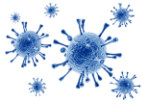
Current Situation:

Public Health – Dayton & Montgomery County, the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and World Health Organization (WHO) are closely monitoring an outbreak of respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus (termed “COVID-19”) first identified in Wuhan City, Hubei Province, China in December 2019 and which continues to expand.

Current Updates:

- **MOST IMPORTANT MESSAGE OF THE DAY: DO EVERYTHING YOU CAN TO CONSERVE PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE).**
- Globally the World now has 4,137,193 cases and 285,760 deaths from COVID-19.
- The county will receive another Strategic National Stockpile delivery on Wednesday, May 13, 2020.
- Public Health facilitated a conference call with congregate locations on Monday, May 11th at 9 AM.
- Governor DeWine provided the following updates during his press conference on Tuesday, May 12, 2020:
 - There will be a pandemic EBT plan to cover 850,000 students across Ohio who rely on free or reduced-price meal programs.
 - Massage therapy, acupuncture and cosmetic therapy will be able to open May 15, 2020 with the implementation of proper safety measures
 - Tattoo and body piercing services will be permitted to reopen May 15, 2020.
 - Ohio Department of Aging announced a new service today that will provide a daily check in by phone for Ohioans age 60 or older.



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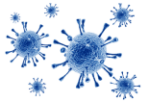


- Retail stores opened today, and Public Health is closing monitoring complaints and concerns and will have a physical presence in the community.
- Portable hand-washing stations are in the process of being placed this week in Dayton to support high traffic areas.
- The county is projected to receive roughly 120,000 handmade masks from the state to support locations within the county for masks.

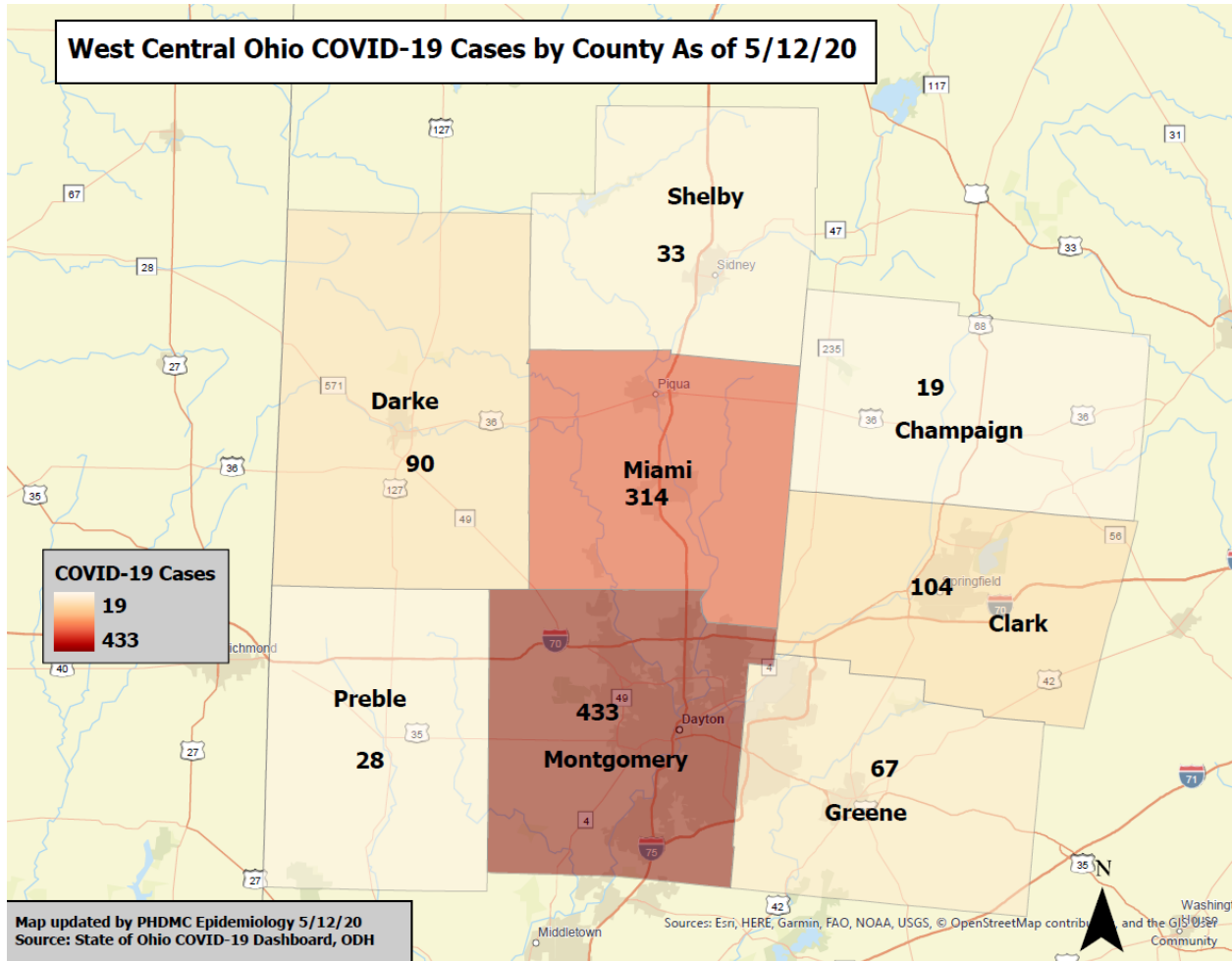


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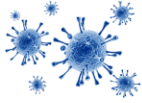
Regional Breakdown of cases:

The outbreak first started in Wuhan, China, but cases have been identified in a growing number of other [international locations](#), including the United States. CDC will update the following U.S. map daily. Information regarding the number of people under investigation will be updated daily.

