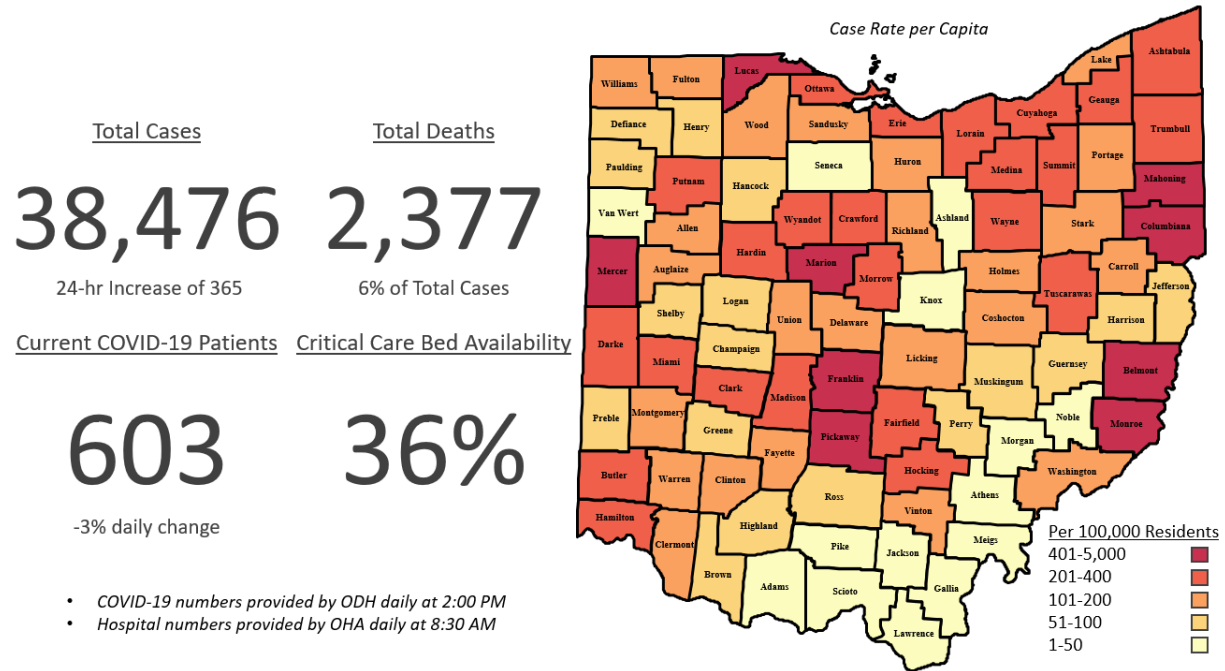
Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, ODH reported 365 (38,476) total new cases, 37 (6,497) hospitalizations, 7 (1,657) ICU Admissions, and 7 (2,377) deaths. Each metric was below the respective 21-day averages.

No new hot spots were identified over the past 48 hours. The State EOC continues to support local hot spot identification, prevention, and mitigation efforts through planning and mission support.

The State EOC is preparing for this week's statewide PPE pushes, scheduled for June 8 and June 10.

Primary Lifeline



- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase.
- Statewide bed and ventilator capacity are projected to meet medical forecast needs.
- Forecast PPE needs continue to drive state procurement efforts.
- Limited access to nursing homes & similar facilities continues.
- 13 requests for Federal assistance have been submitted and addressed.



- The Agriculture workgroup continues to monitor for issues of concern.
- All major pork processing plants impacting Ohio's processing are operating (statewide & nationally).
- Pork depopulation planning continues on account of processing interruption.
- Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues.
- [Potential quarantine locations](#) have been identified.
- Homelessness workgroup continues to update plans for response.



- First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19.
- Limited access to jails & detention facilities continues.
- ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across their statewide facilities.



- No current impacts to the lifeline requiring EOC support.



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State EOC Objectives

1. Coordinate the State’s response to limit COVID-19 spread and maintain Lifeline stability.
2. Provide mission support to identify, prevent, mitigate and respond to COVID-19 hot spots.
3. Procure PPE based on funding availability and forecasted need.
4. Finalize warehousing strategy and execute weekly PPE push.
5. Share timely, clear, and consistent information to the whole community, especially as it pertains to recovery programs.

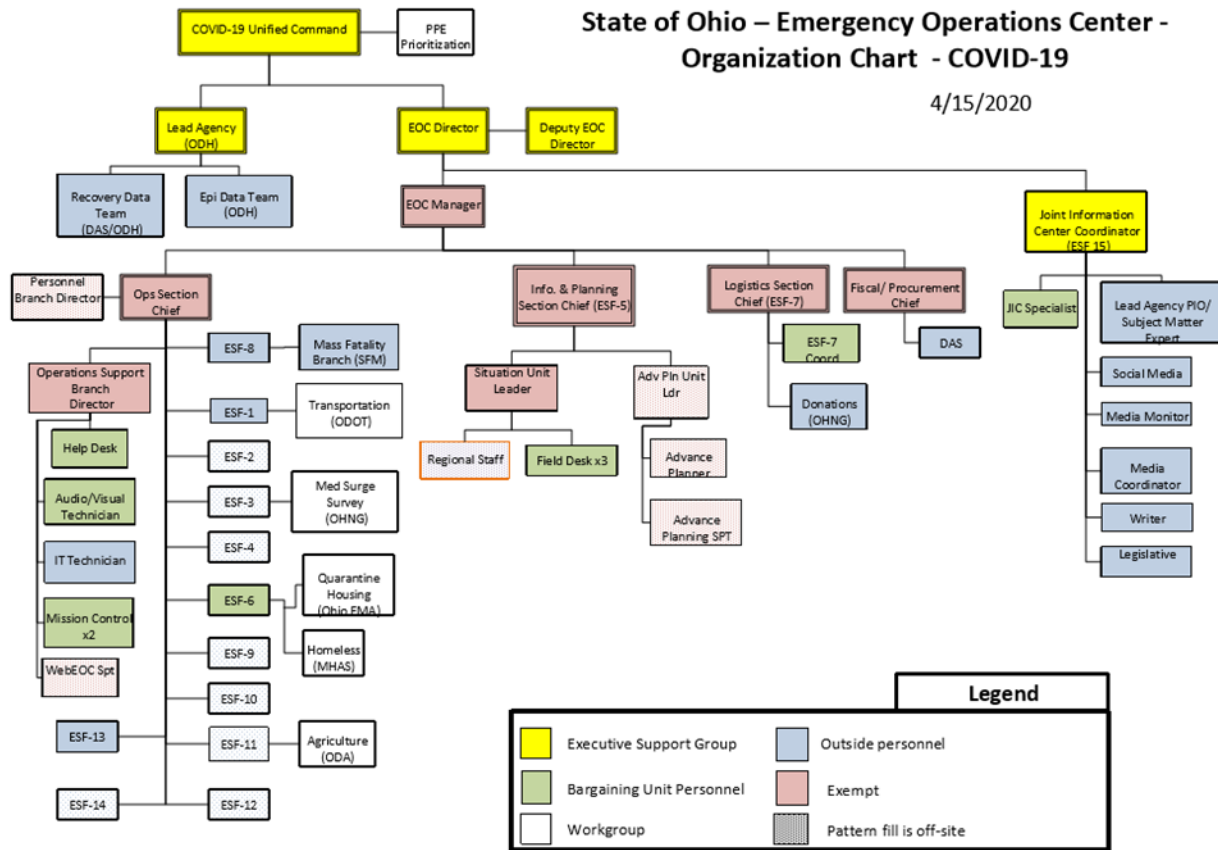
