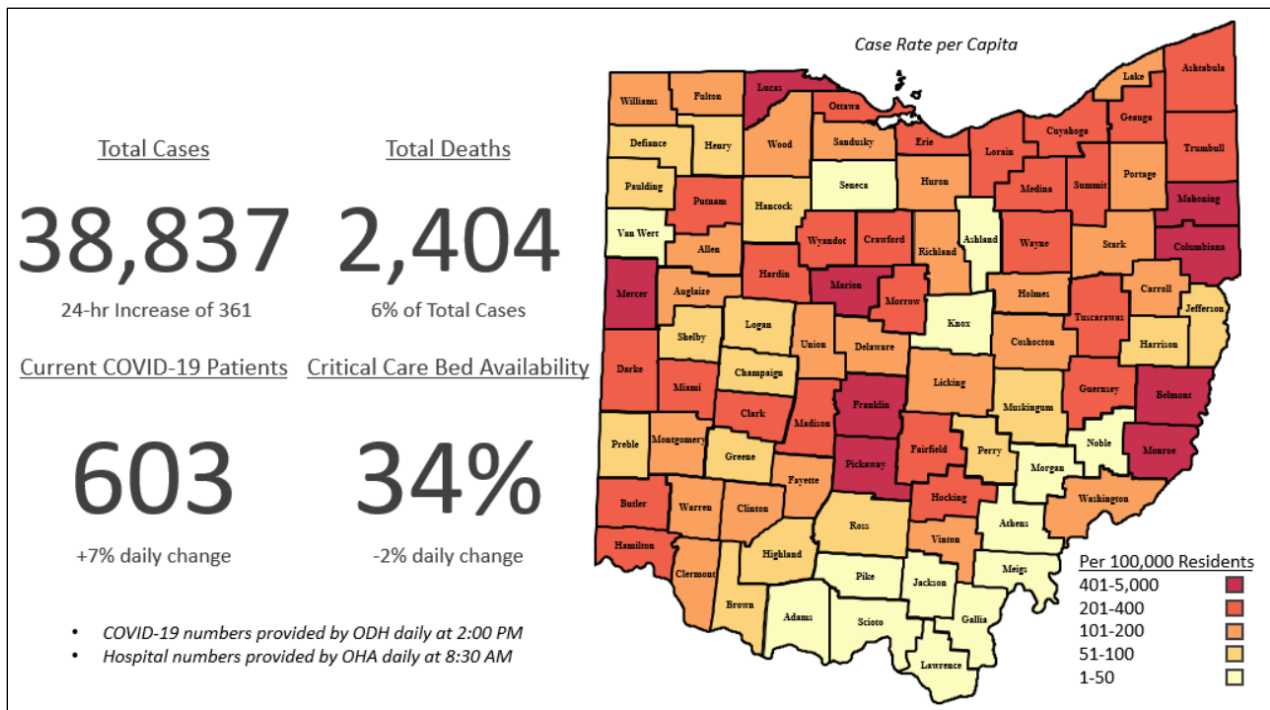
### Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, ODH reported 361 (38,837) total new cases, 53 (6,550) hospitalizations, 11 (1,668) ICU Admissions, and 27 (2,404) deaths. All metrics were below the respective 21-day averages.

No new information on potential or existing hot spots was reported from yesterday's clinical zone calls. The State EOC continues to support one previously identified hot spot through an ongoing mission. ODH continues to monitor 11 hot spots.

The second statewide push of PPE was completed. An additional push is scheduled for Wednesday, June 10.

## State Community Lifeline Status

### Primary Lifeline



- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase.
- Statewide bed and ventilator capacity are projected to meet medical forecast needs.
- Forecast PPE needs continue to drive state procurement efforts.

- Personal Protective Equipment, Mass Fatality, and Medical Surge workgroups continue efforts.

- No current impacts to the lifeline requiring EOC support.

5. Share timely, clear, and consistent information to the whole community, especially as it pertains to recovery programs.

- The RSS Warehouse sent out testing supplies and surgical face masks to OHNG.
- ESF-8 has reached out to recruited licensees from the licensee pool to support staffing requests at two veterans homes (Sandusky and Georgetown) and a nursing facility in Franklin County.
  - Respondents to the request have been shared with the requestors for direct follow up.
- The RSS Warehouse staged and loaded 146 pallets for the 16th PPE allocation from the SEOC, for a push of 309,480 gowns and 1,299,000 gloves to all 88 counties.
- The RSS Warehouse has received four (4) inbound shipments of disposable isolation gowns, VTM tubes and media, filters and reagents, and cotton face masks.