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Level 3 Travel Health Notice: Widespread ongoing transmission with restrictions on entry to the United States

CDC recommends that travelers avoid all nonessential travel to the following destinations. Most foreign nationals who have been in one of these countries during the previous 14 days will not be allowed to enter the United States.

Level 2 Travel Health Notice: Ongoing community transmission

CDC recommends that older adults and people of any age with serious chronic medical conditions should consider postponing nonessential travel to most global destinations.

Level 1 Travel Health Notice: Limited community transmission

CDC recommends travelers practice usual health precautions recommended for their destination.

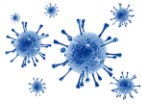
World Health Organization Update:

WHO has published a new guidance on Considerations for school-related public health measures in the context of COVID-19 as an annex to earlier guidance on adjusting public health and social measures published on 15 April 2020.

WHO has issued a Statement on Tobacco use and COVID-19. Tobacco smoking is a known risk factor for many respiratory infections and increases the severity of respiratory diseases. A review of studies by public health experts convened by WHO found that smokers are more likely to develop severe disease with COVID-19, compared to non-smokers. WHO urges researchers, scientists and the media to be cautious about amplifying unproven claims that tobacco or nicotine could reduce the risk of COVID-19.

The Director-General Dr. Tedros in his media briefing yesterday, urged a slow, steady, lifting of public health and social measures (so called lockdowns), which is key to stimulating economies, while also keeping a vigilant eye on the virus so that control measures can be quickly implemented if an upswing in cases is identified.

In the 'Subject in Focus' below, WHO Operations and Support Logistics (OSL), in collaboration with a technical network of universities, architects, biomedical engineers and other health experts, is working to support the establishment of COVID-19 treatment centers, self-



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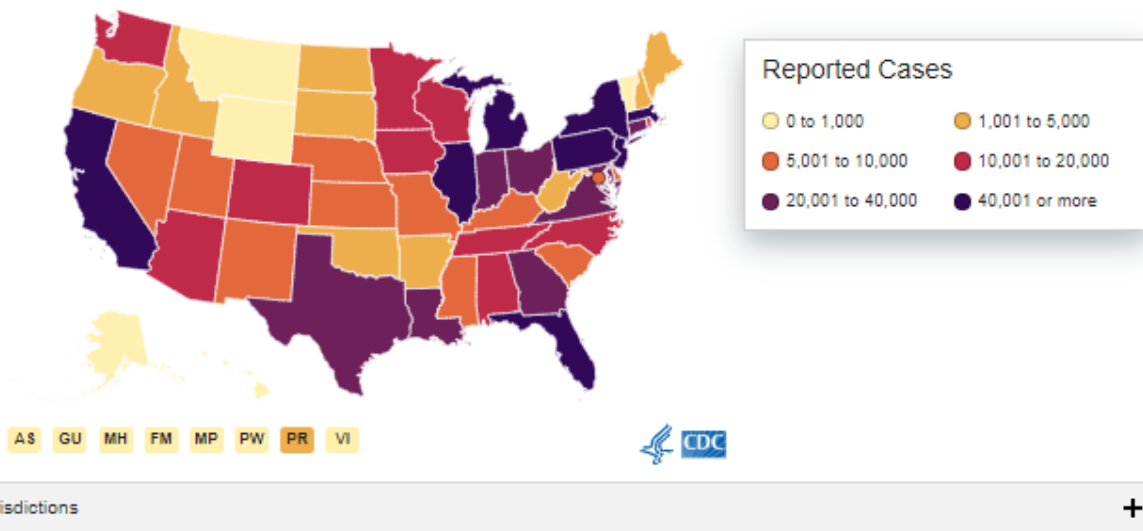


quarantine and community facilities at the request of countries seeking technical guidance in setting up such facilities.

Cases & Deaths by State

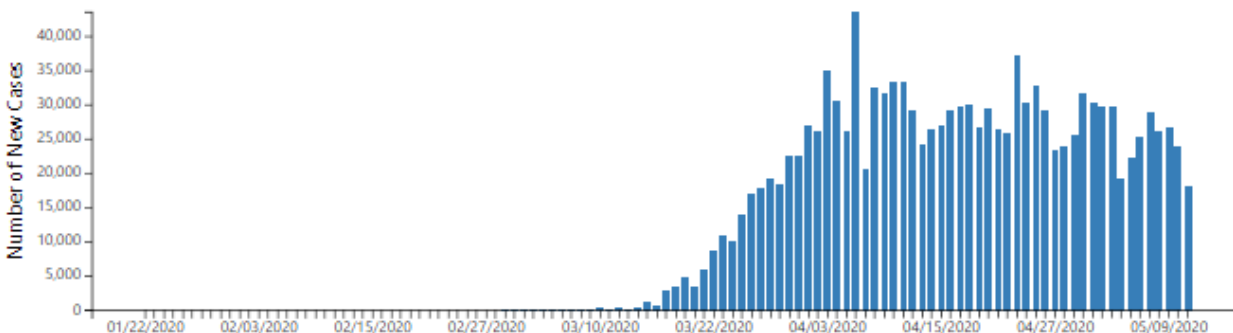
26 states report more than 10,000 cases of COVID-19.

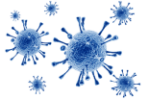
