
Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 892 (47,651) total new cases, which was above 21-day averages. The 55 (7,502) hospitalizations, 11 (1,897) ICU Admissions, and 17 (2,772) deaths were each below their respective 21-day averages.

In the last 24-hours, two new hotspots have been identified by ODH. In Lawrence County, a facility for foster youth had a COVID+ employee. The facility is working with their local hospital and health department to test all residents and staff. Additionally, ODH has identified that the SW region continues to be closely monitored as case counts continue to increase in Butler, Clermont, Hamilton, and Warren Counties.

The next PPE push will occur on Monday, June 29. State stockpiling and storage strategies continue to be developed through ESF-7 and the State EOC Unified Command

- Working with suppliers on receiving PPE.


