Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, ODH reported 590 (46,127) total new cases, 31 (2,735) deaths, 87 (7,379) hospitalizations, and 24 (1,876) ICU Admissions. All were above their respective 21-day averages.

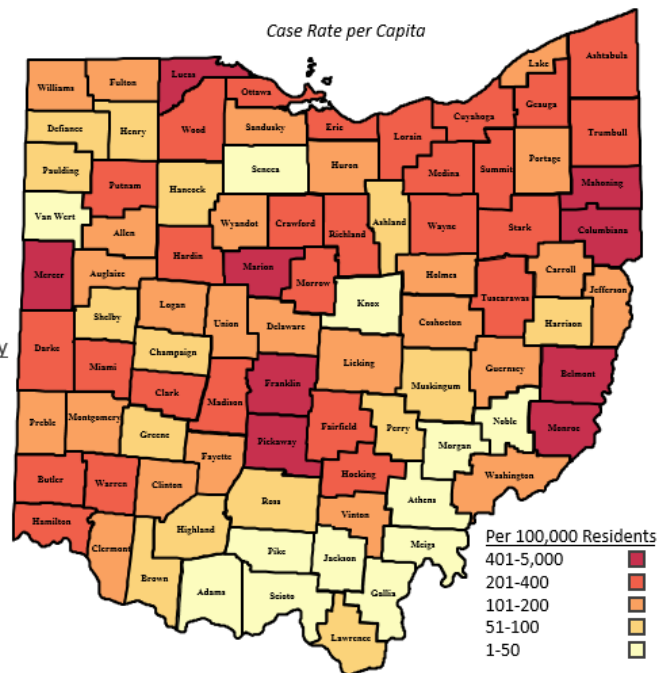
In the last 24-hours, two new hotspots have been identified by the Ohio Department of Health. A juvenile detention center in Cuyahoga County is reporting multiple symptomatic inmates from a single house within the facility. A company in Montgomery County has positively identified cases among workers; they are conducting facility wide testing.

The EOC executed a statewide push of PPE. State stockpiling and storage strategies continue to be developed through ESF-7 and the State EOC Unified Command

Primary Lifeline



- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase.
- Statewide bed and ventilator capacity are projected to meet medical forecast needs.
- Forecast PPE needs continue to drive state procurement efforts.
- Limited access to nursing homes & similar facilities continues.
- Personal Protective Equipment, Mass Fatality, and Medical Surge workgroups continue efforts.
- 13 requests for Federal assistance have been submitted and addressed.



- The Agriculture workgroup continues to monitor for issues of concern.
- All major pork processing plants impacting Ohio's processing are operating (statewide & nationally).
- Pork depopulation planning continues on account of processing interruption.
- Restaurants are open per the ODH Dine Safe Ohio Order (current as of May 21)
- Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues.
- [Potential quarantine locations](#) have been identified.
- Homelessness workgroup continues to update plans for response.



- First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19.
- Limited access to jails & detention facilities continues.
- ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across their statewide facilities.



- No current impacts to the lifeline requiring EOC support.

1. Coordinate the State’s response to limit COVID-19 spread and maintain Lifeline stability.
2. Provide mission support to identify, prevent, mitigate and respond to COVID-19 hot spots.
3. Develop PPE procurement, warehousing, and allotment strategies to meet current and projected needs.

7 | Logistics

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency

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Actions Taken:

- Received the final shipment of 320,050 disposable gowns from FEMA against the PPE RRF. That RRF is closed and no further shipments of PPE from FEMA are due in.
- Took over coordinating inbound shipments of purchased PPE from RSS and contacted shippers to schedule and coordinate deliveries beginning on June 25 at the Expo Center. Confirmed 17 truckloads of gowns from Gentox are inbound.
- Coordinated with ONG to begin warehouse operations at the Ohio Expo Center on Thursday, June 25. The Expo Center warehouse is scheduled to function until July 31. Both of the ODH warehouses and the back up warehouses at DAS GSD and ODPS ACF are at capacity.
- Continue to reconcile the en route PPE.
- No new purchases made.

Planned Actions:

- Keep working Expo warehousing and coordinating inbound shipments of PPE and equipment purchased.

8 | Public Health

- Ohio Department of Health
 - Lead Agency for PPE Workgroup
 - Purpose: To determine and allocate appropriate PPE for COVID-19 responders.
 - Lead Agency for Mass Fatality Workgroup
 - Purpose: To assemble stakeholders within mass fatality/fatality management to develop statewide strategies & unified effort in the management of decedents.
 - Lead Agency for Medical Surge Workgroup
 - Purpose: Planning for needs to address forecast Medical Surge needs.

