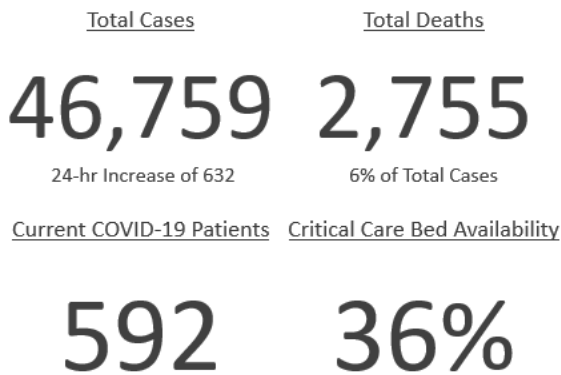
### Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, ODH reported 632 (46,759) total new cases, and 68 (7,447) hospitalizations, both above their respective 21-day averages. There were 10 (1,886) ICU Admissions, and 20 (2,755) deaths, both below their respective 21-day averages.

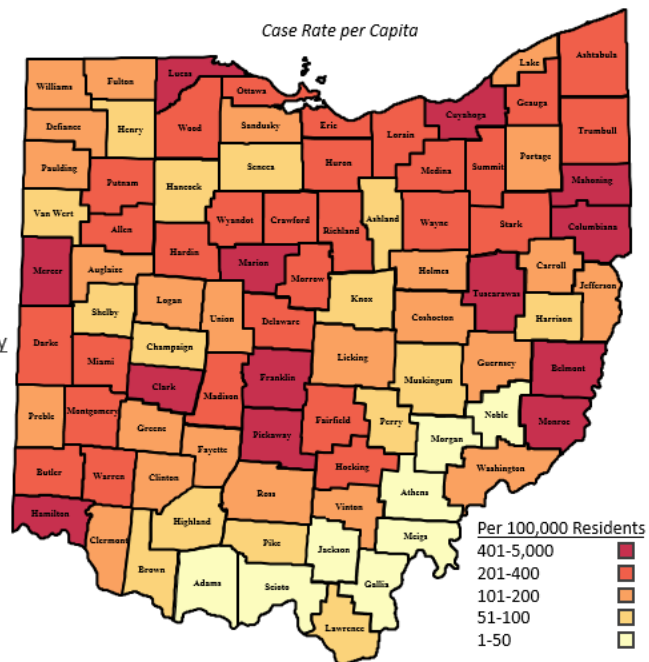
In the last 24-hours, three new hotspots have been identified by the Ohio Department of Health. Trumbull Correctional Institute is currently experience an increase of cases in staff and inmate population. The situation appears stable and there are no concerns from the hospital with regards to surge capacity. Additionally, there are two facilities in Montgomery County, a congregate care facility and a learning center, which has cases amongst staff and residents.

The next PPE push will occur on Monday, June 29. State stockpiling and storage strategies continue to be developed through ESF-7 and the State EOC Unified Command

## State Community Lifeline Status

### Primary Lifeline



- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase.
- Statewide bed and ventilator capacity are projected to meet medical forecast needs.
- Forecast PPE needs continue to drive state procurement efforts.
- Limited access to nursing homes & similar facilities continues.
- Personal Protective Equipment, Mass Fatality, and Medical Surge workgroups continue efforts.
- 13 requests for Federal assistance have been submitted and addressed.

- All major pork processing plants impacting Ohio's processing are operating (statewide & nationally).
- Pork depopulation planning continues on account of processing interruption.
- Restaurants are open per the ODH Dine Safe Ohio Order (current as of May 21)

- Homelessness workgroup continues to update plans for response.



- First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19.
- Limited access to jails & detention facilities continues.
- ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across their statewide facilities.



- No current impacts to the lifeline requiring EOC support.



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## State EOC Objectives

1. Coordinate the State’s response to limit COVID-19 spread and maintain Lifeline stability.
2. Provide mission support to identify, prevent, mitigate and respond to COVID-19 hot spots.
3. Develop PPE procurement, warehousing, and allotment strategies to meet current and projected needs.
4. Share timely, clear, and consistent information to the whole community, especially as it pertains to recovery programs.

## State EOC Actions by Emergency Support Function

### 3 | Engineering/Public Works

- Ohio Department of Natural Resources  
*Planned Actions:*
  - Ohio was asked by FEMA on whether the State or local municipalities are testing wastewater for COVID-19.
  - Ohio is using federal CARES funding for COVID-19 testing of wastewater.
- Ohio Environmental Protection Agency  
*Actions Taken:*
  - Ohio requested and received controlling board approval to use federal CARES funding for COVID-19 testing of wastewater.
  - Ohio EPA and Ohio Department of Health are working with OSU, Kent State, and Toledo to sample wastewater treatment plants to determine if COVID RNA testing can predict illnesses.
  - Additionally, USEPA Office of Research and Development is conducting testing in the southwest portion of the state. This grant will look at methodology development and modeling to determine illness predictions.
  - This CARES funding must be utilized by December 30, 2020

*Actions Taken:*
  - No new missions.

