Current Situation:

Public Health – Dayton & Montgomery County, the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and World Health Organization (WHO) are closely monitoring an outbreak of respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus (termed "COVID-19") first identified in Wuhan City, Hubei Province, China in December 2019 and which continues to expand.

Current Updates:

- MOST IMPORTANT MESSAGE OF THE DAY: DO EVERYTHING YOU CAN TO CONSERVE PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE).
- Globally the World now has 3,214,256 cases and 232,570 deaths from COVID-19.
- The Director's Order covering the next 29 days was released today. It can be viewed at https://coronavirus.ohio.gov/static/publicorders/Directors-Stay-Safe-Ohio-Order.pdf.
- There will be a community focused rapid regional test site arriving to the area shortly. It will have the capability of running nearly 2,000 tests a day when fully operational. It is estimated that their turnaround time will be 4 to 6 hours.

- The county will be receiving two deliveries from the strategic national stockpile in the
 upcoming week. Requests for PPE can be made by hospitals, fire/EMS, law
 enforcement, healthcare workers, and locations such as nursing homes, assisted living,

- Public Health along with other response partners will hold a conference call with congregate locations on Monday, May 4th at 9:00 AM.

- ODH information line remains open, the number is 1-833-4-ASK-ODH and is open seven days a week.
- Public Health continues to monitor all sources (ODH, CDC, WHO, European Center for Disease and Prevention and Control (ECOC) for the latest information.
- Public Health maintains its one-week operational period for this response.
- Public Health will continue to share the situational report with other local health departments, Montgomery County Emergency Management, Greater Dayton Area Hospital Association and Dayton Metropolitan Medical Response System partners.



CDC is closely monitoring an outbreak of respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus named COVID-19. World Health Organization Update:

Highlights

Two new Member States (Comoros and Tajikistan) reported cases of COVID-19 in the past 24 hours.

The **third meeting of the Emergency Committee** was convened by the WHO Director-General under the International Health Regulations (2005) (IHR) regarding COVID-19.

The WHO Regional Director for Europe, Dr. Hans Henri P. Kluge mentioned that "we will defeat COVID-19 by disseminating knowledge in all transparency, by personalized support in the field and by unfailing solidarity". In another statement, he emphasized that "we cannot allow the impact of COVID-19 to be amplified by neglecting other vital health protection measures".

The WHO Regional Office for the Americas urged health authorities to take specific steps to protect health care workers and communities during essential immunization activities throughout the COVID-19 pandemic.

WHO virtually convened vaccine manufacturers and national regulatory authorities from its South-East Asia Region to discuss COVID-19 vaccines.

In the **Subject in Focus** below, we describe WHO's work to ensure that shipping and seafarers can continue to deliver vital goods, including medical supplies and food during the COVID-19 pandemic






Cases & Deaths by State


