Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, ODH's reported 325 (39,162) total new cases, 70 (6,620) hospitalizations, and 17 (2,421) deaths were below their respective 21-day averages. The ODH-reported 40 (1,708) ICU Admissions was above the 21-day average.

No new information on potential or existing hot spots was reported from yesterday's clinical zone calls. The State EOC continues to support one previously identified hot spot through an ongoing mission. ODH continues to monitor eight hot spots.

A statewide push of PPE is scheduled for today. The NWS has forecast in increased potential for widespread severe storms. Damaging winds, hail, and tornado activity are all potential threats. Time of greatest concerns is between 2 PM and Midnight.

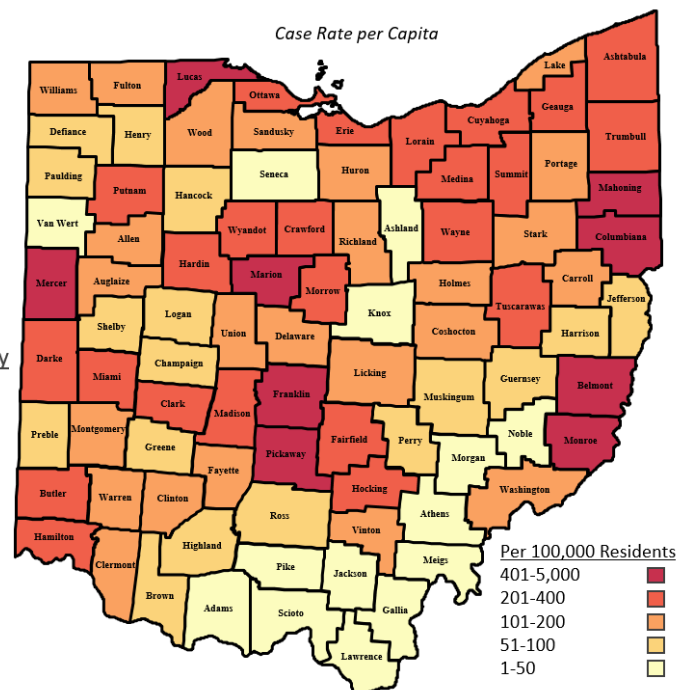

Primary Lifeline



- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase.
- Statewide bed and ventilator capacity are projected to meet medical forecast needs.
- Forecast PPE needs continue to drive state procurement efforts.
- Limited access to nursing homes & similar facilities continues.
- Personal Protective Equipment, Mass Fatality, and Medical Surge workgroups continue efforts.
- 13 requests for Federal assistance have been submitted and addressed.



- The Agriculture workgroup continues to monitor for issues of concern.
- All major pork processing plants impacting Ohio's processing are operating (statewide & nationally).
- Pork depopulation planning continues on account of processing interruption.
- Restaurants are open per the ODH Dine Safe Ohio Order (current as of May 21)
- Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues.
- [Potential quarantine locations](#) have been identified.
- Homelessness workgroup continues to update plans for response.



- First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19.
- Limited access to jails & detention facilities continues.
- ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across their statewide facilities.



- No current impacts to the lifeline requiring EOC support.



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State EOC Objectives

1. Coordinate the State's response to limit COVID-19 spread and maintain Lifeline stability.
2. Provide mission support to identify, prevent, mitigate and respond to COVID-19 hot spots.
3. Procure PPE based on funding availability and forecasted need.
4. Finalize warehousing strategy and execute weekly PPE push.
5. Share timely, clear, and consistent information to the whole community, especially as it pertains to recovery programs.

5 | Information & Planning

- State EOC Liaisons

Actions Taken:

- There are no deployed liaisons.

Planned Actions:

- Support County EOCs and continue working with state agency partners as necessary (via deployment or virtual means).

6 | Mass Care

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency

Actions Taken:

- Ongoing coordination with partners including CAP, ODJFS, and OHNG regarding open missions.
- Participated in Agriculture Work Group and Migrant Farming Communities Work Group meetings to discuss mitigation strategies to keep the food production system functional while minimizing the spread of COVID-19 in these environments.

