
Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 1,261 (66,853) total new cases was above the 21-day average. 73 (8,915) hospitalizations, 6 (3,064) deaths, and 16 (2,201) ICU Admissions were below their respective 21-day averages.

In the last 24 hours, ODH has identified an outbreak underway at the Lorain/Medina Community Based Correctional Facility in Lorain County. The facility has activated its COVID-19 response plan and tested all detainees. The outbreak could result in greater staffing issues depending on the duration and/or size - resulting in a need for outside assistance.

Warehouse capacity continues to be monitored as inbound supplies increase. State stockpiling and storage strategies continue to be developed through ESF-7 and the State EOC Unified Command.


Primary Lifeline	 Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase. 7-day moving average of case by onset date steadily increased from mid-June to early July. Positivity rate has increased slightly since late June; rate has remained between 4-6% since May. Reproduction number is now ranging between 1.03-1.12 in the three clinical zones. ED visits in mid-June show an increase; COVID diagnoses and total bed use continue to increase. Limited access to nursing homes & similar facilities continues. Personal Protective Equipment, Mass Fatality, and Medical Surge workgroups continue efforts. One RRF remains in-progress; 12 addressed and are no longer active.
Food, Water, Shelter	 The Agriculture workgroup continues to monitor for issues of concern. All major pork processing plants impacting Ohio's processing are operating (statewide & nationally). Pork depopulation planning continues on account of processing interruption. Restaurants are open per the ODH Dine Safe Ohio Order (current as of May 21) Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues. <u>Potential quarantine locations</u> have been identified. Homelessness workgroup continues to update plans for response.
Safety and Security	 First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19. Limited access to jails & detention facilities continues. ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across their statewide facilities.
Communications	• No current impacts to the lifeline requiring EOC support.
Power & Fuel	• No current impacts to the lifeline requiring EOC support.
Hazardous	• No current impacts to the lifeline requiring EOC support.
Tansportation	No current impacts to the lifeline requiring EOC support.

 - 28 Pallets of Gentox Disposable isolation Gowns (67,200 units)
- Warehouse is currently at 80 percent capacity.
- Anticipate moving operations to the Kasich building July 14.
- The warehouse received a thorough deep clean of all surface areas that soldiers make contact with on a daily basis.
- Participated in warehousing planning meeting. Provided draft vendor proposal for taking over warehouse operations at the Adelaide and RSS warehouses.
- Participated on a call for the new warehouse, assisted DAS IT in the PPE Tracking inventory.
- Continue to work with the warehouse on deliveries and continue to work with vendors on their invoices for PPE.
- No new purchases made.
- Attended Controlling Board to cover new purchase orders for the future.

Planned Actions:

• Continue working warehouse solutions and supporting the overflow warehousing being conducted by the OHNG at the Ohio Expo Center.

Actions Taken:

 During this operational period ESF-8 Desk has initiated one (1) mission request today with State partners.

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To promote internal response coordination, ODH has implemented a formalized National Incident Management System (NIMS)-process to manage incident responsibilities assigned to the agency. Day-to-day engagements with ESF #8 will remain the same, but additional ODH staff may be integrated into incident response activities. For this initial phase, Gene Phillips and Alicia Leatherman have been assigned to lead the agency as members of the Unified Department Coordination Group.

- ODH has established 17 objectives for this operational period. For awareness the top five of these objectives are:
 - Priority Objective 1 Conduct surveillance to identify individual cases and outbreaks.
 - 2 Develop & implement a comprehensive messaging strategy for the prevention of COVID-19.
 - 3 Conduct laboratory testing and operations and determine the engagement that is required from ODH to support COVID-19 testing statewide.
 - 4 Carry out resource missions at the RSS to meet daily needs.
 - 5 Establish a robust resource pool and deployment process for contact tracing. The top five of objectives reflect the command emphasis for Surveillance, Public Health Messaging, Testing, Resource Support & Warehousing, Contact Tracing.
- These key activities will support the execution of a mitigation strategy that embraces personnel safety and promotes coordination within ODH and across state enterprise.
- Mass Fatality representatives will be assessing a location July 14th for a new zone 2 attentive care site. Based on new HHS guidance and distribution methodology, Ohio has been allocated 55 cases of remdesivir.
- ODH will work with clinical partners to further allocate this supply to Ohio hospitals.
 Hospitals may purchase medications up to their allocated amounts, and the product will be directly shipped to the hospital.
- ODH would like to thank our State EOC partners, especially the Ohio State Highway Patrol, who distributed remdesivir in the previous rounds of allocations.

- ODRC continues to have hot spots with staff and inmate positive COVID-19, most of the hot spot institutions reflect the hot spots (counties) in the State of Ohio.




