Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 743 (51,789) total new cases, 93 (7,839) hospitalizations, 33 (1,994) ICU Admissions, and 45 (2,863) reported deaths. All reported metrics are above their respective 21-day averages.

No new information on statewide hot spots was reported by ODH as they continue to monitor 14 previously-identified areas of concern. The EOC is now supporting two missions at Trumbull Correctional Insititue; the Ohio National Guard is providing medical staffing and the Ohio State Highway Patrol is augmenting perimeter security at the facility.

Warehouse capacity continues to be monitored as inbound supplies increase. State stockpiling and storage strategies continue to be developed through ESF-7 and the State EOC Unified Command.

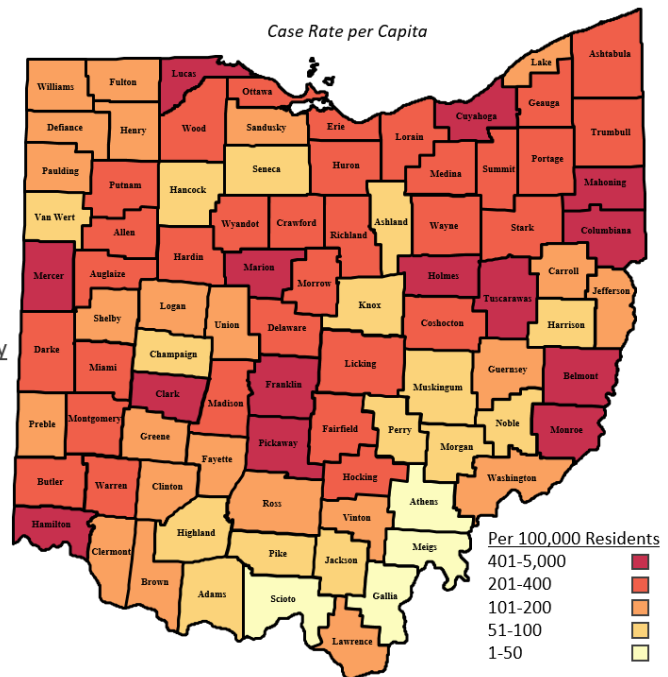

State Community Lifeline Status

Primary Lifeline



- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase.
- 7-day moving average of Case by onset date steadily increased since mid-to-late June.
- Positivity rate has declined as testing has increased; rate has remained between 4-6% since May.
- Reproduction number is now ranging between 1.00-1.18 in the three clinical zones.
- ED visits in mid June show an increase; COVID diagnoses and total bed use continue to increase.
- Limited access to nursing homes & similar facilities continues.
- Personal Protective Equipment, Mass Fatality, and Medical Surge workgroups continue efforts.
- One RRF remains in-progress; 12 addressed and are no longer active.



- The Agriculture workgroup continues to monitor for issues of concern.
- All major pork processing plants impacting Ohio's processing are operating (statewide & nationally).
- Pork depopulation planning continues on account of processing interruption.
- Restaurants are open per the ODH Dine Safe Ohio Order (current as of May 21)
- Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues.
- [Potential quarantine locations](#) have been identified.
- Homelessness workgroup continues to update plans for response.



- First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19.
- Limited access to jails & detention facilities continues.
- ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across their statewide facilities.



- No current impacts to the lifeline requiring EOC support.

Actions Taken:

- Worked a new mission for Hamilton County to support mass testing.
- Attended Ag Work Group and ESF-8 sync calls.
- Participated in a contracting solutions call with ESF-7 and other relevant parties.

Planned Actions:

- Ongoing mission support and partner coordination.

7 | Logistics

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency

Actions Taken:

- Continued working with the OHNG on the Ohio Expo Center PPE warehousing effort.
- On June 29, the Expo Center warehouse received 12 truckloads with 42 pallets (200,000) N95 masks and 274 pallets (716,160) gowns.
- The PPE is currently being stored in the Lausche building.
- The Lausche building is at 50% capacity.
- Plans were developed to move operations to the Kasich building when the Lausche building is at full capacity. This is anticipated to happen early next week.
- Work with DAS programmers on a new PPE tracking system.
- Working with vendors on PPE that we have items pending.
- No new purchases made June 30.

Planned Actions:

- Continue supporting Expo Center warehousing operations.

8 | Public Health

- Ohio Department of Health
 - Lead Agency for PPE Workgroup
 - Purpose: To determine and allocate appropriate PPE for COVID-19 responders.
 - Lead Agency for Mass Fatality Workgroup
 - Purpose: To assemble stakeholders within mass fatality/fatality management to develop statewide strategies & unified effort in the management of decedents.
 - Lead Agency for Medical Surge Workgroup
 - Purpose: Planning for needs to address forecast Medical Surge needs.

Actions Taken:

- ESF-8 participated in the FEMA/HHS LNO Call today where Cincinnati COVID-19 Response Assistance Team (CART) visit and participation from agencies was discussed.
 - Discussed HHS Cloth Mask status and the HHS Remdesivir strategy in regard to allocation and cost.
- ESF-8 received follow-on about cloth masks.
 - The HHS cloth face mask program will be cancelled after they ship the back orders.
 - However, if cloth masks are needed, FEMA has 2 million available.
 - An RRF can be made for them.

