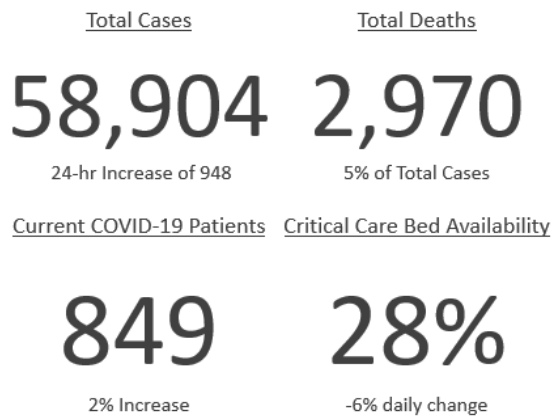
Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 948 (58,904) total new cases, 134 (8,383) hospitalizations, 24 (2,101) ICU Admissions, and 43 (2,970) deaths, all of which are above their respective 21-day averages.

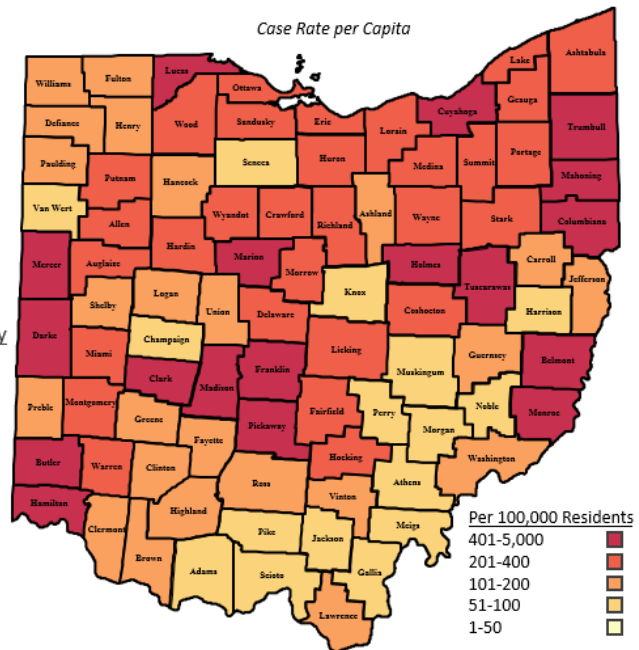
In the last 24 hours, ODH reported that several people who visited bars and restaurants at Put-in-Bay have tested positive for COVID-19. ODH and the Ohio National Guard are coordinating support for mass testing on South Bass Island.

Warehouse capacity continues to be monitored as inbound supplies increase. State stockpiling and storage strategies continue to be developed through ESF-7 and the State EOC Unified Command.

State Community Lifeline Status

In-state Response | Ongoing External Support | Assistance Needed

Primary Lifeline



- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase.
- 7-day moving average of Case by onset date steadily increased from mid June to early July.
- Positivity rate has increased slightly since late June; rate has remained between 4-6% since May.
- Reproduction number is now ranging between 1.03-1.12 in the three clinical zones.
- ED visits in mid-June show an increase; COVID diagnoses and total bed use continue to increase.
- Limited access to nursing homes & similar facilities continues.
- Personal Protective Equipment, Mass Fatality, and Medical Surge workgroups continue efforts.
- One RRF remains in-progress; 12 addressed and are no longer active.



- The Agriculture workgroup continues to monitor for issues of concern.
- All major pork processing plants impacting Ohio's processing are operating (statewide & nationally).
- Pork depopulation planning continues on account of processing interruption.
- Restaurants are open per the ODH Dine Safe Ohio Order (current as of May 21)
- Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues.
- [Potential quarantine locations](#) have been identified.
- Homelessness workgroup continues to update plans for response.



- First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19.
- Limited access to jails & detention facilities continues.
- ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across their statewide facilities.



- No current impacts to the lifeline requiring EOC support.



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State EOC Objectives

1. Coordinate the State’s response to limit COVID-19 spread and maintain Lifeline stability.
2. Provide mission support to identify, prevent, mitigate and respond to COVID-19 hot spots.
3. Develop PPE procurement, warehousing, and allotment strategies to meet current and projected needs.
4. Share timely, clear, and consistent information to the whole community, especially as it pertains to recovery programs.

