

### **Executive Summary**

Over the past 24 hours, ODH reported 471 (35,984) total new cases, 63 (6,112) hospitalizations, and 13 (1,569) ICU Admissions, which were below their respective 21-day averages. There were 51 (2,206) deaths, which was were above the respective 21-day average.

One new hot spot was identified during today's clinical zone calls; a congregate care facility outbreak in Mahoning County is being addressed by the Local Health Department. The State EOC continues to provide mission support to previously identified areas of concern. The OHNG support at Franklin County Medical Center ended on June 1.

A statewide PPE push was conducted on June 1. A second push is planned for June 3. State PPE stores continue to be transferred to a secondary location per the current storage strategy.

- The RSS Warehouse is shipping specimen collection kits to complete missions for UC Health (Hamilton County), Cuyahoga County Board of Health, and Columbus Public Health.
- The Adelaide Ct. warehouse received seven inbound shipments of cotton face masks, surgical masks, nitrile gloves, isolation gowns, HE cartridges, and biological positive pressure system loose fitting hood w/cape on May 29.