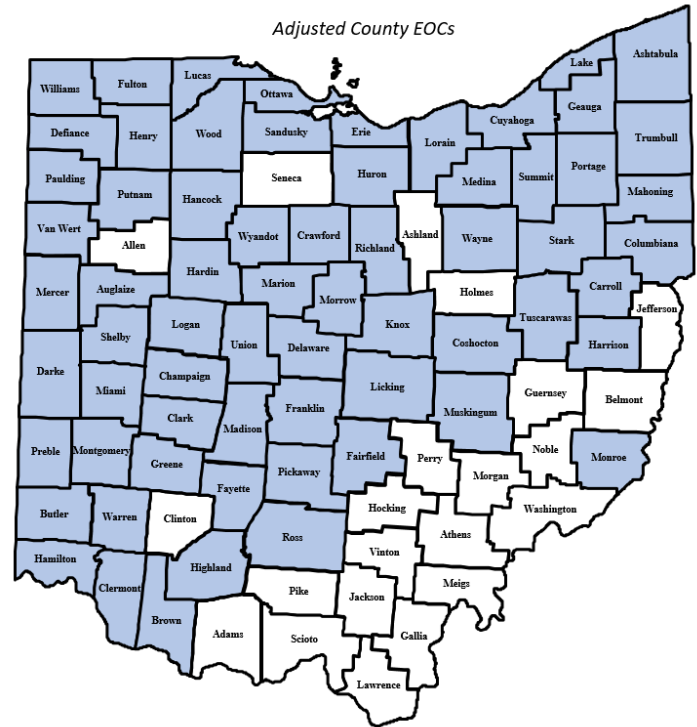

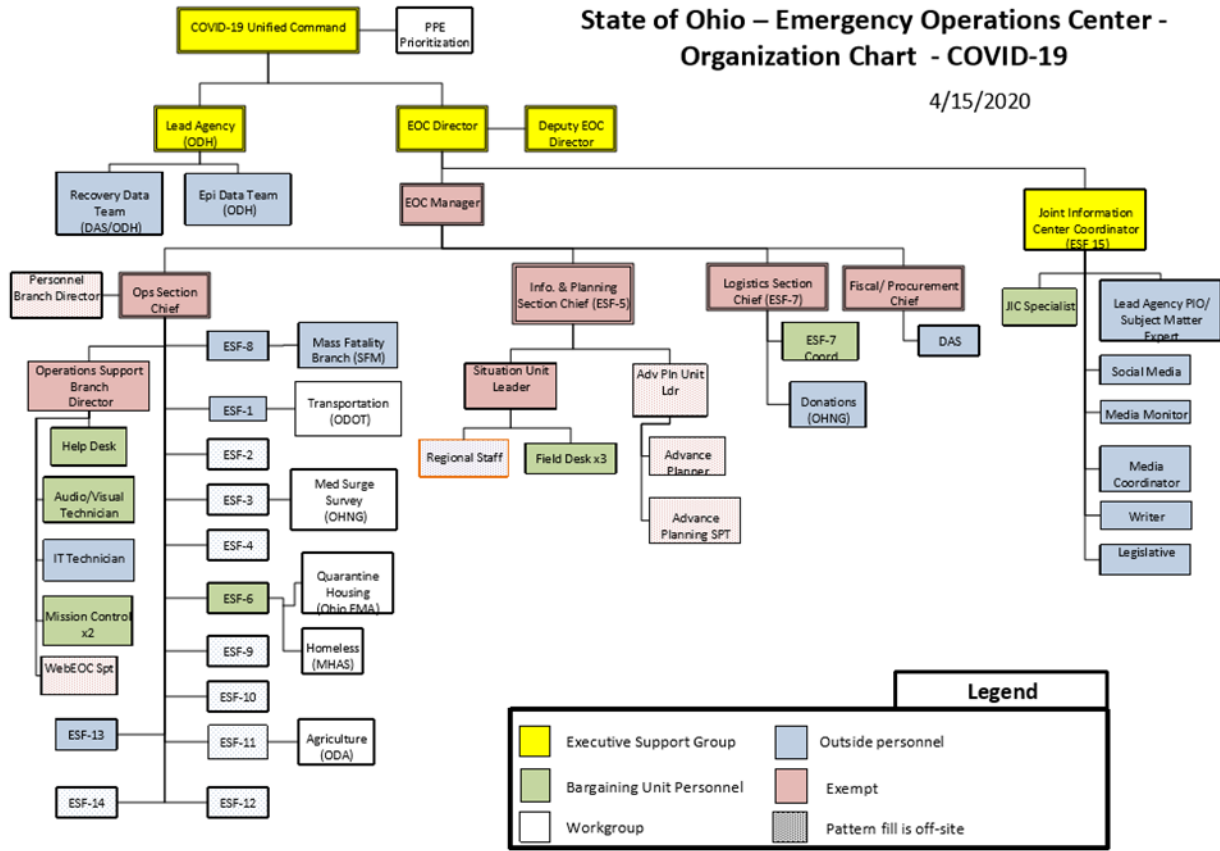
