Executive Summary


Over the past 24 hours, ODH reported 490 (37,282) total new cases and 61 (6,312) hospitalization, which were below their 21-day average. 19 (1,623) ICU Admissions and 40 (2,339) deaths, were above the respective 21-day average.

ODH reported an additional hot spot identified in a Mercer County-based congregate care facility. Interfacility staffing may be the cause as the management company has been recognized as the same team managing a previously identified hot spot in Mercer County. The State EOC continues to provide mission support to previously identified areas of concern.

An extension of Title 32 orders for Ohio National Guard is in progress.

The second statewide push of PPE was completed. An additional push has been approved for next week. State PPE stores continue to be transferred to a secondary location per the current storage strategy while long-term storage planning continues.

- A strike team call has been requested for COVID-19 situation at Kenton Nursing & Rehab, in Hardin County. This call is scheduled for tomorrow at noon.
- The RSS has received four (4) inbound shipments of MTM, cotton synthetic swabs, saline, sterile foam tip applicator swabs, KN95s, TheraPak, and flocked swabs.
- The Adelaide warehouse has received six (6) inbound shipments of isolation gowns, cloth face masks, and face masks.

- The RSS sent out five (5) boxes of supplies for the 30 x 30 project to the ODH 900 Freeway Dr. Warehouse.
- RSS Preparing for 16th PPE Push on Monday, 8 June 2020.



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
