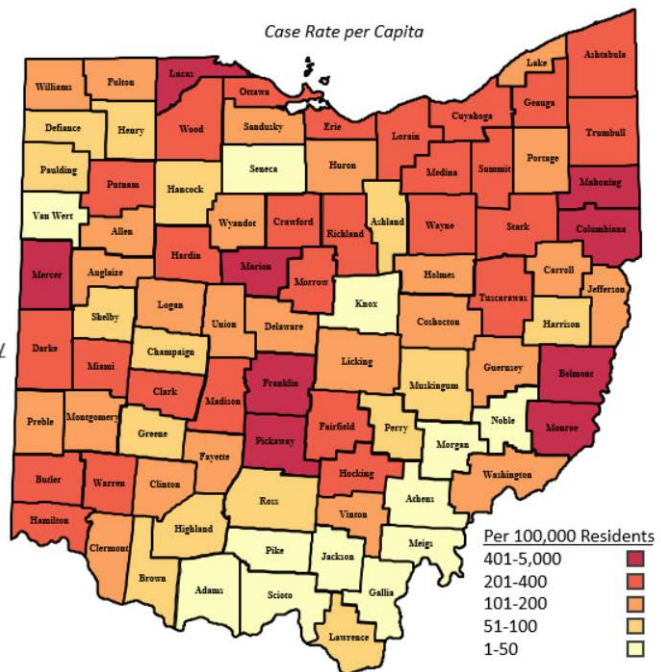
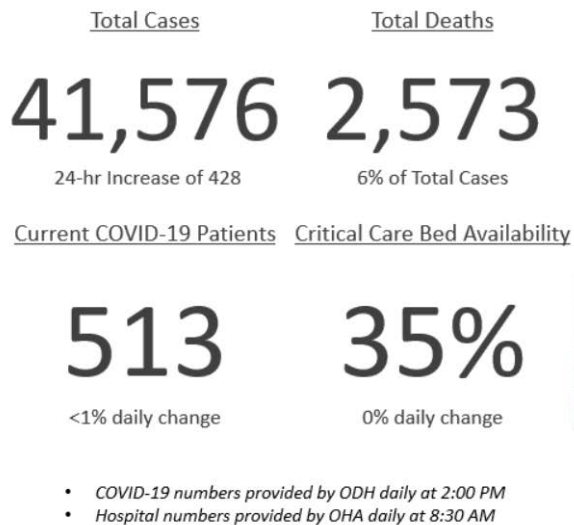
### Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, ODH reported 428 (41,576) total new cases, 53 (6,948) hospitalizations, 14 (1,776) ICU Admissions and 16 (2,573) deaths; all reported metrics were below their respective 21-day averages.

No additional hot spots were identified during clinical zone calls. ODH continues to monitor ten previously identified hot spots.

The EOC executed a statewide push of PPE. State partners are being surveyed on available warehouse space to support the receipt and storage of future PPE stock.

## State Community Lifeline Status

### Primary Lifeline



- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase.
- Statewide bed and ventilator capacity are projected to meet medical forecast needs.
- Forecast PPE needs continue to drive state procurement efforts.
- Limited access to nursing homes & similar facilities continues.
- Personal Protective Equipment, Mass Fatality, and Medical Surge workgroups continue efforts.
- 13 requests for Federal assistance have been submitted and addressed.



- The Agriculture workgroup continues to monitor for issues of concern.
- All major pork processing plants impacting Ohio's processing are operating (statewide & nationally).
- Pork depopulation planning continues on account of processing interruption.
- Restaurants are open per the ODH Dine Safe Ohio Order (current as of May 21)
- Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues.
- [Potential quarantine locations](#) have been identified.
- Homelessness workgroup continues to update plans for response.



- First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19.
- Limited access to jails & detention facilities continues.
- ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across their statewide facilities.



- No current impacts to the lifeline requiring EOC support.

1. Coordinate the State's response to limit COVID-19 spread and maintain Lifeline stability.
2. Provide mission support to identify, prevent, mitigate and respond to COVID-19 hot spots.
3. Develop PPE procurement, warehousing, and allotment strategies to meet current and projected needs.
4. Share timely, clear, and consistent information to the whole community, especially as it pertains to recovery programs.

## 7 | Logistics

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency

*Actions Taken:*

- No new purchases were made today.
- Responded to call for 200 "Euro Pallets" from RSS.
- Continued efforts to distribute FEMA cloth face coverings to the Ohio Association of Food Banks and the Ohio Department of Aging.
- Assisted with delivery of cloth face coverings to other FQHCs.
- Worked with ODPS ACF on donations storage and distribution.
- Two donations are inbound, one from Ford for 30K masks and 1K faceshields, and one from Johnson Electric in Dayton for an indeterminate number of face masks.
- Asking state agencies with warehouse functions if they have any that can fill the need. As of the time of this report none found.
- Received an indeterminate number/type of FEMA PPE at the RSS warehouse.
  - RSS warehouse will report type and quantities as soon as it is verified.
- Working with ODH warehouse on deliveries.
- Controlling approved our remainder appropriation
  - Appropriation will be carried over to FY21 to continue to purchase PPE.