*Planned Actions:*
  - Continue to monitor EOC for mission requests.
  - Assist ESF partners as needed.

  - Internal COVID-19 committee meeting.
  - No significant changes to fire & EMS staffing survey.  
*Planned Actions:*
  - Will continue to monitor the staffing needs survey.

### 5 | Information & Planning

*Planned Actions:*

- Support County EOCs and continue working with state agency partners as necessary (via deployment or virtual means).

## 7 | Logistics

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency

*Actions Taken:*

- Received the final shipment of 320,050 disposable gowns from FEMA against the PPE RRF. That RRF is closed and no further shipments of PPE from FEMA are due in.
- Took over coordinating inbound shipments of purchased PPE from RSS and contacted shippers to schedule and coordinate deliveries beginning on June 25 at the Expo Center. Confirmed 17 truckloads of gowns from Gentox are inbound.
- Coordinated with ONG to begin warehouse operations at the Ohio Expo Center on Thursday, June 25. The Expo Center warehouse is scheduled to function until July 31. Both of the ODH warehouses and the back up warehouses at DAS GSD and ODPS ACF are at capacity.
- Continue to reconcile the en route PPE.
- No new purchases made.
- Contacting suppliers to see if they will be filling their orders. If not then we will be canceling their purchase orders.
- Working with OBM and DPS CFO to prepare controlling board request for 7/13 hearing date.

*Planned Actions:*

- Keep working Expo warehousing and coordinating inbound shipments of PPE and equipment purchased.

## 8 | Public Health

- Ohio Department of Health
  - Lead Agency for PPE Workgroup
    - Purpose: To determine and allocate appropriate PPE for COVID-19 responders.

- Lead Agency for Mass Fatality Workgroup
  - Purpose: To assemble stakeholders within mass fatality/fatality management to develop statewide strategies & unified effort in the management of decedents.
- Lead Agency for Medical Surge Workgroup
  - Purpose: Planning for needs to address forecast Medical Surge needs.

*Actions Taken:*

- ODH conducted its weekly local health department call today where the following topics were discussed:
  - Ohio Department of Education K-12 Guidance that continues to remain under development, HHS cloth mask project that will be available on a first come first serve basis for government agencies to order, Hospital and Nursing home PPE virtual inventory process, and the developing COVID 19 risk management system.
- The 20th PPE Push is being planned for Monday, June 29<sup>th</sup>.
- ESF-8 and Ohio EMA completed an RFI from FEMA by providing information regarding COVID-19 wastewater testing.
- During this operational period ESF-8 Desk has initiated two (2) mission requests today with State partners and closed twenty (20) missions today.

*Planned Actions:*

- ESF-8 Partner Touch point.
- FEMA/HHS LNO Call.
- Great Lakes Health Partnership Call.
- CDC COVID-19: Public Health Touchbase – Call.
- ODH continues to collaborate on daily RFIs and planning efforts with federal and state stakeholders and ESF-8 partners to provide guidance and direct information.

- Ohio Mental Health and Addiction Services

*Actions Taken:*

- Monitoring hospitals and continuously assessing potentials for unexpected virus infection Working with community behavioral health boards and providers of services to identify and address potential virus infections to residents in congregate housing, homeless shelter or other supported housing environments.
- Ongoing Monitoring and Assessing hospitals and community sites in coordination with local health departments, NF's and behavioral health boards and provider agencies.
- Monitoring supplies on hand and assessing need based on availability and need based on increased rates of infection and numbers potentially impacted including, patients, staff, and community provider agency partners.

- Share timely, clear, and consistent information to staffs, regional hospitals and community partners on COVID related issues of concern as it becomes available.

*Planned Actions:*

- Share timely, clear, and consistent information to the whole community.

- Ohio Emergency Medical Services

*Actions Taken:*

- Participated on the ODH Zone 1 Regions 1, 2 & 5 daily call.
- Participated on the ODH Zone 2 Regions 4, 7 & 8 daily call.
- Participated on the ODH Zone 3 Regions 3 & 6 daily call.
- Received a report from an ambulance service in Zone 3 reporting that they needed to go to temporary minimum staffing (one EMT rather than the required 2) during patient transports due to staff being off work due to illness, quarantining, or not willing to work.
- Did not report any staff COVID positive. The ambulance service will notify us when they return to normal staffing.

*Planned Actions:*

- Continue to look hot spots and plan ahead for transportation needs. We continue to monitor the needs of EMS providers and first responders in the state

- The Pork Industry Small Work Group met today. (The group does not meet next week as mistakenly reported yesterday.) There are no significant disruptions to report.

