwest region of the state with localized amounts around four inches possible between the afternoon of May 18th and the morning of May 19th.

Primary Lifeline



- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase.
- Statewide bed and ventilator capacity are projected to meet 30-day medical forecast needs.
- Forecast PPE needs continue to drive state procurement efforts.
- Limited access to nursing homes & similar facilities continues.
- Personal Protective Equipment, Mass Fatality, and Medical Surge workgroups continue efforts.
- One local Alternate Care Site (Population: 0) is operational in Columbus for Med Surge needs.
- 13 requests for Federal assistance have been submitted and addressed.



- The Agriculture workgroup continues to identify and address issues of concern.
- All major pork processing plants impacting Ohio's processing are operating (statewide & nationally).
- Pork depopulation planning continues on account of processing interruption.
- Restaurants are restricted to carry-out and delivery only.
- Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues.
- [Potential quarantine locations](#) have been identified.
- Homelessness workgroup continues to update plans for response.



- First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19.
- Limited access to jails & detention facilities continues.
- ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across their statewide facilities.
- A hot spot at the Cuyahoga Hills Juvenile Correctional Facility is impacting both residents & staff.

Status Update

- Carlin House Assisted Living in Hocking County experienced an outbreak with 23 residents and several staff testing positive.
- State and local partners stayed in touch with the home throughout the weekend.
 - Evacuation of residents was avoided when the Ohio National Guard deployed resources to the building.

Actions Taken:

- Continuous communication with Carlin House, National Guard, and partners to stay aware of the situation at Carlin House.

Planned Actions:

- Obtain updates from Carlin House Convene regional ombudsman teleconference
- Convene Statewide Council of Resident Council Presidents to seek input on visitation restrictions.

- Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities

- Participated in long term care Strike Team call for Carlin House assisted living in Hocking County.

- Continue to monitor DODD system statistics, including positive, pending, and negative cases of COVID-19 for staff and residents.

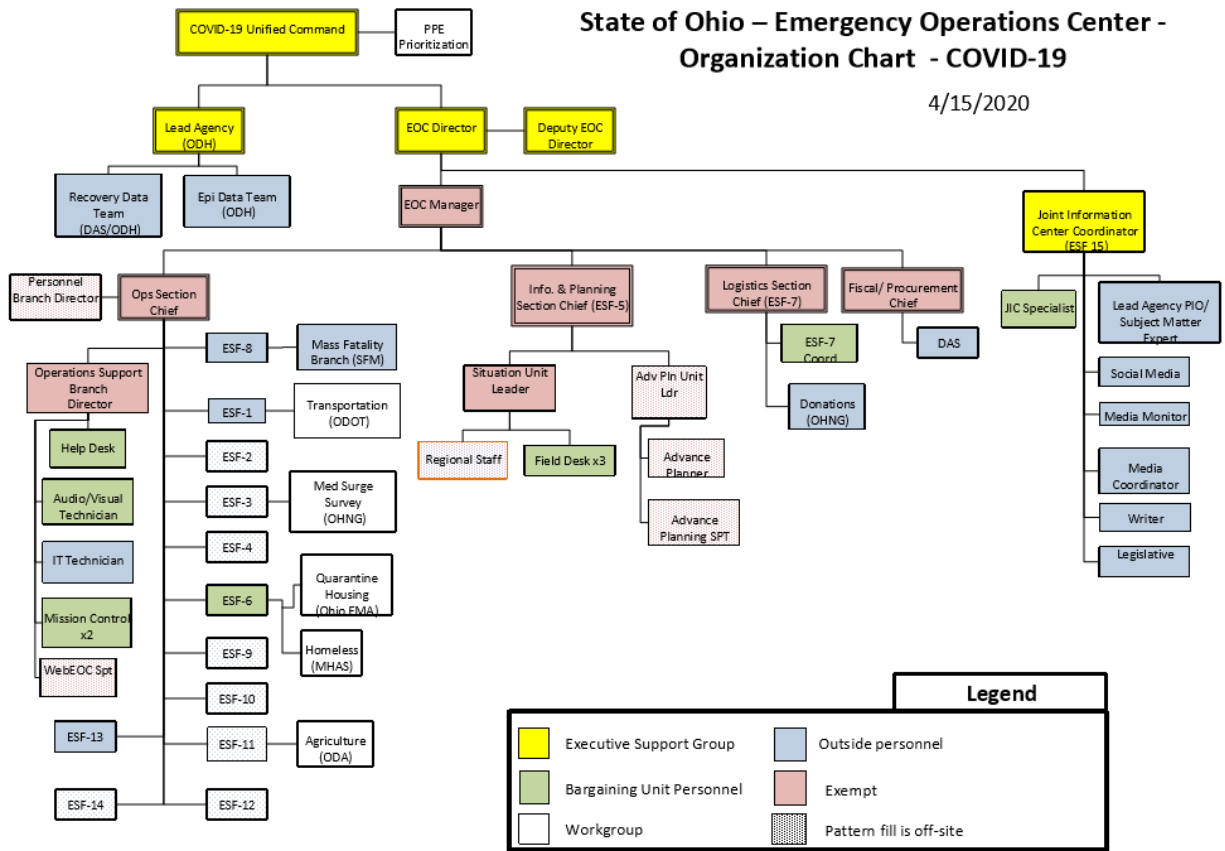
