Current Situation:

Public Health – Dayton & Montgomery County, the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and World Health Organization (WHO) are closely monitoring an outbreak of respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus (termed "COVID-19") first identified in Wuhan City, Hubei Province, China in December 2019 and which continues to expand.

Current Updates:

- MOST IMPORTANT MESSAGE OF THE DAY: DO EVERYTHING YOU CAN TO CONSERVE PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE).
- Globally the World now has 5,776,750 cases and 360,089 deaths from COVID-19.
- Public Health started conducting sample collection from hotspots within the county this past Thursday. Additional testing was accomplished today and this upcoming Monday.
- The Ohio Guard will begin doing testing of staff at nursing homes this upcoming Monday. There are nearly 950 nursing homes in the state, so this will take time.
- The county will receive more Strategic National Stockpile (SNS) deliveries on Monday and Wednesday next week.
- SNS deliveries this week provided a limited supply of gowns. If in need please follow the standard requesting process.
- Public Health expanded their contact tracing capability with additional staff starting this past Wednesday.
- Public Health continues to meet weekly with the University of Dayton to discuss planning issues for the summer as well as the fall.






- Public Health is planning to provide COVID-19 educational materials to several non-English speaking communities.
- Updates from the Governor DeWine and ODH:
 - May 31 childcare providers can reopen with reduced numbers in classrooms and intensified cleaning
 - May 31 Child day camps
 - Four new orders are expected by the end of the day
 - Social distance when possible
 - Wedding receptions limited to 300
 - Self-service drinks are okay at gas stations and convenience stores
 - Assisted living outside visitor guidance coming out later today
- Select nursing homes began receiving their direct delivery of PPE from the SNS yesterday, all locations should receive by the end of the day on Sunday.
- Staff within Public Health has formed to respond to complaints at businesses within the county. Environmental Health continues to address concerns at all restaurants and bars as well.

- The Public Health COVID-19 informational phone line remains open Monday through Friday to answer general questions. The info line is 937-225-6217.

- ODH information line remains open, the number is 1-833-4-ASK-ODH and is open seven days a week.
- Public Health continues to monitor all sources (ODH, CDC, WHO, European Center for Disease and Prevention and Control (ECOC) for the latest information.
- Public Health maintains its one-week operational period for this response.
- Public Health will continue to share the situational report with other local health departments, Montgomery County Emergency Management, Greater Dayton Area Hospital Association and Dayton Metropolitan Medical Response System partners.

CDC Update (Situation in the US):

CDC is closely monitoring an outbreak of respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus named COVID-19. The outbreak first started in Wuhan, China, but cases have been identified in a growing number of other <u>international locations</u>, including the United States. CDC will update the following U.S. map daily. Information regarding the number of people under investigation will be updated daily.

CDC Response Updates:





Level 3 Travel Health Notice: Widespread ongoing transmission with restrictions on entry to the United States

CDC recommends that travelers avoid all nonessential travel to the following destinations. Most foreign nationals who have been in one of these countries during the previous 14 days will not be allowed to enter the United States.

- China
- Iran
- Most European Countries
- United Kingdom and Ireland

Level 3 Travel Health Notice: Widespread ongoing transmission without restrictions on entry to the United States

CDC recommends that travelers avoid all nonessential travel to all global destinations:

Global Pandemic Notice

Level 2 Travel Health Notice: Ongoing community transmission

CDC recommends that older adults and people of any age with serious chronic medical conditions should consider postponing nonessential travel to most global

Level 1 Travel Health Notice: Limited community transmission

CDC recommends travelers practice usual health precautions recommended for their destination.

World Health Organization Update:

WHO has published a surveillance protocol for SARS-CoV-2 infection among health workers. This is a technical tool that countries can use to better understand the characteristics and exposure risks of health workers infected with COVID-19.

WHO Director-General Dr Tedros, in his regular media briefing, stated the Solidarity Response Fund will continue to receive donations to support WHO's activities related to COVID-19, while the WHO Foundation will help to fund all elements of WHO's work and be fully aligned with the Organization's priorities.

Members of the Polio Eradication Initiative at WHO Regional Office for the Eastern Mediterranean are supporting the training of health workers to respond to COVID-19 in Sudan. WHO is using the experience of health professionals, police staff and prisoners in Italy to inform guidance on preparedness, prevention and control of COVID-19 in prisons and other places of detention.

Community pharmacists are key players in the COVID-19 response and should be aware of what steps to take if they suspect or see signs of COVID-19. The WHO Regional Office for Europe has published technical guidelines on practical ways in which health systems can better respond to COVID-19.





Cases & Deaths by Jurisdiction


31 jurisdictions report more than 10,000 cases of COVID-19.
