Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, ODH reported 566 (32,477) total new cases, 35 (5,511) hospitalizations, 5 (1,443) ICU Admissions, and 18 (1,987) deaths. All reported metrics were below their respective 21-day averages.

Monitoring of areas of interest continued during the weekend as the EOC operated virtually. The State EOC continues to provide mission support to five previously identified areas of concern.

Two statewide PPE pushes will be conducted this week on May 26th and May 27th. A storage strategy continues to be developed as current warehouse capacity is near full.

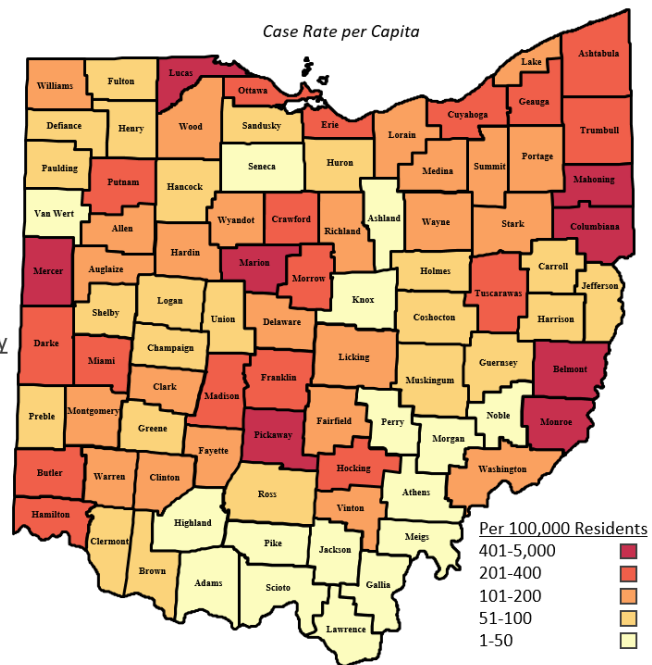

State Community Lifeline Status

Primary Lifeline



- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase.
- Statewide bed and ventilator capacity are projected to meet medical forecast needs.
- Forecast PPE needs continue to drive state procurement efforts.
- Limited access to nursing homes & similar facilities continues.
- Personal Protective Equipment, Mass Fatality, and Medical Surge workgroups continue efforts.
- 13 requests for Federal assistance have been submitted and addressed.



- The Agriculture workgroup continues to identify and address issues of concern.
- All major pork processing plants impacting Ohio's processing are operating (statewide & nationally).
- Pork depopulation planning continues on account of processing interruption.
- Restaurants are restricted to outdoor dining and carry-out and delivery.
- Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues.
- [Potential quarantine locations](#) have been identified.
- Homelessness workgroup continues to update plans for response.



- First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19.
- Limited access to jails & detention facilities continues.
- ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across their statewide facilities.



- No current impacts to the lifeline requiring EOC support.

1. Coordinate the State’s response to limit COVID-19 spread and maintain Lifeline stability.
2. Provide mission support to identify, prevent, mitigate and respond to COVID-19 hot spots.
3. Procure PPE based on funding availability and forecasted need.
4. Finalize warehousing strategy and weekly PPE push.
5. Communicate clear guidance on proper administration of recovery programs to partners.
6. Share timely, clear, and consistent information to the public, stakeholders and media.