Actions Taken:

- ESF-8 Participated in the FEMA/LNO call where we discussed PPE RRFs, unpalletized PPE causative research, queried potential immunization framework, guidance and current information, queried if there is a next LTC PPE push and queried if there is a next Remdesivir shipment in near future.
- ESF-8 conducted an ESF-8 Partner touchpoint this afternoon.
- The Adelaide warehouse received 36 truckloads on 6/22/2 and is at 100% capacity until can be forklifts charged and the inventory consolidated.
- The RSS warehouse has received three (3) inbound shipments of VTM, bags, labels, 3D swabs, M4RT tubes, and research ready reagents.
- The Adelaide warehouse has received four (4) inbound shipments of isolation gowns.
- During this operational period ESF-8 Desk has initiated one (1) mission requests with State partners.

- ODM/ODH conducted a webinar today for nursing facilities to address testing processes and provide information about the ongoing COVID efforts.
- ODH staff from the Bureau of Survey and Certification, the Bureau of Regulatory Operations, Health Equity, and the Bureau of Health Preparedness met today with representatives from DODD, MHAS, Ohio EMA and the Ombudsman's Office to discuss PPE needs for Disability Rights Ohio (DRO). The group recommended that DRO be connected with PPE vendors to support their direct acquisition of PPE. The group further recommended that the State of Ohio be available to bridge gaps in PPE accessibility when the supply chain cannot meet their needs. These recommendations will be presented the PPE Executive Team tomorrow, for final determinations.

Planned Actions:

- Mission establishment and tracking.
- Ohio Mental Health and Addiction Services

Actions Taken:

- Providing PPE recommendations for vulnerable populations including those in congregate housing and homeless shelters, disabled, elderly and other vulnerable populations.

Planned Actions:

- OhioMHAS continues to participate as member of Minority Health Strike Force resource committee. Addressing issues of health equity and disparity through state planning initiatives with ODH community and state agency partners.

- Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities

Actions Taken:

- Participated in ESF-8 Partner Touchpoint meeting.

Planned Actions:

- Continue to monitor DODD system statistics, including positive, pending, and negative cases of COVID-19 for staff and residents.
- Continue to track daily inventory and usage of PPE for the Developmental Centers.

Planned Actions:

- ODRC has 766 staff COVID-19 positive, 677 staff recovered, 89 active positives and 5 deaths ODRC has 219 incarcerated adults COVID-19 active positive, 4,160 recovered and 76 deaths, 13,539 total tested ODRC has staff and/or inmate COVID-19 positives in 28 of the 28 institutions – the last institution experienced a staff positive on June 21, 2020 ODRC doesn't have any current missions.

14 | Recovery & Mitigation

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency

- Ohio EMA participated on the County conference call.
- The FEMA Public Assistance (PA) Program is approved for COVID-19.
 - There are currently 714 applicants, an increase of 3 from June 19.
 - 58 projects have been submitted, an increase of 8 from June 19.

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- FEMA has awarded \$22.8 million, an increase of \$0 from June 19.

Planned Actions:

- Ohio EMA continues to provide technical assistance to PA applicants.

15 | Public Information

Actions Taken:

- ODH has purchased TV advertising in support of wearing masks to protect ourselves and each other.
- Gov. DeWine, the First Lady and Lt. Gov. Husted were administered COVID-19 tests by the ONG to show the importance of testing; COVID-19 pop-up testing sites are being emphasized.

Planned Actions:

- Preparing messaging as needed.

Other Partners

- Ohio National Guard

Actions Taken:

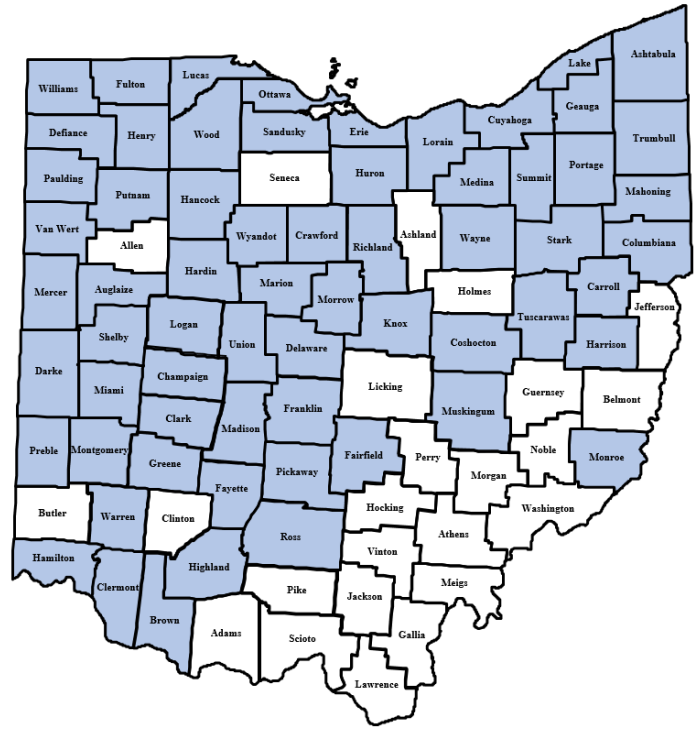
- 4395 COVID samples were taken in 8 different counties.
- The ONG and the Ohio Association of Food Banks are working together to transition operations to civilian workforce by August 7, 2020.
- 493 guardsmen support 14 food bank missions.
- 21 soldiers support the state RSS warehouse.
- 2 Guardsmen are working as specialists in ODH labs.
- 188 members are on Specimen Collection teams.
- 856 Ohio National Guardsmen continue to support the COVID-19 response in Ohio.