*Planned Actions:*

- Continue working donations and FEMA resource requests.
- Continue reconciling PPE purchases.
- Continue to work with suppliers on their invoices for the deliveries of PPE.

## 8 | Public Health

- Ohio Department of Health
  - Lead Agency for PPE Workgroup
    - Purpose: To determine and allocate appropriate PPE for COVID-19 responders.
  - Lead Agency for Mass Fatality Workgroup
    - Purpose: To assemble stakeholders within mass fatality/fatality management to develop statewide strategies & unified effort in the management of decedents.
  - Lead Agency for Medical Surge Workgroup

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- Purpose: Planning for needs to address forecast Medical Surge needs.

*Actions Taken:*

- The 18th PPE Push of 207 pallets containing gowns, surgical masks and thermometers to 87 primary county drop sites was carried out.
- ESF-8 participated in the ESF7/ESF8 Touch point where discussion was about the 18th PPE Push, the FQHC RnL Push and potential Cloth Mask push for next week.
- The RSS Warehouse received a shipment of five (5) pallets containing 965 boxes (69,480 eaches) of FEMA VTM tubes at 8:37AM via UPS.
- During this operational period ESF-8 Desk has not initiated any mission requests today with State Partners.

*Planned Actions:*

- ESF-8 will continue to collaborate on daily RFIs and planning efforts with federal and state stakeholders and ESF-8 partners to provide guidance and direct information.

- Ohio Department of Aging & Long Term Care Ombudsman

*Actions Taken:*

- The Ombudsman Office facilitated the state's interagency transition team to plan for the possibility of assisting residents of a Franklin County nursing home to move if the home does not correct infection control deficiencies.
  - The home has an on-going immediate jeopardy citation from ODH.

*Planned Actions:*

- State Ombudsman will participate in the nursing home testing debrief. ESF-8 Partner Meeting.

- Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities

*Actions Taken:*

- Outdoor visitations occurred over the weekend at the State operated Developmental Centers.
- In response to the evolving situation regarding COVID-19 and the shift in priorities to ensure health and safety, the mandatory National Core Indicators Staff Stability Survey deadline has been extended to July 31, 2020.
- Providers delivering center-based day services at group sizes in accordance with the order from the Ohio Department of Health can now bill new waiver service codes that reflect changes in field practices that support safe center-based service delivery.

*Planned Actions:*

- Continue to monitor DODD system statistics, including positive, pending, and negative cases of COVID-19 for staff and residents.
- Continue to track daily inventory and usage of PPE for the Developmental Centers.

- Ohio Emergency Medical Services

*Actions Taken:*

- Participated in the daily conference call regarding PPE procurement and distribution.
- Participated on the ODH Zone 1 Regions 1, 2 & 5 daily call.
- Participated on the ODH Zone 2 Regions 4, 7 & 8 daily call.
- Participated on the ODH Zone 3 Regions 3 & 6 daily call.

*Planned Actions:*

- Continue to identify hot spots and plan ahead for transportation needs.
- Continue to monitor the needs of EMS providers and first responders in the state.

## 13 | Law Enforcement

*Actions Taken:*

- Providing site security for the Ohio Department of Health.
- Provided security for the Director of the Ohio Department of Health and the Director of the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services.

- Assisted the Ohio Department of Natural Resources in patrolling 15 state parks across the state.

*Planned Actions:*

- Providing site security for the Ohio Department of Health. Collecting non-perishable food items to be distributed to local food banks.
- Distributing prepackaged “Grab & Go” food bags for Van Wert County Families.
- Picking up cleaned N95 mask from Battelle for first responders.

## 14 | Recovery & Mitigation

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency
  - The FEMA Public Assistance (PA) is declared for COVID-19.
    - There are currently 705 applicants
    - This is an increase of 3 from June 12.
  - FEMA improved functionality in their grants management system over the weekend and Ohio EMA can now also see projects that have yet to be submitted by applicants.
    - Therefore, there was a 27 project increase from last week, Ohio is up to 50.
    - FEMA has awarded \$12.3 million in costs.

*Actions Taken:*

- Ohio EMA participated in a call with OMHAS regarding how the Crisis Counseling funds will be sent to them from Ohio EMA and documentation requirements.

*Planned Actions:*

- Support response as a need is identified.

## Other Partners

- Ohio National Guard

*Actions Taken:*

- 497 guardsmen continue to support the food bank missions around the state.
- Two Guardsmen are working as specialists in ODH labs.
- 138 members are on Specimen Collection teams.
- 22 soldiers support the state RSS warehouse.
- The Ohio National Guard completed the medical support mission at Belmont Correctional Institution on Sunday, 14 June.

