

Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, ODH reported 529 (33,006) total new cases, 68 (5,579) hospitalizations, 7 (1,450) ICU Admissions, and 15 (2,002) deaths. All reported metrics were below their respective 21-day averages.

One additional potential hot spot was identified by ODH during the period's Clinical Zone calls; a Butler County outbreak has been linked to off-campus gatherings at Miami University of Oxford. The State EOC continues to provide mission support to five previously identified areas of concern.

The first half of this week's statewide PPE push was completed. The second half is scheduled for May 27th. Use of the Ohio National Guard donation warehouse has been extended through June 5. A storage strategy continues to be developed as current warehouse capacity is near full.

- The RSS Warehouse loaded the 12th PPE allocation from the SEOC of surgical face masks and face shields for the push on to all 88 counties via ODOT (139 pallets).
- The RSS has added on the additional PPE mission for Medina County EMA/Medina County Sheriff's Office to the 12th PPE push.
- The RSS Warehouse prepared 500 Tyvek Coveralls, 200,000 medical gloves and 1,000 N95 Masks for distribution to Ohio National Guard Soldiers and Airmen.
- During this operational period ESF-8 Desk has initiated eight (8) mission requests today with State Partners.

 - Efforts and attention to prevent outbreaks on farms with migrant workers also was discussed.
 - Concerns about inconsistencies with health and safety enforcement at farmers markets was discussed.
 - Other areas in the food supply chain do not report significant disruptions.
- The Processing Plant Health and Safety Subcommittee met today and continue work to provide PPE use education and training at meat processing plants in Ohio.