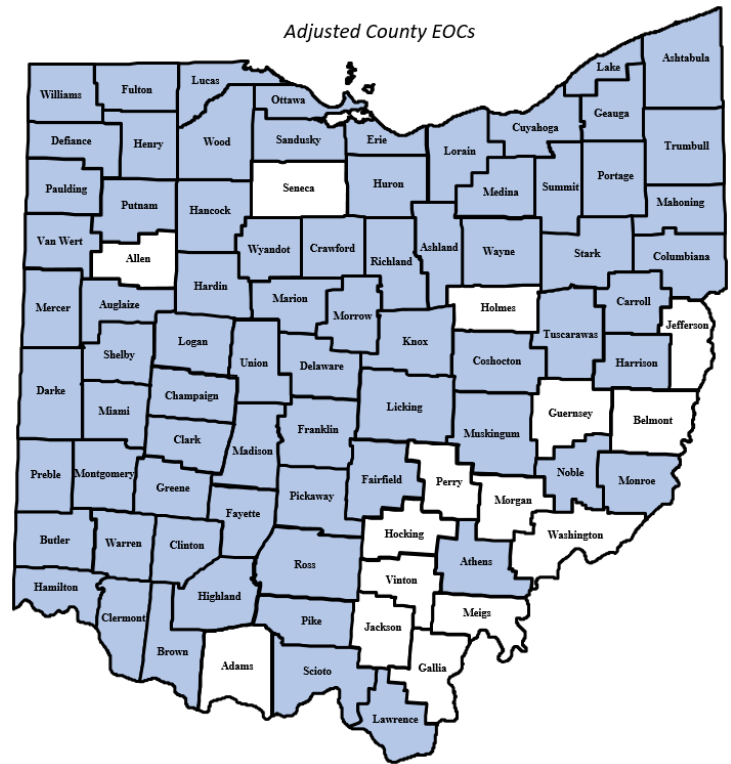

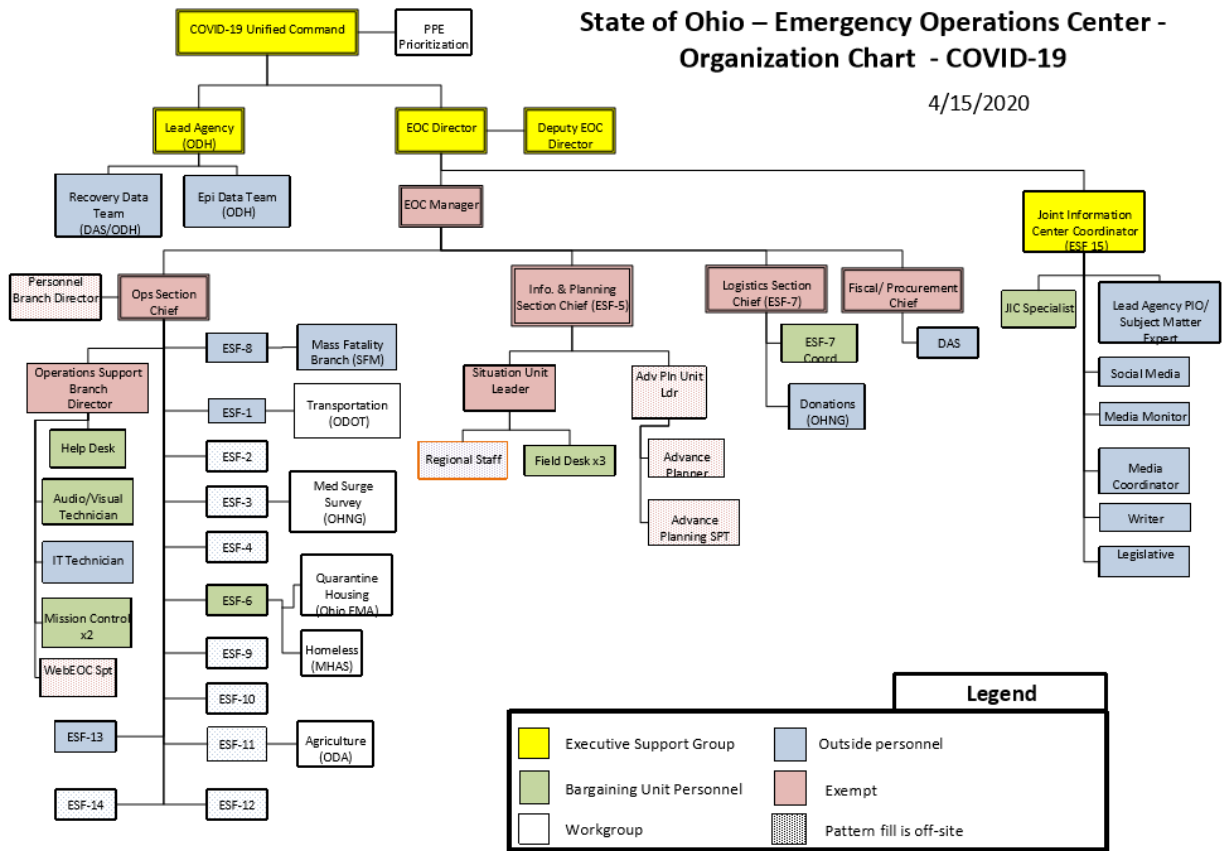