Planned Actions:

- Ongoing coordination and response.
- FEMA webinar on COVID-19-related planning considerations.

7 | Logistics

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency

Actions Taken:

- Redirected FEDEX shipment of 50,000 donated surgical masks from the old donations warehouse at Haubrich Armory to the ODPS ACF.
- Entered mission for ESF-8/RSS Warehouse to distribute 1.7M FEMA cloth face coverings to the Ohio Association of Food Banks.
- Worked with FEMA V logistics to confirm that delivery of 11,500 cloth masks from FEMA were to be counted against HHS cloth mask allocation.
- Coordinated with Ohio Department of Aging and the RSS warehouse to distribute 260,000 FEMA cloth face coverings for department of aging clients.
- Processing payments
- Purchased 2,139,000 gloves.
- Working with ODH warehouse on deliveries
- Update the Techknowvate survey with deliveries received.

Planned Actions:

- Continue work to distribute FEMA cloth face coverings.
- Continue coordinating with FEMA logistics on inbound federal PPE shipments against resources requests or FEMA directed pushes.
- Continue to update the Warehouse Management Systems requirements.

8 | Public Health

- Ohio Department of Health
 - Lead Agency for PPE Workgroup
 - Purpose: To determine and allocate appropriate PPE for COVID-19 responders.
 - Lead Agency for Mass Fatality Workgroup
 - Purpose: To assemble stakeholders within mass fatality/fatality management to develop statewide strategies & unified effort in the management of decedents.
 - Lead Agency for Medical Surge Workgroup
 - Purpose: Planning for needs to address forecast Medical Surge needs.

Actions Taken:

- ODH participated in the FEMA/HHS LNO call; discussion topics included:
 - the upcoming SNS 2.0 call
 - Burn Rates for PPE, May's shipments for specimen collection kit media
 - ACS preparedness
 - NG RRF for PPE
 - Questions about long term care and nursing home PPE shipments.
- ESF-8 conducted ESF-8 partner touch point.
- One (1) inbound shipment of disposable aprons has been received at the Adelaide warehouse.
- Four (4) inbound shipments of cotton face masks and Microtest M4RT tubes have been received at the RSS warehouse.
- Two (2) Hamilton Star testing systems have been transferred to University Hospital, University of Cincinnati Labs.
- The RSS has sent provider gowns and wipers for the 30 x 30 project.
- During this operational period ESF-8 Desk has originated two (2) new mission requests with State Partners.

Planned Actions:

- On June 10 Ohio RSS warehouse, in collaboration with ESF-1, will execute the 17th PPE Push to all 88 county drop sites.
 - The push will consist of 120 pallets containing:
 - 1,497,000 surgical face masks

- 750,320 KN-95 non-medical masks.
- ODOT will be executing the push with the following resources:
 - 11 ODOT drivers reporting to the RSS.
 - eight (8) ODOT semi drivers towing the eight (8) 53' ODH trailers
 - two (2) ODOT semi drivers towing two (2) ODH car trailers
 - one (1) ODOT driver pulling the ODOT box truck.
- ODH continues to collaborate on daily RFIs and planning efforts with federal and state stakeholders and ESF-8 partners to provide guidance and direct information.

- Ohio Department of Education

Planned Actions:

- Developing Education Reset and Restart Planning Guide and resources for schools and districts.

- Ohio Mental Health & Addiction Services

Actions Taken:

- Monitored and shared information to state hospitals to minimize potential for virus infections.
- Provided on-site care as needed and determined appropriate by clinical and administrative staff and leadership.

Planned Actions:

- Coordinate and monitor OhioMHAS support to ESF8 as missions or other support is identified in addressing COVID-19 impacts to behavioral health service

11 | Agriculture

Actions Taken

- The Ag Work Group comprised of food supply chain stakeholders met on June 9.
- Meat processing and dairy plants continue to operate.
 - Out-of-state processing plants Ohio producers utilize are also operational. Livestock and other agricultural commodities are stable.
- 85 percent of restaurants have reopened.
 - Sit-down operations are at approximately 50 percent compared to sales from last year.
- The Health and Safety in Processing Plants subcommittee met on June 9 and is continuing work to develop a pilot program to educate processing plant employees on the need, importance and use of PPE.
 - They also discussed and reviewed updated CDC guidance/toolkit.

