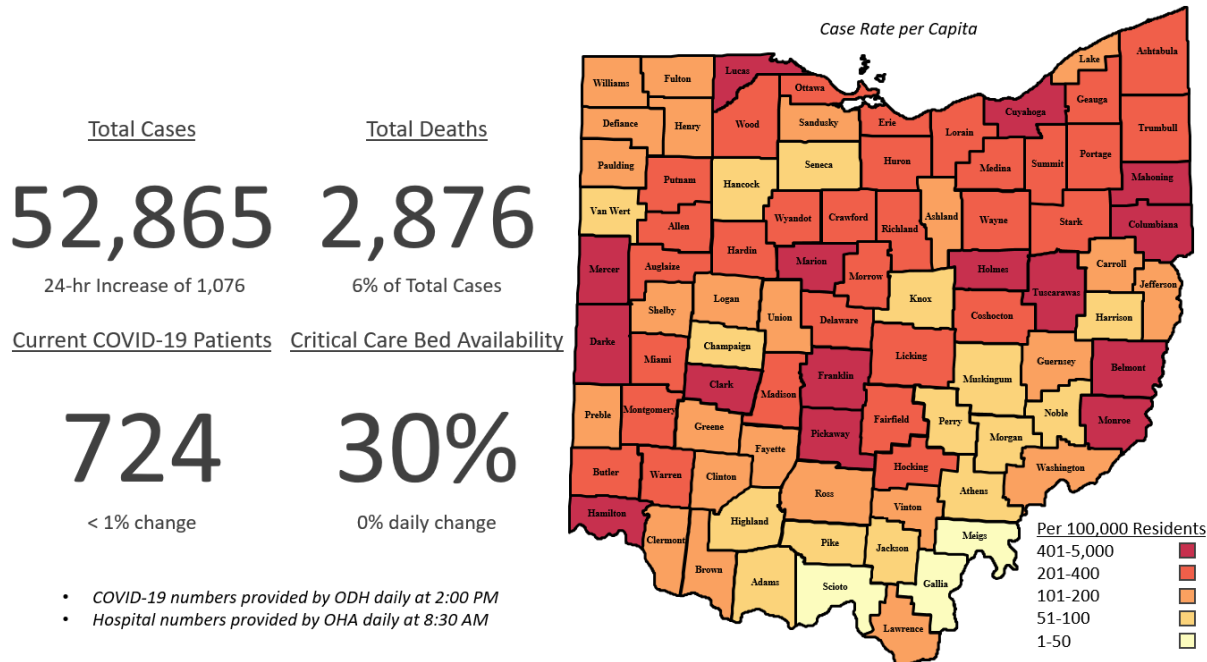
Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 1,076 (52,865) total new cases and 72 (7,911) hospitalizations, both of which were above their respective 21-day averages. ODH also reported 14 (2,008) ICU Admissions (in line with 21-day average) and 13 (2,876) deaths (below the 21-day average).

ODH reports that the island of Put-in-Bay was described as a hot spot during clinical calls on July 1. Congregate gathering at island bars has been identified as the source; local health departments are conducting contact tracing. There are no requests for State EOC assistance associated with this area of concern. ODH continues to monitor 14 previously-reported hot spots.

Warehouse capacity continues to be monitored as inbound supplies increase. State stockpiling and storage strategies continue to be developed through ESF-7 and the State EOC Unified Command.

State Community Lifeline Status

Primary Lifeline



- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase.
- 7-day moving average of Case by onset date steadily increased since mid-to-late June.
- Positivity rate has declined as testing has increased; rate has remained between 4-6% since May.
- Reproduction number is now ranging between 1.00-1.18 in the three clinical zones.
- ED visits in mid June show an increase; COVID diagnoses and total bed use continue to increase.
- Limited access to nursing homes & similar facilities continues.
- Personal Protective Equipment, Mass Fatality, and Medical Surge workgroups continue efforts.
- One RRF remains in-progress; 12 addressed and are no longer active.



- The Agriculture workgroup continues to monitor for issues of concern.
- All major pork processing plants impacting Ohio's processing are operating (statewide & nationally).
- Pork depopulation planning continues on account of processing interruption.
- Restaurants are open per the ODH Dine Safe Ohio Order (current as of May 21)
- Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues.
- [Potential quarantine locations](#) have been identified.
- Homelessness workgroup continues to update plans for response.