*Planned Actions:*

- The group is working to organize a depopulation exercise to ensure the most appropriate actions and supports are prepared.

### 13 | Law Enforcement

- Ohio State Highway Patrol

*Actions Taken:*

- Provided sited security for the Ohio Department of Health.
- Transported cleaned N95 masks from Battelle.

*Planned Actions:*

- Assisting the PATH Center in Defiance with meal deliveries.
- Delivering meals for the Sandusky County Food Bank.
- Collecting non-perishable food items for local food banks.
- Distributing food and assisting with traffic control at the Shiloh Plymouth Food Pantry in Richland County.

- Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction

*Actions Taken:*

- Working towards incident objectives.

*Planned Actions:*

- Has 769 staff COVID-19 positive, 680 staff recovered, 89 active positives and 5 deaths.
- Has 120 incarcerated adults COVID-19 active positive, 4,258 recovered and 76 deaths, 13,703 total tested ODRC has staff and/or inmate COVID-19 positives in 28 of the 28 institutions – the last institution experienced a staff positive on June 21, 2020.
- Continues to have hot spots with staff and inmate positive COVID-19.

### 14 | Recovery & Mitigation

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency

The FEMA Public Assistance (PA) Program is declared for COVID-19. There are currently 715 applicant, an increase of 1 from June 23. 61 project have been submitted, an increase of 3 from June 23. FEMA has awarded \$22.8 million, same as June 23.

*Actions Taken:*

- Continues to provide technical assistance to applicants.

*Planned Actions:*

- Will participate in calls with hospitals and the County EMA Directors.

### *Actions Taken:*

- COVID-19 Minority Health Testing
- Pop-Up Testing Sites available today in Portsmouth (Scioto County), and Xenia (Greene County); Pop-Up Testing Sites available in Lancaster (Fairfield County), and Columbus (Franklin County), June 25 and 26

### *Planned Actions:*

- Support response as needed.

## Other Partners

- Ohio National Guard

### *Actions Taken:*

- 4976 COVID samples were taken in 13 different counties.
- The ONG and the Ohio Association of Food Banks are working together to transition operations to civilian workforce by August 7, 2020.
- 21 soldiers support the state RSS warehouse.
- 2 Guardsmen are working as specialists in ODH labs.
- 187 members are on Specimen Collection teams.
- 493 guardsmen support 14 food bank missions.
- 865 Ohio National Guardsmen support the COVID-19 response in Ohio.

### *Planned Actions:*

- COVID sample collection activities continue at 35 sites around the state.
- The Ohio National Guard will begin a new mission on June 25, supporting overflow PPE warehouse operations at the Ohio Expo Center until July 31<sup>st</sup>.

### *Actions Taken:*

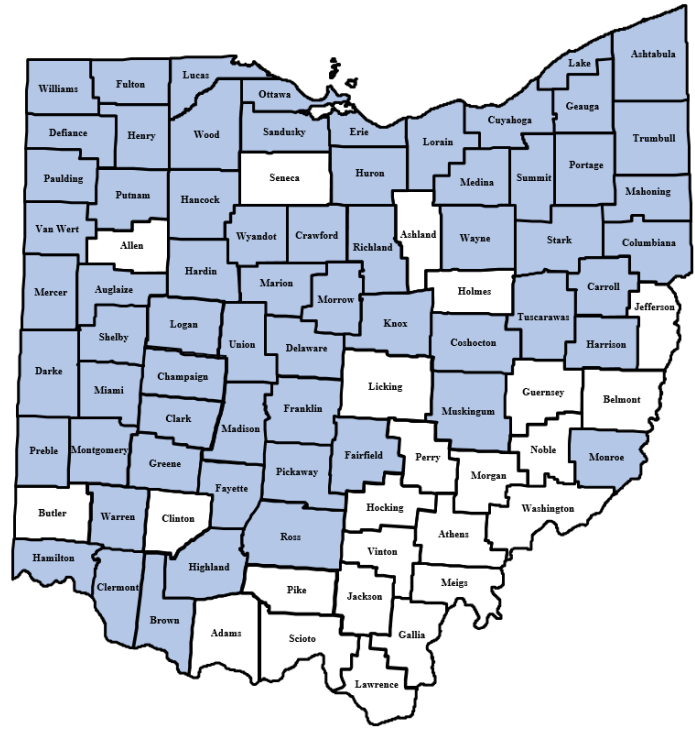
- EPCS:
  - Currently there are 10,622 Active EPCS Credentials.
  - Coordinating with DPS IT and OP3 to extend the EPCS credentials to partners until August 1, 2020. As of Wednesday 6/24 at noon, all credentials have been extended in the system. Users will need to go into the system to reprint their credentials with the new expiration date of August 1. An email was sent to all users notifying them of this change.
- OP3:
  - Currently there are a total of 1,916 members representing a total of 1,513 businesses.
  - The following notifications were sent to partners:

