### **Current Situation:**

Public Health – Dayton & Montgomery County, the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and World Health Organization (WHO) are closely monitoring an outbreak of respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus (termed "COVID-19") first identified in Wuhan City, Hubei Province, China in December 2019 and which continues to expand.

## **Current Updates:**

- MOST IMPORTANT MESSAGE OF THE DAY: DO EVERYTHING YOU CAN TO CONSERVE PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE).
- Globally the World now has 6,245,352 cases and 376,427 deaths from COVID-19.
- Public Health conducted specimen collection over the last three business days at congregant locations identified as hotspots.
- Public Health will conduct additional specimen collection this coming Thursday and Friday collecting nearly 700 samples.
- Public Health continues to plan for specimen collection at other hotspots within Montgomery County.
- The Ohio National Guard is working with state representation to identify nursing homes for the initial testing of staff and residents if needed.
- The county received more Strategic National Stockpile (SNS) deliveries on Monday and another delivery is projected to arrive tomorrow.
- PPE is available for medical and response organizations from the county drop-site. There is an abundance of N-95's, surgical masks, gloves and face-shields. Requests for PPE can be made through the following link: <u>https://surveys.phdmc.org/s3/COVID-19-EOC-Resource-Request</u>




- Direct shipment of SNS deliveries to nursing homes has only reached about 10% of those locations. Information provided by the state project most of these arriving by June 9, 2020.
- Public Health continues to meet weekly with the University of Dayton to discuss planning issues for the summer as well as the fall.
- Public Health continues to facilitate conference calls with congregate locations within the county.
- Public Health staff are responding to roughly 60 to 70 complaints a week from businesses.

- The Public Health COVID-19 informational phone line remains open Monday through Friday to answer general questions. The info line is 937-225-6217.
- ODH information line remains open, the number is 1-833-4-ASK-ODH and is open seven days a week.
- Public Health continues to monitor all sources (ODH, CDC, WHO, European Center for Disease and Prevention and Control (ECOC) for the latest information.
- Public Health maintains its one-week operational period for this response.
- Public Health will continue to share the situational report with other local health departments, Montgomery County Emergency Management, Greater Dayton Area Hospital Association and Dayton Metropolitan Medical Response System partners.

CDC Update (Situation in the US):

CDC is closely monitoring an outbreak of respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus named COVID-19. The outbreak first started in Wuhan, China, but cases have been identified in a growing number of other <u>international locations</u>, including the United States. CDC will update the following U.S. map daily. Information regarding the number of people under investigation will be updated daily.





### **CDC Response Updates:**

#### Level 3 Travel Health Notice: Widespread ongoing transmission with restrictions on entry to the United States

CDC recommends that travelers avoid all nonessential travel to the following destinations. Most foreign nationals who have been in one of these countries during the previous 14 days will not be allowed to enter the United States.

- <u>China</u>
- Iran
- Most European Countries
- United Kingdom and Ireland

Level 3 Travel Health Notice: Widespread ongoing transmission without restrictions on entry to the United States

CDC recommends that travelers avoid all nonessential travel to all global destinations:

<u>Global Pandemic Notice</u>

#### Level 2 Travel Health Notice: Ongoing community transmission

CDC recommends that older adults and people of any age with serious chronic medical conditions should consider postponing nonessential travel to most global destinations.

#### Level 1 Travel Health Notice: Limited community transmission

CDC recommends travelers practice usual health precautions recommended for their destination.

### World Health Organization Update:

During the 1 June media briefing, WHO Director-General Dr Tedros highlighted that the COVID-19 pandemic has led to disruptions in services for treatment of non-communicable diseases in many countries. The COVID-19 response must be inclusive of the healthcare needs of people living with these diseases.

WHO has published a new operational guidance on maintaining essential health services, which provides recommendations for practical actions that countries can take at national, sub-regional and local levels to reorganize and safely maintain access to high-quality, essential health services during the pandemic.

Transporting COVID-19 medical supplies to those in need requires timely decision-making and trouble-shooting skills. The Regional Office for the Eastern Mediterranean document a week in the life of logistics expert coordinating massive shipments of medical supplies to Yemen.

WHO's support to countries in securing medical products for COVID-19 treatment is highlighted in the 'Subject in Focus' below.






# Cases & Deaths by Jurisdiction


34 jurisdictions report more than 10,000 cases of COVID-19.