- First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19.
- Limited access to jails & detention facilities continues.
- ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across their statewide facilities.



- No current impacts to the lifeline requiring EOC support.



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State EOC Objectives

1. Coordinate the State's response to limit COVID-19 spread and maintain Lifeline stability.
2. Provide mission support to identify, prevent, mitigate and respond to COVID-19 hot spots.
3. Develop PPE procurement, warehousing, and allotment strategies to meet current and projected needs.
4. Share timely, clear, and consistent information to the whole community, especially as it pertains to recovery programs.

1 | Transportation

- Ohio Department of Transportation

Actions Taken:

- ODOT and BWC completed two missions today delivering Hamilton COVID Testing Supplies Central Region and Southwest Regions.
- Provided message boards at Toledo Rec Center and Toledo FoodBank.

Planned Actions:

- Preparing for Monday's 88-County RSS push.

3 | Engineering/Public Works

- Ohio Department of Natural Resources

Planned Actions:

- Support response as a need is identified.

4 | Firefighting

Actions Taken:

- No new missions.

- Continue to support ESF partners as needed.

- Monitoring the staffing survey.

- Monitor fire & EMS staffing survey.

5 | Information & Planning

- State EOC Liaisons

- There are no deployed liaisons.

Planned Actions:

- Support County EOCs and continue working with state agency partners as necessary (via deployment or virtual means).

6 | Mass Care

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency

Actions Taken:

- Closed a mission for non-medical personnel to support a testing site in Hamilton County.

Planned Actions:

- Ongoing mission support and coordination to maintain the Food, Water, Shelter lifeline.

7 | Logistics

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency

Actions Taken:

- The ohio expo center warehouse received 12 truckloads consisting of 232 pallets of PPE:
 - 540K gowns. 76K of which came from FEMA
 - 193K cloth face masks
- The expo center warehouse is at 70% capacity.
- The operations tempo at the expo center warehouse today was slow with two trucks received as of noon today.
 - A report of what was received July 1 will be included in July 2 sitrep contribution.
- Procure PPE based on funding availability and forecasted need.
- Canceled purchase order for food covers, vendor unable to make delivery.

Planned Actions:

- Continue supporting Expo Center warehousing operations.

8 | Public Health

- Ohio Department of Health
 - Lead Agency for PPE Workgroup
 - Purpose: To determine and allocate appropriate PPE for COVID-19 responders.
 - Lead Agency for Mass Fatality Workgroup
 - Purpose: To assemble stakeholders within mass fatality/fatality management to develop statewide strategies & unified effort in the management of decedents.

- Lead Agency for Medical Surge Workgroup
 - Purpose: Planning for needs to address forecast Medical Surge needs.

Actions Taken:

- ODH with Ohio EMA and the Federal COVID- 19 Response Assistance Field Team (CRAFT) met with local community stakeholders in Cincinnati/Southwest Ohio to determine possible root causes of the COVID-19 spike and to assist local government in designing a plan of action that will immediately reduce the impact of the virus.
 - The CRAFT team is tasked to leverage the ground situation; validate data of what is happening; and understand community needs to mitigate the COVID risk.
- RSS Warehouse has prepared the 21st PPE Shipment of PPE for shipment next week.
- During this operational period ESF-8 Desk has not initiated any mission requests today with State partners.

Planned Actions:

- ODH is conducting ESF-8 partner touchpoint tomorrow.
- ODH continues to collaborate on daily RFIs and planning efforts with federal and state stakeholders and ESF-8 partners to provide guidance and direct information.

- Ohio Mental Health and Addiction Services

Planned Actions:

- Continue to support and coordinate state behavioral health hospital and community board collaborations to limit COVID-19 spread and maintain health and safety of patients, staffs and providers of services.
- Monitor PPE on hand and works with hospitals and other state agency partners local behavioral health boards and community providers to determine PPE needs and make appropriate request for supplies.

- Ohio Department Aging, State LTC Ombudsman

Actions Taken:

- Ombudsman appeared on WOSU All Sides With Ann Fisher for Wellness Wednesday episode to discuss visitation in long-term care.
- Review of guidance for nursing home visitation.