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- COVID-19 UPDATE: Public Awareness Campaigns, Fireworks, Criminal Justice Grants.
- COVID-19 UPDATE: Case Increases in Children and in Southwest Ohio, PPE Readiness Stockpile, Good Cause, OhioMeansJobs, Resuming Sports Phase II.
  - Attended the Midwest Region state public-private partnership coordinators call. Representatives from Illinois, Indiana, Minnesota, Michigan, Wisconsin and FEMA Region 5 participated.
  - Continuing to work with ESF7 to locate pallets and shipping boxes.
- Critical Infrastructure:
  - Received several SkyWatch Tower request cancellations since summer events that were originally postponed are being cancelled.
  - Participating in Agriculture Work Group calls to discuss impacts from COVID-19 to the agriculture sector, such as animal depopulation status, meat packing facility operations, and crop growth.
  - Participating in a separate Agriculture Roundtable Discussion conference call.
  - Participating in a conference call for drug shortages and other medical supply chain issues for Clark Co & Region 3 – Ohio.

  - Continuing to monitor protests related to COVID-19 and now riots.
  - Participating in weekly protest related calls and receiving daily reports

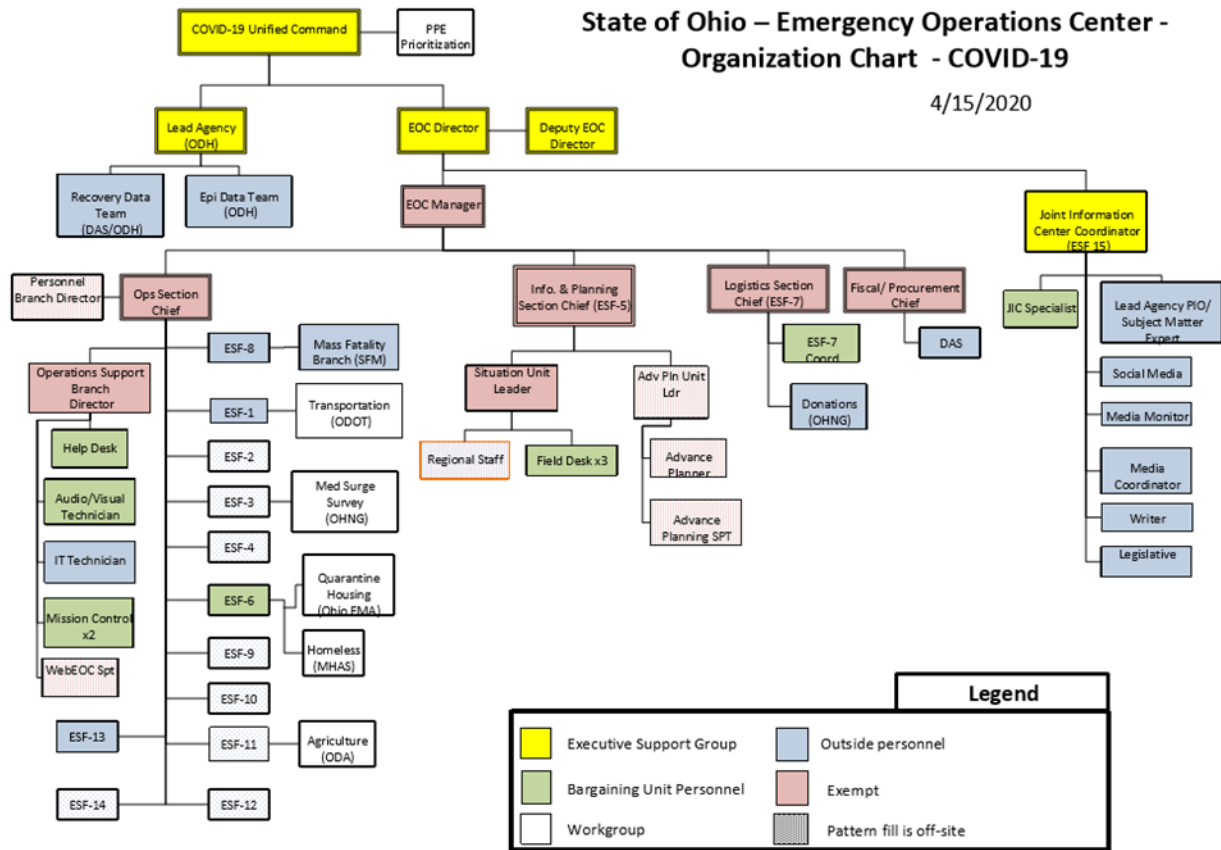
