

# **Executive Summary**

Over the past 24 hours, ODH reported 731 (30,167) total new cases, 97 (5,295) hospitalizations and 28 (1,397) ICU Admissions, and 55 (1,836) deaths. All reported metrics were above their respective 21-day averages.

No new hot spots were identified during the May 21<sup>st</sup> Zone calls. The State EOC continues to provide mission support to six previously identified areas of concern.

A potential PPE temporary storage solution has been identified as the warehouse strategy is finalized. A statewide PPE push has been approved for the week of May 24<sup>th</sup> and will occur on the 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>.

### Primary Lifeline