Planned Actions:

- Follow-through on nursing homes planning to relocate residents (see evacuation question) Meeting with designated regional ombudsman programs to discuss return to visitation.

- Ohio Department of Education

Planned Actions:

- Continuing to develop new and update existing information and policy documents for schools regarding services to students during closures Developing Education Reset and Restart Planning Guide and resources for schools and district.

9 | Search & Rescue

- Ohio Department of Natural Resources

Planned Actions:

- Support response as a need is identified.

11 | Agriculture

- Ohio Department of Agriculture

Planned Actions:

- Dept of Agriculture will be surveying Ohio meat processing plants every couple of weeks and will post and promote contact information for those with extra processing capacity on our agency's website.
 - The most recent survey shows very limited extra processing capacity with Ohio plants.

13 | Law Enforcement

- Ohio State Highway Patrol

Actions Taken:

- Provided site security for the Ohio Department of Health.
- Provided perimeter security for the Trumbull Correctional Institution.
- Transported cleaned N95 masks from Battelle.
- Delivered food and supplies for the Van Wert County Council on Aging.
- Assisted with the delivery of meals to senior adults in Preble County.

Planned Actions:

- Deliver Remdesivir to hospitals across the state.
- Provide site security for the Ohio Department of Health.
- Provide perimeter security for the Trumbull Correctional Institution.
- Provide traffic control during food distribution at the Shiloh-Plymouth Food Pantry in Richland County.
- Deliver food and medical supplies for the Sandusky County EMA.

- Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction

Actions Taken:

- ODRC Continues to work towards incident objectives.

Planned Actions:

- ODRC has 807 staff COVID-19 positive, 687 staff recovered, 120 active positives and five deaths.
- ODRC has 140 incarcerated adults COVID-19 active positive, 4,244 recovered and 76 deaths, 14,753 total tested.
- ODRC has staff and/or inmate COVID-19 positives in 28 of the 28 institutions – the last institution experienced a staff positive on June 21, 2020.
- OSHP perimeter assistance at Trumbull Correctional Institution began June 29th.
- ONG six medics one OIC begin at TCI effective today, July 1st.
- ODCR continues to have hot spots with staff and inmate positive COVID-19.

14 | Recovery & Mitigation

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency
 - The FEMA Public Assistance (PA) Program is declared for COVID-19.
 - There are currently 716 applicants, an increase of 0 from June 30.
 - There are currently 66 projects submitted, an increase of 1 from June 30.
 - \$22.8 remains obligated.

Actions Taken:

- Ohio EMA has provided technical assistance PA applicants.

Planned Actions:

- Ohio EMA will participate in one call with hospitals and will continue to provide technical assistance to PA applicants.

15 | Public Affairs

- JIC

Planned Actions:

- Support response as need is identified.

Other Partners

- Ohio National Guard

Actions Taken:

- 940 Ohio National Guardsmen support the COVID-19 response in Ohio.
- 529 guardsmen support 14 food bank missions.
- Two Guardsmen are working as specialists in ODH labs. 219 members are on Specimen Collection teams.
- 21 soldiers support the state RSS warehouse.

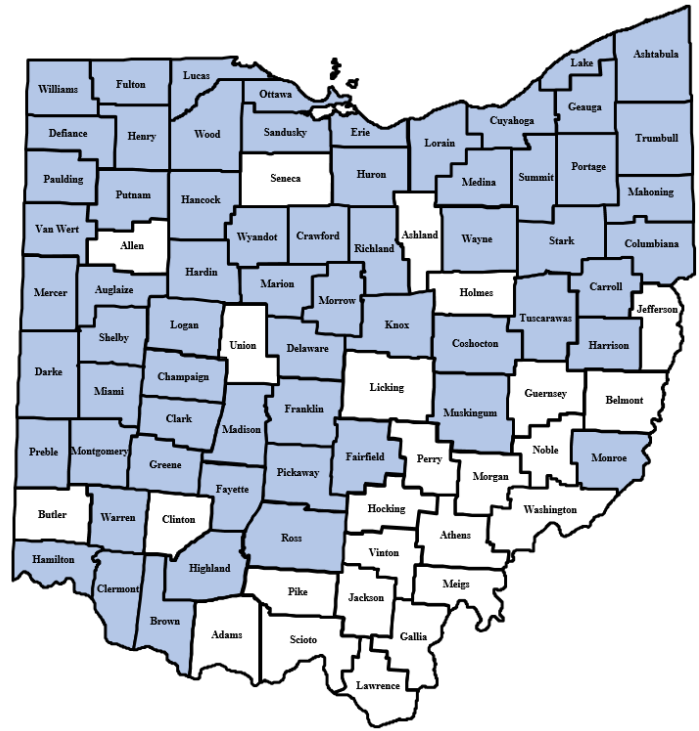
- 19 Guardsmen operate the Expo Center warehouse.
- The Ohio NG is supporting ODRC at Trumbull Correctional Institution with medics.
- The Ohio NG collected 4350 samples in the last 24 hours and expect to collect over 4000 in the next 24 hours.
- The Ohio NG participated in teleconferences to discuss the future of National Guard participation in missions around the state.

