Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, ODH reported 366 (36,350) total new cases, 64 (6,176) hospitalizations, and 14 (1,583) ICU Admissions, which were below their respective 21-day averages. There were 52 (2,258) deaths, which was above the respective 21-day average.

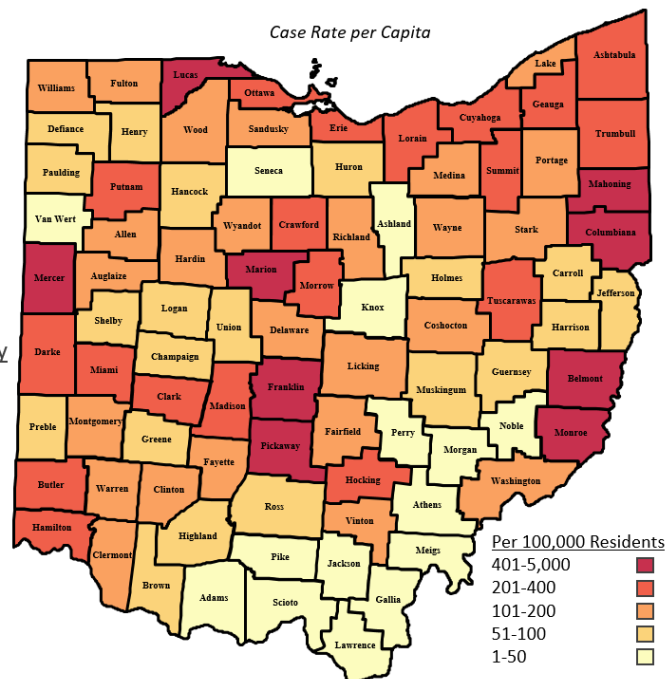
No new hot spots were identified during the day's clinical zone calls. The State EOC continues to provide mission support to previously identified areas of concern. A request to extend Title 32 orders for Ohio National Guard members has been made to FEMA.

This week's second push of PPE is planned for June 3. An additional push has been approved for next week. State PPE stores continue to be transferred to a secondary location per the current storage strategy while long-term storage planning continues.

Primary Lifeline



- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase.

- Homelessness workgroup continues to update plans for response.



- First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19.
- Limited access to jails & detention facilities continues.
- ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across their statewide facilities.



- No current impacts to the lifeline requiring EOC support.

Actions Taken:

- The RSS Warehouse provided specimen collection kit training (cold chain, sterilization/sanitation, safety, handling, and packing protocols, documentation) training to 88 Ohio National Guard Members June 1.
- ODH participated in the FEMA/HHS LNO call where we were queried about testing centers and any affects by the protests, addressed a query on surgical gowns for their assessment of future allocation and discussed Title 32 status of NG.
- The RSS Warehouse received five inbound shipments of 3D printed swabs, biohazard bags, VTM, face masks, isolation gowns, and gauze pads.
- During this operational period ESF-8 Desk has not originated any mission requests today with State Partners.

- The Ag Work Group had its weekly meeting on the morning of June 2.
 - Meat processing and dairy plants continue to operate in Ohio.
 - The out-of-state processing plants Ohio producers utilize are also operational.
 - Livestock and other agricultural commodities are holding their own despite COVID-19 supply chain disruptions.
- Cheese production in Ohio is increasing, likely due to the reopening of restaurants. Agriculture staff continue to work with farmers' markets to promote appropriate guidance based on current orders and facilitate cooperation with local health districts.
- Soybean and corn planting continues in Ohio with nearly 2/3 completed. Some replanting is necessary due to rain, but farmers are ahead of schedule compared to last year.

Planned Actions:

- Pork Industry Small Working Group will meet on June 3 at noon for an update on processing capacity, depopulation planning and outreach and communications with local partners.
- Health and Safety Processing Plant Subcommittee is preparing a survey for staff in state meat processing plants to better understand the use of face masks.

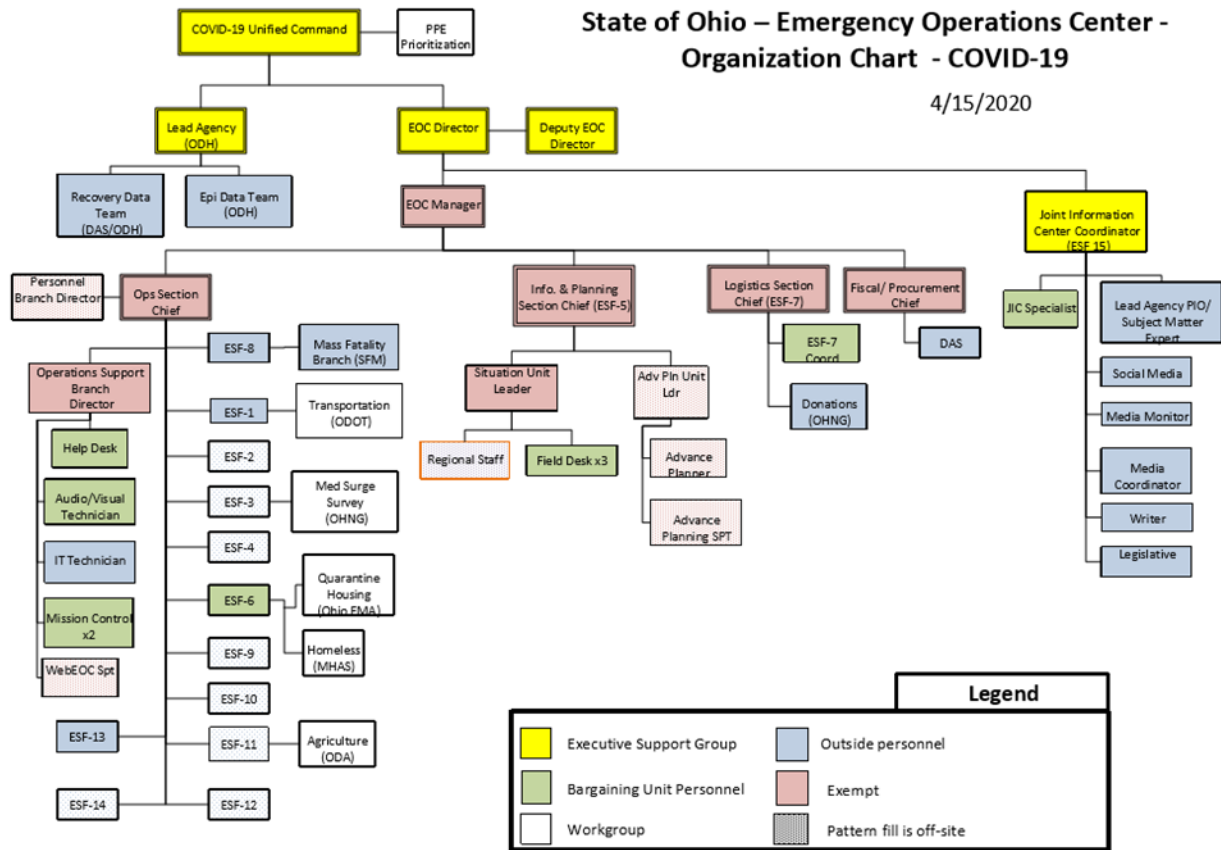