- ODH participated in the ESF-8 partner touchpoint.
- HHS & FEMA have identified Ohio has a hot spot and will be coordinating a visit to ensure resources and information that can be supported by the federal government are available to support COVID needs of the community.
- Planning for the 21st PPE Push is underway.
- Zone 3: Case Counts continue to rise across Zone 3, primarily in Hamilton County.
- Adult hospital bed utilization has seen an increase in both ICU and Med/Surge beds.
- The Mass Fatality Workgroup has finalized guidance for families seeking to organize funeral/memorial services.
 - This guidance will be distributed through workgroup partners to the deathcare community statewide See Healthcare Resources Situation Report.

Planned Actions:

- ODH continues to collaborate on daily RFIs and planning efforts with federal and state stakeholders and ESF-8 partners to provide guidance and direct information.

- Ohio Mental Health and Addiction Services

Actions Taken:

- Met with ODH on June 30 to discuss collaborative planning for health equity and collaborative opportunities in addressing health and behavioral recommendations of the Minority Health Strike Team.
- Communications and Policy office are looking at ways to address behavioral health stigma and myths that poses barrier to services and culturally appropriate service delivery.

Planned Actions:

- Continue to support and coordinate state behavioral health hospital and community board collaborations to limit COVID-19 spread and maintain health and safety of patients, staffs and providers of services.
- Monitor PPE on hand and works with hospitals and other state agency partners local behavioral health boards and community providers to determine PPE needs and make appropriate request for supplies.

- Ohio Department Aging, State LTC Ombudsman

Actions Taken:

- Informed regional ombudsman regarding Hamilton County nursing home discussed by Bridge Team for local situational awareness.
- ESF-8 Partners Touch Point Met with ODH Emergency Preparedness to discuss Ombudsman PPE distribution.

11 | Agriculture

- Ohio Department of Agriculture

Actions Taken:

- The Agriculture Work Group met this morning.
 - Meat processing plants utilized by Ohio livestock producers are operating at varying but nearly full levels of capacity.
 - A recent national report from the pork industry for this year shows that there is a 5 percent increase in pork production, but packing capacity was at 105 percent in January, before COVID.
 - With COVID disruptions, packing plants were forced to slow down and in some cases closed resulting in pork backing up on Ohio farms.
 - This report demonstrates that Ohio pork producers will continue to have challenges with hogs backing up on farms into the fall and through the year.
 - In addition, the report mentions staffing concerns as plants struggle to find the workers they need to operate.

Planned Actions:

- Dept of Agriculture will be surveying Ohio meat processing plants every couple of weeks and will post and promote contact information for those with extra processing capacity on our agency's website.
 - The most recent survey shows very limited extra processing capacity with Ohio plants.

13 | Law Enforcement

- Ohio State Highway Patrol

Actions Taken:

- Provided site security for the Ohio Department of Health.
- Perimeter security at Trumbull Correctional Institute.
- Assisted with meal delivery to seniors citizens in Preble County for "Food 4 Families".
- Assisted PATH Center with meal deliveries in Defiance County.

Planned Actions:

- Provide site security for the Ohio Department of Health.
- Perimeter security at Trumbull Correctional Institute.
- The Portsmouth Post will begin a non-perishable food drive. Proceeds will be given to the Wellness Center Food Bank.
- Freemont Post units are assisting the Sandusky County EMA with handling phone calls and delivering medical supplies throughout the county.
- Springfield Post is continuing to collect food for the Bethel United Food Pantry - New Carlisle.

- Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction

Actions Taken:

- ODRC Continues to work towards incident objectives.

Planned Actions:

- ODRC has 799 staff COVID-19 positive, 685 staff recovered, 114 active positives and five deaths.
- ODRC has 139 incarcerated adults COVID-19 active positive, 4,246 recovered and 76 deaths, 14,595 total tested.
- ODRC has staff and/or inmate COVID-19 positives in 28 of the 28 institutions – the last institution experienced a staff positive on June 21, 2020.
- OSHP perimeter assistance at Trumbull Correctional Institution began June 29th.
- ONG 6 medics two OIC begin at TCI effective July 1st.
- ODCR continues to have hot spots with staff and inmate positive COVID-19.

14 | Recovery & Mitigation

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency

- The FEMA Public Assistance (PA) Program is declared for COVID-19.
 - There are currently 716 applicants, an increase of 0 from June 29.
 - There are currently 65 projects submitted, an increase of 1 from June 29.
 - \$22.8 remains obligated.

Actions Taken:

- Ohio EMA participated on the County EMA Directors call and share a new funding order document as it pertains to non-congregate sheltering and funding from FEMA and HUD.