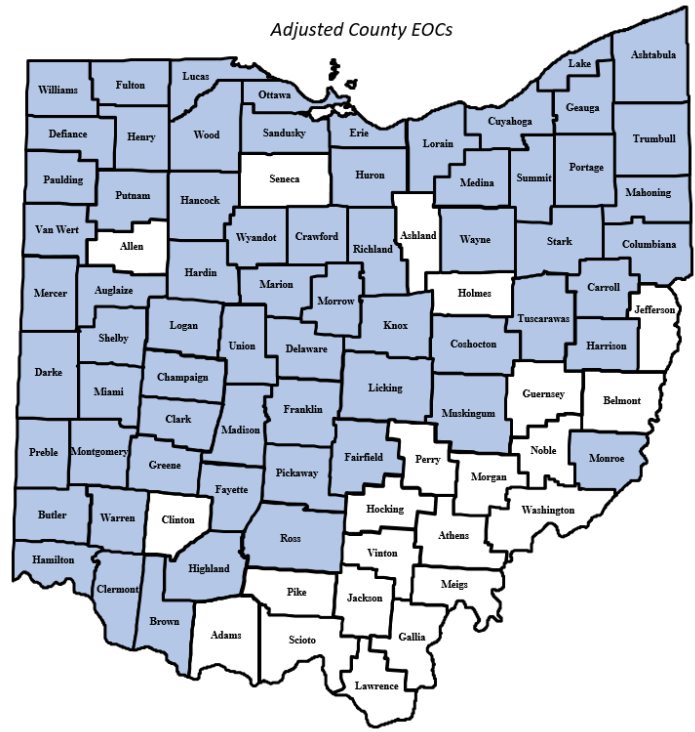
*Planned Actions:*

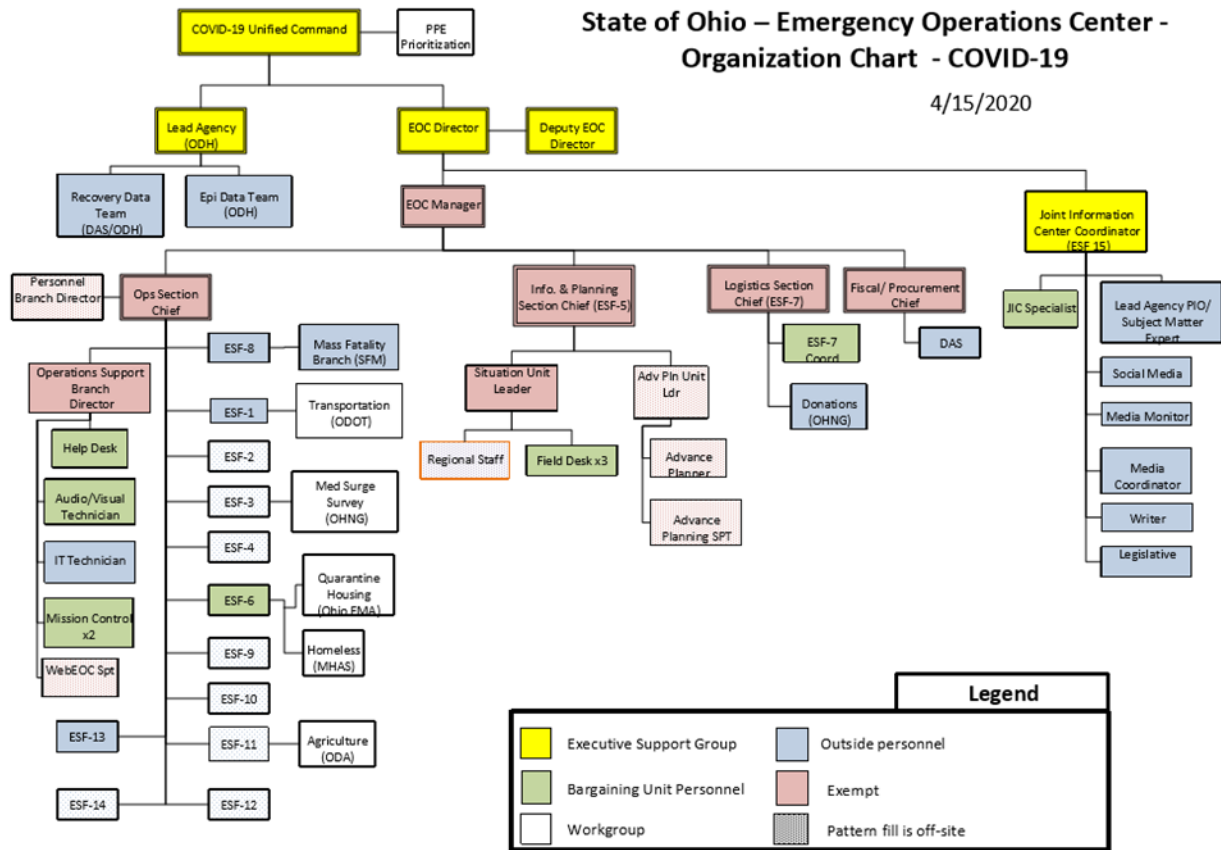