- ODA continues to work with JFS and ODH to develop and implement a plan to support migrant and seasonal workers as we approach the peak season.

Planned Actions:

- Pork Industry Small Working Group meets Wednesdays at noon.
 - The group will touch base on depopulation plans, resources, outreach/communications plans with local partners.

13 | Law Enforcement

- Ohio State Highway Patrol

Actions Taken:

- Provided perimeter security at the North Central Correctional Institution.
- Provided site security for the Ohio Department of Health.
- Provided security for the Director of the Department of Health and the Director of the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services.
- Assisted the Ohio Department of Natural Resources in patrolling 15 state parks across the state.

Planned Actions:

- The Defiance Post continues to deliver supplies to various locations throughout the county for the Department of Health.
- Provide site security for the Ohio Department of Health.
- Provide perimeter security at the North Central Correctional Institution.
- The Springfield post continues to collect non-perishable food items that will given to the Bethel United Food Pantry, New Carlisle.
- Assist the Ohio Department of Natural Resources in patrolling 15 state parks across the state.

- Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction

Actions Taken:

- ODRC continues to work towards incident objectives.

Planned Actions:

- ODRC has 729 staff COVID-19 positive, 585 staff recovered, 144 active positives and 4 deaths.
- ODRC has 334 incarcerated adults COVID-19 active positive, 4,138 recovered and 76 deaths, 11,358 total tested.
- ODRC has staff and/or inmate COVID-19 positives in 27 of the 28 institutions.
- ODRC has OSHP assisting with Perimeter security at North Central Correctional Institution.

- ODRC has 7 medics from the Ohio National Guard assisting at BeCI.

14 | Recovery & Mitigation

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency

Actions Taken:

- Ohio EMA participated on the County EMA Directors call and continues to provide technical assistance to PA applicants.

Planned Actions:

- Support response as need is identified.

15 | Public Affairs

- Joint Information Center

Actions Taken:

- The virtual JIC pushed messaging on COVID-19 testing sites and updated sector-specific operating guidelines.

Planned Actions:

- Support response as a need is identified.

Other Partners

- Ohio Homeland Security

Actions Taken:

- EPCS:
 - Currently there are 10,617 Active EPCS Credentials.
- OP3:
 - Has a total of 1,911 members representing a total of 1,517 businesses.
 - Attended the Midwest Region state public-private partnership coordinators call. Representatives from Illinois, Minnesota, Wisconsin and FEMA Region 5 participated.
 - Contacted an OP3 partner to get some insight on glove shortages as a follow up to an email from the Ohio Grocers Association.

- Ohio National Guard

Actions Taken:

- 879 Ohio National Guardsmen continue to support the COVID-19 response in Ohio.

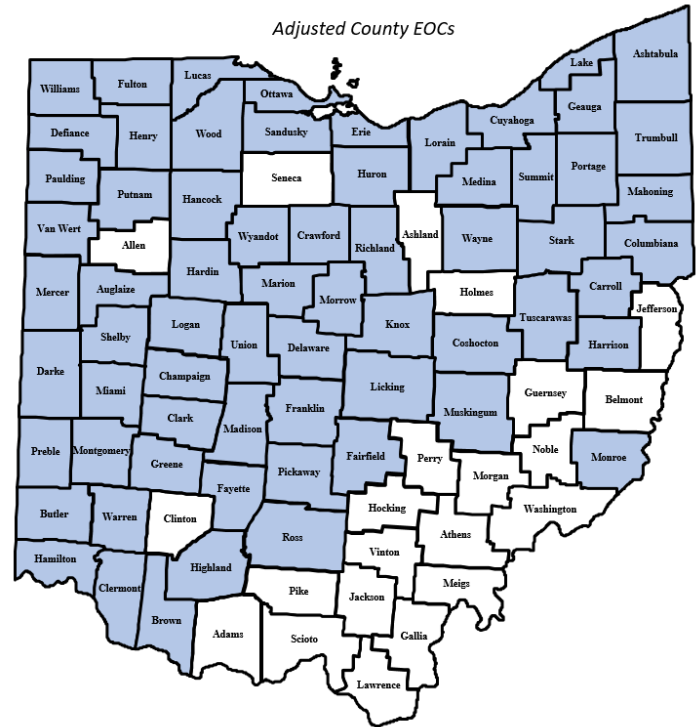
- The sample collection teams supporting ODRC finished their mission Monday, June 8.