Actions Taken:

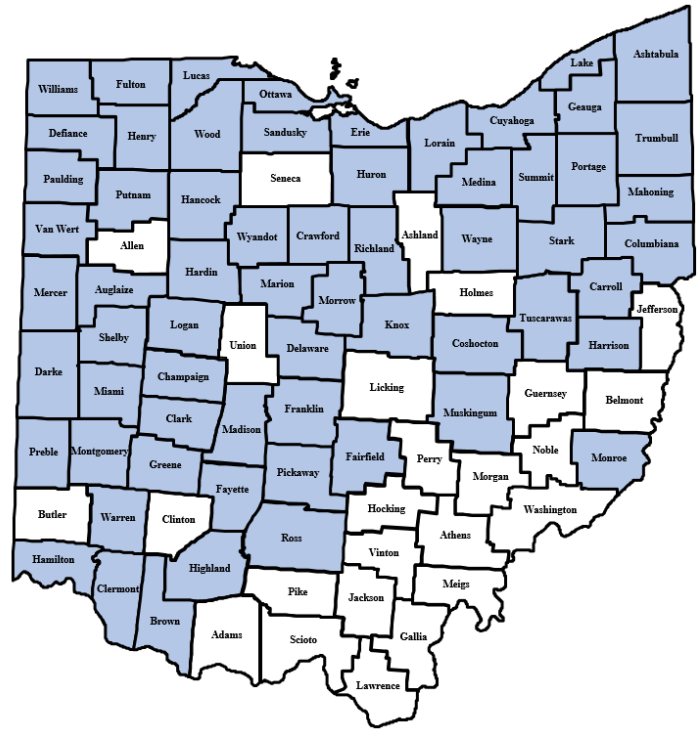
- 897 Ohio National Guardsmen support the COVID-19 response in Ohio.

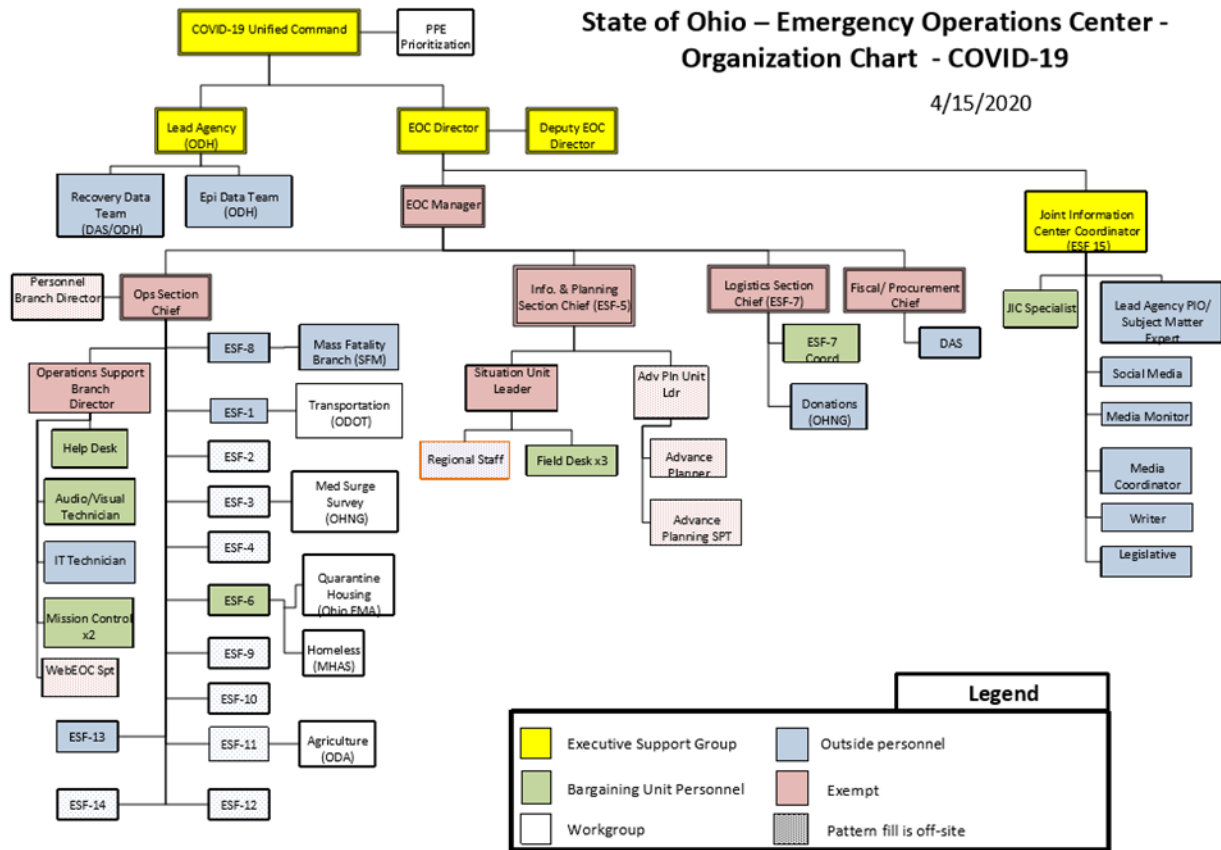
