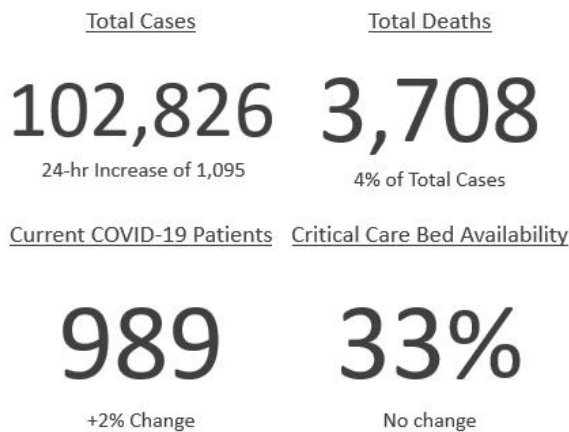
Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 1,095 (102,826) total new cases, which was below the 21-day average. 131 (11,760) hospitalizations, 35 (3,708) deaths, and 19 (2,699) ICU admissions, which were above the 21-day averages.

There are no hot spots identified in the last 24 hours by the Ohio Department of Health; they continue to monitor 5 other spots.

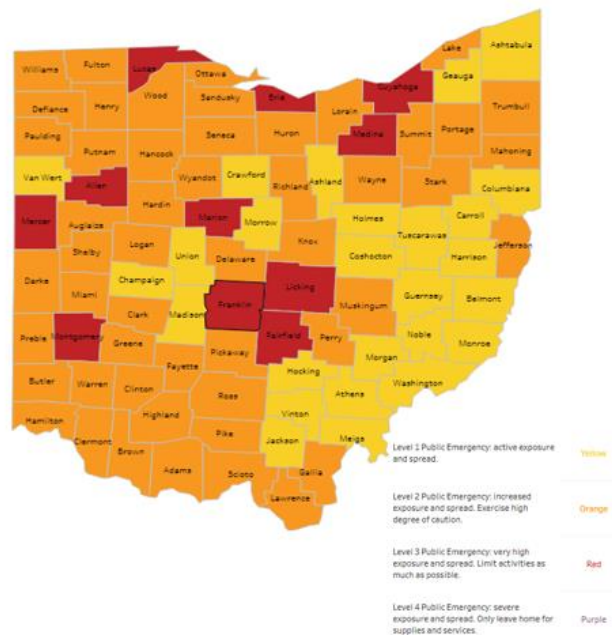
Warehouse capacity continues to be monitored as inbound supplies increase. State stockpiling and storage strategies continue to be developed through ESF-7 and the State EOC Unified Command.

State Community Lifeline Status

In-state Response | Ongoing External Support | Assistance Needed

Primary Lifeline



- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase.
- 7-day moving average of case by onset date steadily increased from mid-June to early July, with a modest decrease in recent weeks.
- Positivity rate has plateaued in recent weeks.
- Reproduction number is now ranging between 0.80-0.84 in the three clinical zones.
- ED visits showed a sustained increase from mid June to Mid July, followed by a sustained decline through early August.
- Limited access to nursing homes & similar facilities continues.
- Personal Protective Equipment, Mass Fatality, and Medical Surge workgroups continue efforts.
- One active RRF remain in-progress; 13 addressed and are no longer active.



- The Agriculture workgroup continues to monitor for issues of concern.
- All major pork processing plants impacting Ohio's processing are operating (statewide & nationally).
- Pork depopulation planning continues on account of processing interruption.
- Restaurants are open per the ODH Dine Safe Ohio Order (current as of May 21)
- Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues.
- Potential quarantine locations have been identified.
- Homelessness workgroup continues to update plans for response.



- First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19. (ODH Order)
- Limited access to jails & detention facilities continues.
- ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across their statewide facilities.



- No current impacts to the lifeline requiring EOC support.



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State EOC Objectives

1. Coordinate the State’s response to limit COVID-19 spread and maintain Lifeline stability.
2. Provide mission support to identify, prevent, mitigate and respond to COVID-19 hot spots.
3. Develop PPE procurement, warehousing, and allotment strategies to meet current and projected needs.
4. Share timely, clear, and consistent information to the whole community, especially as it pertains to recovery programs.

- Will continue to monitor the personnel needs survey along with follow-up when needed.

- Support County EOCs and continue working with state agency partners as necessary (via deployment or virtual means).

6 | Mass Care

Actions Taken:

- Participated in the Ag Work Group call and weekly sync call with EOC Manager.