Planned Actions:

- COVID sample collection activities continue at 33 sites around the state.
- The Ohio National Guard will begin a new mission on June 24, supporting overflow PPE warehouse operations at the Ohio Expo Center until July 31.

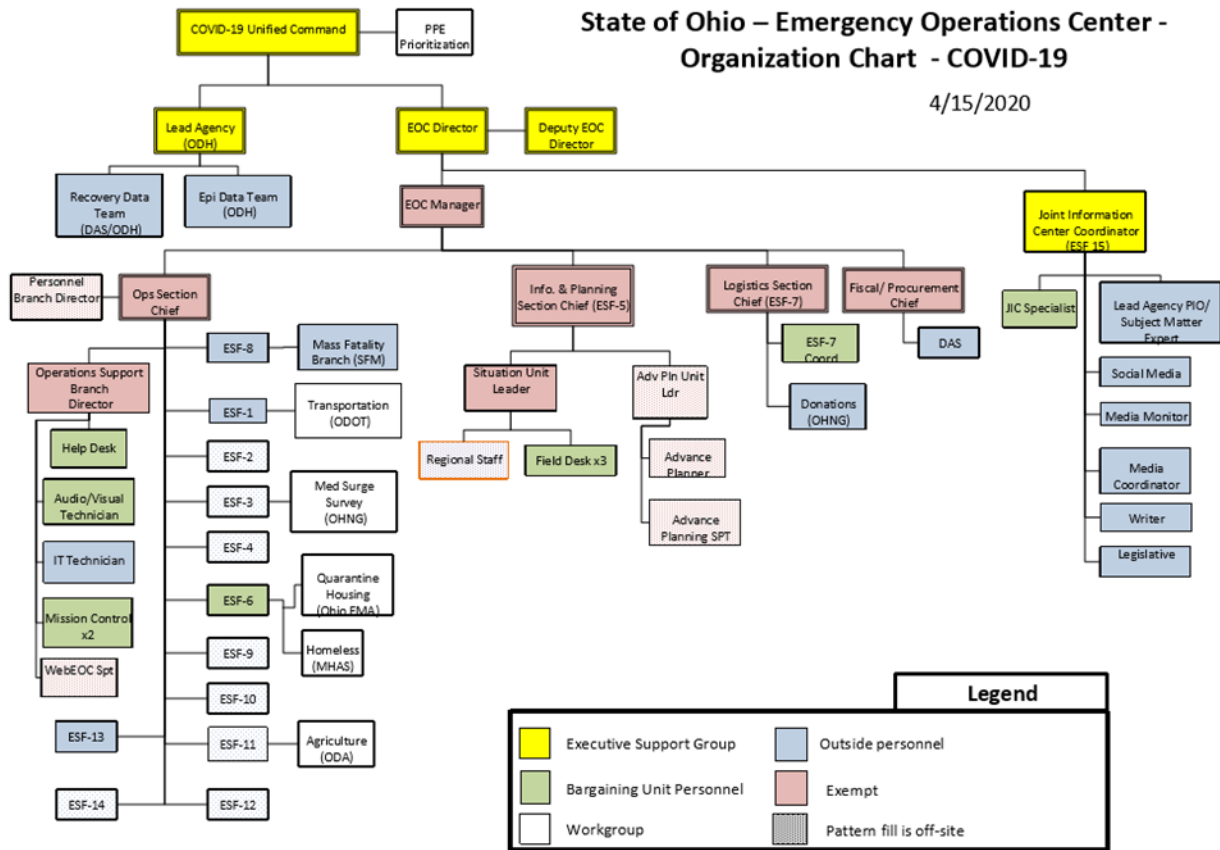
