
Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, ODH reported 476 (33,915) total new cases which was below the 21-day average. 111 (5,811) hospitalizations, 24 (1,516) ICU Admissions, and 54 (2,098) deaths were also reported, all of which were above their respective 21-day averages.

No new Hot Spots were identified during the day's Clinical Zone calls. The State EOC continues to provide mission support to five previously identified areas of concern.

The second half of this week's PPE push occurred on May 29. State PPE stores continue to be transferred to a secondary location per the current storage strategy.

 - Purpose: Planning for needs to address forecast Medical Surge needs.

Actions Taken:

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- O Zone 1: COVID-19 positive patients are still higher than normal in Region 2 (NE), with no identifiable change in Regions (NW) and (NECO). Medical Surge bed utilization for all regions continues to increase. Hospitals in (NECO) continue to note normal/lower than normal Emergency Department (ED) volumes. Because of the trend in COVID-19 patients and ED volumes, some hospitals in that region are planning on lowering their visitation restrictions in the coming weeks.
- O Zone 3: Hospitals in Region (SW) continue to note an increase in Medical Surge bed utilization due to an increase in non-COVID related patients. The hospitals are currently reporting that the increase of patients is manageable. EMS in Region (WC) reported that they are responding to an increase in more severe injuries due to delayed medical procedures due to the fear of potential COVID-19 transmission in hospitals. Patients are requesting that EMS provide the care in their home to avoid transport to a hospital.
- ESF-8 conducted a virtual Quarterly ESF-8 Partners meeting today to discuss COVID-19 next steps, barriers, blind spots and continued preparedness activities with state partners.
- ODH participated in the FEMA/HHS LNO call where we discussed HHS new cloth masks query and process, thermometer status, warehouse weekend availability and gowns.
- O During this operational period ESF-8 Desk has originated two (2) mission requests today with State Partners.

- ODH continues to collaborate on daily RFIs and planning efforts with federal and state stakeholders and ESF-8 partners to provide guidance and direct information.
- Department of Aging and State Long-Term Care Ombudsman

Actions Taken:

 The Department participated on the ESF-8 Partner Meeting, facilitated by the Ohio Department of Health. We appreciated the opportunity to contribute to how we can continue to support ESF-8 and to think through how to best work through future events, such as spikes.

Planned Actions:

- The Department will host its weekly webinar tomorrow with our regional Area Agencies on Agencies and partners, in the effort to continue to provide updated guidance and support. The State Ombudsman will be a presenter on the webinar this week.
- After significant stakeholder input, the state has developed a framework for opening limited visitation at Residential Care Facilities and Intermediate Care Facilities for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities. The Governor announced a

start date of June 8th. The ombudsman is working on information to provide to family members when the visits occur.

Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities

Actions Taken:

- COVID-19 testing of staff and residents has been completed at all of the State operated Developmental Centers (DC).
- o Participated in ESF-8 partner update meeting.

Planned Actions:

- Continue to monitor DODD system statistics, including positive, pending, and negative cases of COVID-19 for staff and residents.
- o Continue to track daily inventory and usage of PPE for the Developmental Centers.
- Ohio Mental Health and Addictive Services

Actions Taken:

- Housing and homelessness workgroup working with residential providers to identify ways to connect to local collaboratives and local health departments around hospital initiatives and partnering.
- o OhioMHAS COVID-19 CareLine has been active for four weeks now.
 - Length of time per call is increasing, but the average number of calls per week has dipped from an initial 600+ to 200+.
 - Stress is the biggest presenting problem and we are doing risk assessments for callers when that is indicated, and most callers are low risk.
 - We plan to continue CARELINE throughout the behavioral health surge and further on as crisis needs maybe identified.
- Residential providers are connecting to local collaboratives for hospital related initiatives and not always sure who they should partner with.
- Assistance may be needed in some counties to connect with local health departments.
 - We will provide technical assistance and support especially for a specific difficulty or scenario they are encountering.

Planned Actions:

- Transportation: Reports from local board areas and community that transportation availability and access continue as a concern in coordination and providing treatment services.
 - Kids and adults with severe mental health issues who need day treatment services often encounter transportation barriers.
 - We will connect with Jobs and Family Services and Ohio Department of Medicaid on this issue as there are liability and other concerns.

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- This is a multiple agency concern and may be referred to RecoveryOhio Advisory council for additional input and recommendations.
- Tele-Health: Options available in the future working within our regulatory environment to hold focus groups to ensure we are doing the best work that people need and work with Ohio Department of Medicaid on regulatory changes and we will be taking cues from the federal government to understand what is and is not allowable.
- Ohio Department of Education

- Continuing to develop new and update existing information and policy documents for schools regarding services to students during closures Developing Education Reset and Restart Planning Guide and resources for schools and district.
- Ohio Emergency Medical Services

Actions Taken:

- Working with Beverley Laubert the LTC Ombudsman regarding a facility in Region 7 have issues with local EMS transporting patients from their facility.




