
Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, ODH reported 413 (39,575) total new cases and 6 (1,714) ICU Admissions were below 21-day averages. 73 (6,693) hospitalizations and 36 (2,457) deaths were above their respective 21-day averages.

ODH reports one additional hotspot identified, which is associated with the general populations in Montgomery and Clark Counties. The State EOC continues to support one previously identified hot spot through an ongoing mission. ODH continues to monitor eight hot spots.

A statewide push of PPE was completed on June 10.

Primary Lifeline

- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase.

Actions Taken:

- ODH was informed of a Strategic National Stockpile (SNS) 2.0 preparatory touch base meeting tomorrow 11 June with states in ASPR/FEMA Region V to better understand any planning, related to state or local stockpiling of PPE in advance of a COVID resurgence, or to replenish supplies.
- The intent of the meeting tomorrow is to have short discussion and lay the foundation for a follow-on session between the national Supply Chain Task Force and state Public Health and EMA directors which is scheduled for Friday June 12, 2020.
- The RSS Warehsoue received five (5) inbound shipments of Swabs, isolation gowns, pulse oximeters, M4RT tubes and cloth face masks.
- The RSS Warehouse deployed five (5) outbounds shipments consisting of the 17th PPE push, specimen collection kits to Summa Hospital and Rocking Horse Nursing Center, biohazard bags to Columbiana County and a Hamilton Star testing system to the ODH lab.
- Provider Gowns were transferred from the Adelaide Warehouse to the RSS
 Warehouse to fill the 18th PPE push.
- RSS Warehouse command participated in the 3rd warehouse management workgroup meeting facilitated by DAS.
- The RFP process will not offer a fast-enough solution to support the RSS COVID-19 response.
- During this operational period ESF-8 Desk has originated two (2) new mission requests today with State Partners.

Continued meeting with community boards and stakeholders. Director Criss

persons to call in and get immediate help through linkage with trained and licensed
behavioral health clinicians. Shared by multiple partners that having this linkage has
saved lives of people who were emotionally overwhelmed by isolation and

- depression of sheltering in place and disruption to ordinary daily lives and routine. CARELINE may remain intact even after this emergency period of continuous response has ended and our new normal continues to unroll.
- OhioMHAS and members of Governor's Minority health Strike Force are completing survey and recommendations for the task force report to the Governor. Timeline for the recommendations have changed so that additional input and information can be gleaned from community members, focus groups and others.

- Outreach with smaller pork producers will be ongoing to ensure appropriate depopulation planning.