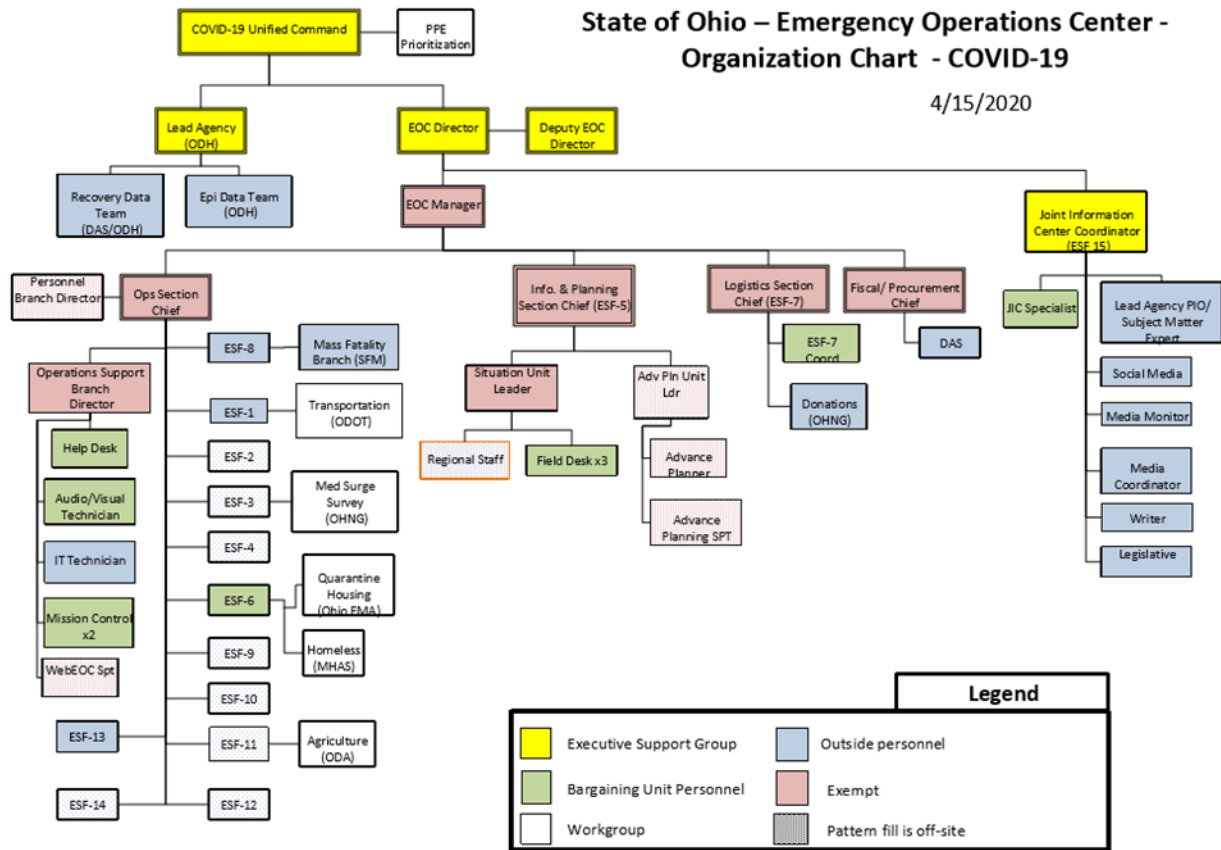
