
Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, ODH reported 729 (45,537) total new cases, which is above the 21-day average. Four (2,704) deaths, 50 (7,292) hospitalizations, and eight (1,852) ICU Admissions were reported. Deaths, hospitalizations, and ICU Admissions were below their respective 21-day averages.

In the last 24-hours, one new hotspot has been identified by the Ohio Department of Health. A Warren County-based church is working with the local health department on contact tracing. ODH continues to monitor seven previously identified hot spots.

The EOC executed a statewide push of PPE. State stockpiling and storage strategies continue to be developed through ESF-7 and the State EOC Unified Command

- The Adjutant General of the Ohio National Guard provided notification to the Ohio Food Bank Association that August 7 will be the final day of OHNG support for the food bank mission.
 - Focus through that time will be supporting coordination to return operations to full civilian engagement.
- Scheduled a meeting for next week with ESF-7 partners to discuss contracting options for ESF-6-related staffing needs moving forward.

- Ohio Department of Health

 - Purpose: Planning for needs to address forecast Medical Surge needs.

Actions Taken:

- Zone 1: Several hospitals across the Northeast and Northeast Central region reported a rise in COVID+ admissions over the weekend; the exact source of the increase is yet to be determined.
- Nursing Facility Testing continues in Zone 1 this week with a focus on the Northeast Central Region. Results from last week's testing in the Northeast Region indicate less than a two percent COVID+ rate among facility staff members swabbed.
- O Zone 3: New outbreaks continue to be reported, the most significant increase of cases are being reported in Hamilton, Warren, Clark, Montgomery, and Butler counties. The increase in case counts are currently being linked to mass testing at businesses, pop up testing, outbreaks tied to church services/funeral service, and overall community spread. Of note, Hamilton and Clermont counties have seen their largest increase of case counts but the hospitalizations remain steady. (Hamilton saw +150 cases higher than normal).
- During this operational period ESF-8 Desk has initiated two (2) mission requests with State partners.
- There was a training on HHS Protect. HHS Protect is a federal data integration program that houses all of the COVID-19 data that is sent by the hospitals, the Ohio Hospital Association, by the labs, and by the ODH.
 - The training presented how Ohio can see what required data is being submitted and what data is not being submitted. I
 - o t also showed how the data is being submitted, through what platform.
- The 19th PPE Push was executed by the RSS Wareshouse and our ODOT partners.

- Continue daily updates in hospital environments of care. Daily assessment with senior staff and provision of timely communications to all OhioMHAS employees on current status of COVID-19 and ODH and Governor updates Community providers in board areas work to provide clear and consistent information regarding COVID and minimize risk of infection through monitoring and collaboration with local health departments.
- Continue working with agency partners to request and distribute PPE to state hospitals and to state agency partners.
 - OhioMHAS monitor hospital use and burn rates to determine need for PPE for patients, staff and visitors.
 - Testing and monitoring of state hospital residents and staff
- Ohio Department of Education


