

## **Executive Summary**

Over the past 24 hours, ODH reported 449 (27,923) total new cases, 15 (1,625) deaths, 51 (4,921) hospitalizations, and 5 (1,305) ICU Admissions; all daily reported metrics were below their respective 21-day averages.

Partner reports in today's reports are inclusive of activity reported over Saturday and Sunday. Updated Objectives have been added to the report. A statewide PPE push will take place once again this week; PPE allocation to each county will be determined in part by County EMA feedback.

The National Weather Service's Excessive Rainfall forecast highlights significant risk likely as two-to-three inches of rain are expected across the Southwest region of the state with localized amounts around four inches possible between the afternoon of May 18<sup>th</sup> and the morning of May 19<sup>th</sup>.

### Primary Lifeline

- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase.
- Statewide bed and ventilator capacity are projected to meet 30-day medical forecast needs.

- Personal Protective Equipment, Mass Fatality, and Medical Surge workgroups continue efforts.
- One local Alternate Care Site (Population: 0) is operational in Columbus for Med Surge needs.
- 13 requests for Federal assistance have been submitted and addressed.
- The Agriculture workgroup continues to identify and address issues of concern.
- All major pork processing plants impacting Ohio's processing are operating (statewide & nationally).
- Pork depopulation planning continues on account of processing interruption.
- Restaurants are restricted to carry-out and delivery only.
- Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues.
- <u>Potential quarantine locations</u> have been identified.
- Homelessness workgroup continues to update plans for response.



- Limited access to jails & detention facilities continues.
- ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across their statewide facilities.
- A hot spot at the Cuyahoga Hills Juvenile Correctional Facility is impacting both residents & staff.


- 139 Guardsmen supporting ODRC safety missions were mission complete on 14 May.