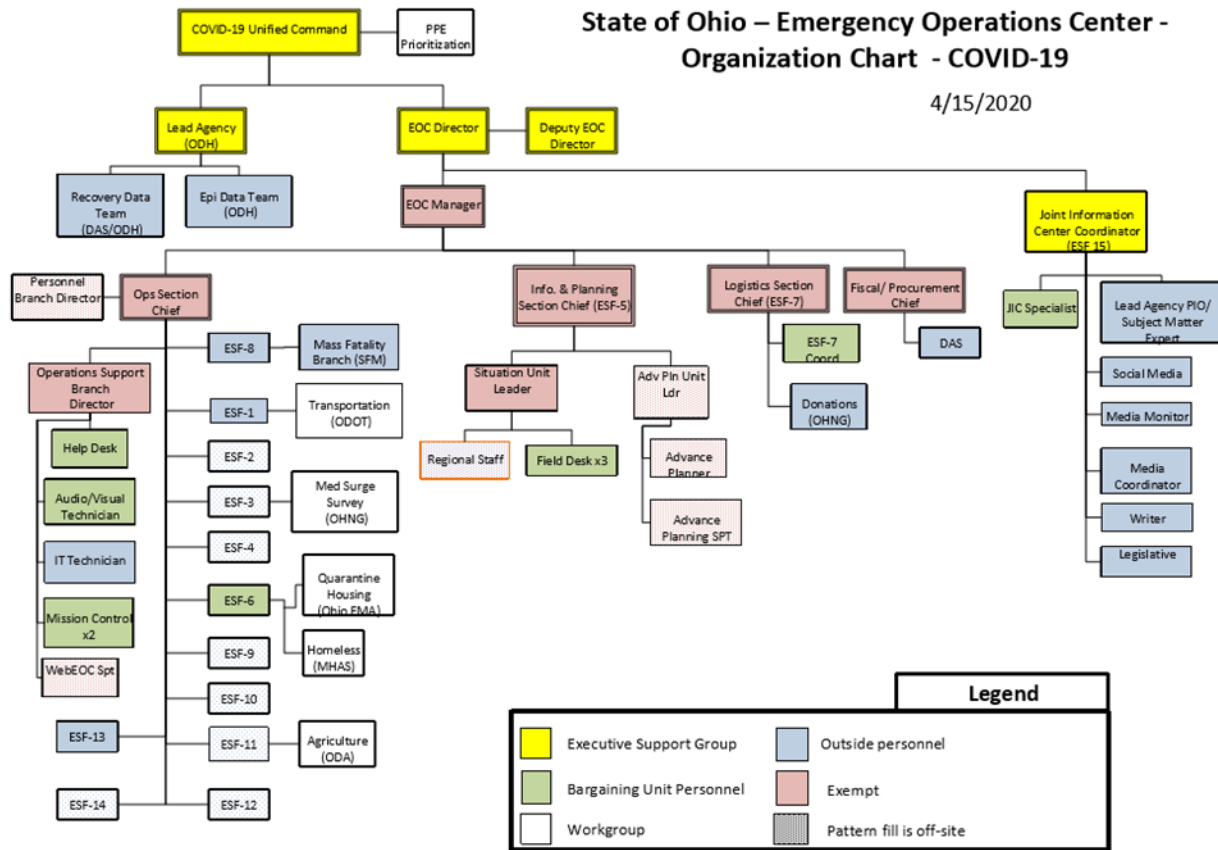