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency

Actions Taken:

- Working with suppliers for PPE, working with our warehouses on deliveries.
- Had to cancel another purchase order today for 1,000,000 3M N95.
- Working with vendors on deliveries.
- Contacted warehousing contractor to get a cost estimate for turn key staffing of the Adelaide and overflow warehouses. The contractor will provide estimate this week.
- Downloaded 3 trailers trucks for a total of 64 pallets containing the following items:
 - 64 pallets of LvL 1 Disposable Poly Medical gowns (Total 162,400 Gowns).
 - The Current Warehouse is at 75% capacity after reorganization today.
 - Warehouse has been reorganized to maximize available space.
 - Plans to move Warehouse operations to Kasich Hall have been finalized.

Planned Actions:

- Continue to coordinate Expo Center warehouse operations.
- Continue to work with the warehouse and suppliers on their PPE deliveries.
- Enter en-route PPE to update the dashboard.

Actions Taken:

- A call with Federal and State Partners was conducted today about the Federal COVID- 19 Response Assistance Field Team (CRAFT) visit.
- RSS Warehouse has developed the distribution plan for the 08 July 2020 Ohio RSS warehouse 22nd PPE Push of 131 pallets containing 336,000 provider gowns to 43 primary county drop sites.
- ESF-8 participated in the FEMA/HHS LNO call today and o Discussed potential Federal COVID- 19 Response Assistance Field Team (CRAFT) visit to Dayton this week.
- Recently provided Remdesivir guidance o FEMA/ HHS cloth mask status.
- National Guard status During this operational period ESF-8 Desk has initiated four mission requests today with State partners.
- ODH conducted the ESF-8 partner touchpoint.

Planned Actions:

- ODH continues to collaborate on daily RFIs and planning efforts with federal and state stakeholders and ESF-8 partners to provide guidance and direct information.

- Ohio Department of Agriculture

Planned Actions:

- Dept of Agriculture will be surveying Ohio meat processing plants every couple of weeks and will post and promote contact information for those with extra processing capacity on our agency's website.
 - The most recent survey shows very limited extra processing capacity with Ohio plants.

Actions Taken:

- Provided support and assistance to ODH/OSU for coronavirus prevalence study rollout occurring on Dept. of Agriculture's campus this week.

Planned Actions:

- Continue to monitor and support as needed.

13 | Law Enforcement

- Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction

Actions Taken:

- ODRC Continues to work towards incident objectives.

Planned Actions:

- ODRC has 838 staff COVID-19 positive, 699 staff recovered, 139 active positives and 5 deaths.
- ODRC has 161 incarcerated adults COVID-19 active positive, 4,218 recovered and 76 deaths, 15,553 total tested.
- ODRC has staff and/or inmate COVID-19 positives in 28 of the 28 institutions – the last institution experienced a staff positive on June 21, 2020.
- OSHP perimeter assistance at Trumbull Correctional Institution began June 29th.

- ONG 6 medics 1 OIC begin at TCI effective today, July 1st.
- ODRC continues to have hot spots with staff and inmate positive COVID-19, most of the hot spot institutions reflect the hot spots (counties) in the State of Ohio.

14 | Recovery & Mitigation

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency
 - The FEMA Public Assistance (PA) Program is declared for COVID-19.
 - There are currently 720 applicants, an increase of 1 from July 6.
 - There are currently 70 projects submitted, an increase of 1 from July 6.
 - \$22.8 remains obligated.

Actions Taken:

- Ohio EMA participated on the County EMA Directors call.
- Ohio EMA also submitted a second 30-day extension for mass feeding that would approve this work through the end of July.

