Current Situation:

Public Health – Dayton & Montgomery County, the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and World Health Organization (WHO) are closely monitoring an outbreak of respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus (termed "COVID-19") first identified in Wuhan City, Hubei Province, China in December 2019 and which continues to expand.

Current Updates:

- Globally the World now has 7,069,278 cases and 405,587 deaths from COVID-19.
- Public Health conducted sample specimen collection at a large company this past Thursday and Friday collecting nearly 850 samples for testing.
- Zoos, movie theaters and museums can begin reopening on June 10, 2020.
- Public Health continues to plan for specimen collection at other hotspots within Montgomery County.
- The Ohio National Guard will begin testing of staff at nursing homes within Montgomery County starting this week.
- Public Health will continue conference calls and planning with partners, to include the
 Ohio National Guard for testing of congregate locations.
- The county received more Strategic National Stockpile (SNS) deliveries on Monday and another delivery is projected to arrive tomorrow.
- Congregate locations such as nursing homes, jails, etc. can request sample collection kits directly from Public Health by calling 937-225-4508.
- PPE is available for medical and response organizations from the county drop-site. There is an abundance of N-95's, surgical masks, gloves and face-shields. Requests for







- Direct shipment of SNS deliveries to nursing homes are anticipated to be all shipped by June 11, 2020.
- Public Health continues to meet weekly with the University of Dayton to discuss planning issues for the summer as well as the fall.
- Public Health continues to facilitate conference calls with congregate locations within the county.

- The Public Health COVID-19 informational phone line remains open Monday through Friday to answer general questions. The info line is 937-225-6217.
- ODH information line remains open, the number is 1-833-4-ASK-ODH and is open seven days a week.
- Public Health continues to monitor all sources (ODH, CDC, WHO, European Center for Disease and Prevention and Control (ECOC) for the latest information.
- Public Health maintains its one-week operational period for this response.
- Public Health will continue to share the situational report with other local health departments, Montgomery County Emergency Management, Greater Dayton Area Hospital Association and Dayton Metropolitan Medical Response System partners.

CDC Update (Situation in the US):

CDC is closely monitoring an outbreak of respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus named COVID-19. The outbreak first started in Wuhan, China, but cases have been identified in a growing number of other <u>international locations</u>, including the United States. CDC will update the following U.S. map daily. Information regarding the number of people under investigation will be updated daily.





CDC Response Updates:

Level 3 Travel Health Notice: Widespread ongoing transmission with restrictions on entry to the United States

CDC recommends that travelers avoid all nonessential travel to the following destinations. Most foreign nationals who have been in one of these countries during the previous 14 days will not be allowed to enter the United States.

- China
- Irar
- · Most European Countries
- · United Kingdom and Ireland

Level 3 Travel Health Notice: Widespread ongoing transmission without restrictions on entry to the United States

CDC recommends that travelers avoid all nonessential travel to all global destinations:

Global Pandemic Notice

Level 2 Travel Health Notice: Ongoing community transmission

CDC recommends that older adults and people of any age with serious chronic medical conditions should consider postponing nonessential travel to most global destinations.

Level 1 Travel Health Notice: Limited community transmission

CDC recommends travelers practice usual health precautions recommended for their destination.

World Health Organization Update:

- More than 7 million cases of COVID-19 and over 400 000 deaths have now been reported to WHO. Although the situation in Europe is improving, globally it is worsening. On Sunday, more than 136 000 cases were reported, the most in a single day so far. In countries seeing positive signs, the WHO Director-General warned in his media briefing yesterday 'the biggest threat now is complacency'.
- The WHO Regional Office for the Americas has published a guide with recommendations on measures to reduce COVID-19 transmission among indigenous populations, Afrodescendants, and other ethnic groups. The recommendations focus on promoting hygiene, social distancing, and improving access to basic health services in these communities.
- WHO fully supports equality and the global movement against racism. We encourage all
 those protesting around the world to do so safely: as much as possible, keep at least 1
 meter from others, clean your hands, cover your cough and wear a mask if you attend a
 protest.
- WHO has published 14 new community and risk engagement posters on parenting during the pandemic. Some of the topics that these posters cover include: learning






through play, keeping calm and managing stress, keeping children safe online, family budgeting in times of financial stress, and talking about COVID-19.

Cases & Deaths by Jurisdiction


35 jurisdictions report more than 10,000 cases of COVID-19.