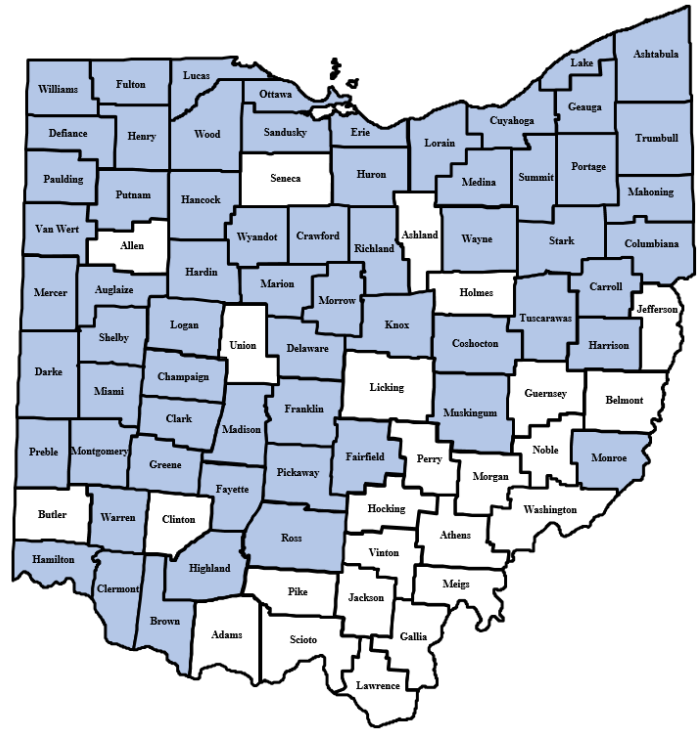

 - Two Guardsmen are working as specialists in ODH labs. 246 members are on Specimen Collection teams.
 - 21 soldiers support the state RSS warehouse.
 - 24 Guardsmen operate the Expo Center warehouse.
 - 7 Guardsmen are providing medical support at the Trumbull Correctional Institution.
 - Planned Actions:*
 - The Ohio NG plans to perform sample collections at 23 locations in the next 24 hours.

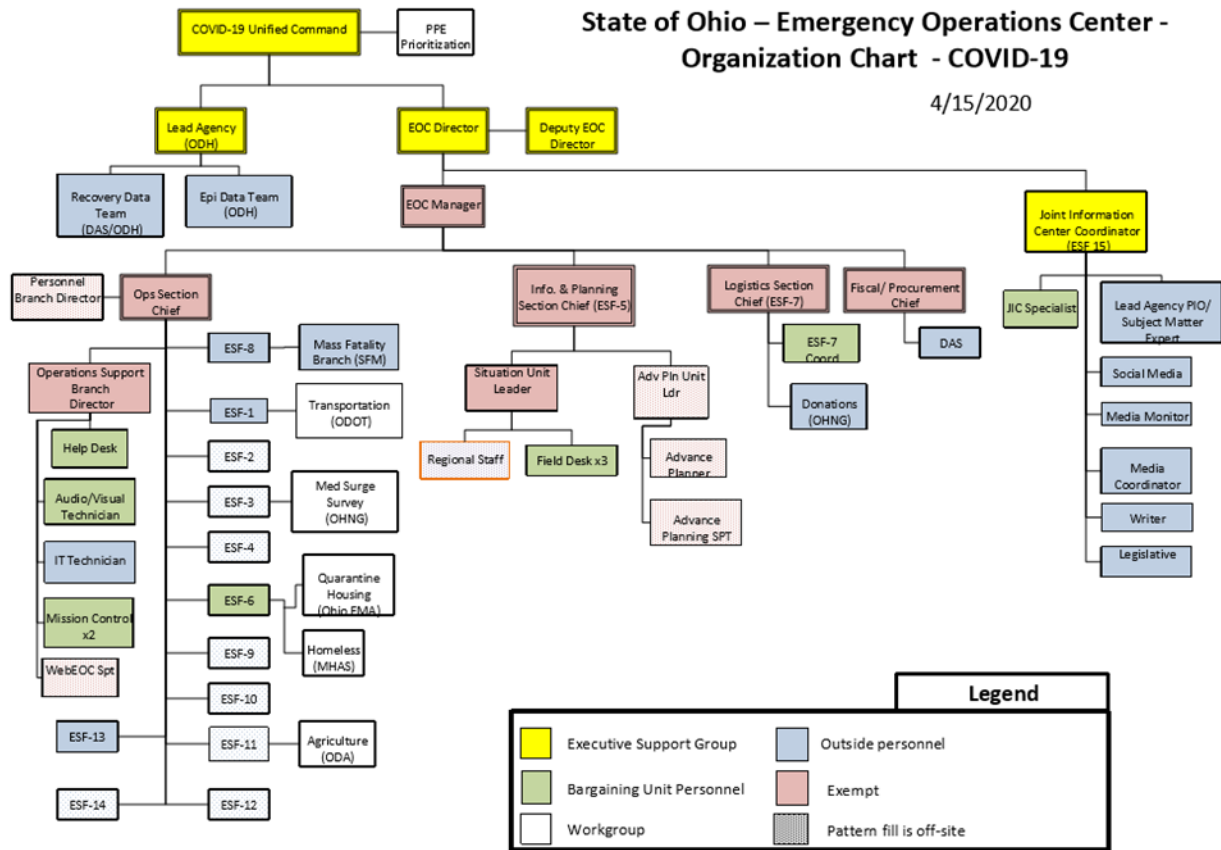