Planned Actions:

- Continue to monitor SEOC operations and provide support as needed.

7 | Logistics

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency

Actions Taken:

- On August 10, prepared four outbound shipments from the Ohio Expo Center, Kasich building.
- 8 pallets of KN90 masks for East Central Education Service Center. 96,000 masks.

- 12 pallets of KN90 masks for Lake Erie West Education Service Center. 144,000 masks.
- 10 pallets of KN90 masks for Mahoning County Education Service Center. 120,000 masks.
- 6 pallets of KN90 masks for South Central Education Service Center. 72,000 masks
- Began preparing for transfer of 1,008,000 gowns from the Kasich building to the ODH Adelaide warehouse for break down and distribution to hospitals.
- The Kasich building received two shipments on August 10.
- 26 pallets of non-woven isolation gowns from PYT. DPS ESF-7 PO number 84053, 65,000 gowns.
- 26 pallets of non-woven isolation gowns from PYT. DPE ESF-7 PO number 84053, 77,700 gowns.
- ODPS ACF continued working on preparing 249,500 FEMA cloth face masks for shipment to approximately 300 Ohio Department of Aging identified agencies.
- Entered mission for ESF-1 to transport 114 pallets of bottled water from Mansfield ANGB to ODPS ACF for temporary storage until Adelaide warehouse is built out.

Planned Actions:

- Continue supporting overflow warehouse operations at the Ohio Expo Center.

8 | Public Health

- Ohio Department of Health

Actions Taken:

- Mass Fatality Branch hosted the Mass Fatality Workgroup. Workgroup stakeholders discussed the site assessments conducted last week, as well as discussed, the need for a position description for site coordinators.
- ESF-8 participated in the FEMA Synchronization Meeting: Topic discussed was NG T32 supplies.
- ODH conducted ESF-8 Partners meeting.
- During this operational period ESF-8 Desk has not initiated any mission requests with State partners.

Planned Actions:

- ODH continues to collaborate on daily planning efforts and provide guidance and information to various ESF-8 partners and stakeholders.

- Aging/State Long-Term Care Ombudsman

Actions Taken:

- Assistance to residential care facilities registering for statewide baseline testing.

Planned Actions:

- Ombudsman teleconference for regional representatives to provide technical assistance.

- Ohio Department of Education

Planned Actions:

- Working with ODH to plan a webinar to discuss county rankings with superintendents and building principals.
- Continuing to develop new and update existing resources for schools regarding re-opening on the Department's Reset and Restart webpage: (<http://education.ohio.gov/Topics/Reset-and-Restart>).

13 | Law Enforcement

- Ohio State Highway Patrol

Actions Taken:

- Provided site security for the Ohio Department of Health.
- Provided perimeter security for the Chillicothe Correctional Institution.
- Picked up cleaned N95 masks from Battelle for first responders.

Planned Actions:

- Relay dirty N95 masks to Battelle for cleaning.
- Providing perimeter security for the Chillicothe Correctional Institution.
- Providing site security for the Ohio Department of Health.

- Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction

Actions Taken:

- ODRC continues to work towards incident objectives.

Planned Actions:

- ODRC has 997 staff COVID-19 positive, 873 staff recovered, 124 active positives and 5 deaths.
- ODRC has 215 incarcerated adults COVID-19 active positive, 4,339 recovered and 77 deaths, 21,942 total tested.
- ODRC Special Operations team members working at Chillicothe Correctional Institution for a security mission and Chillicothe Correctional Institution Madison Correctional Institution and Southern Ohio Correctional Facility for medical missions.
- Ohio State Highway Patrol assisting with perimeter security at Chillicothe Correctional Institution activated July 23, 2020.
- ODRC continues to have hot spots with staff and inmate positive COVID-19, most of the hot spot institutions reflect the hot spots (counties) in the State of Ohio.

- Ohio EMA participated on the County EMA Directors call and also began reviewing guidance provided by FEMA for the recent Other Needs Assistance program that the President authorized under an Executive Order.

- 325 school districts are planning In-Person, 5-Day Return
- 55 school districts are planning Fully Remote/Online instruction

- 154 school districts are planning a Hybrid Model, mix of in-person and online.
- Three physicians from Ohio's children's hospitals spoke on the following:
- Dr. John Barnard, Nationwide Children's Hospital, discussed the prevalence of COVID-19 among children.
- Dr. Patty Manning, Cincinnati Children's Hospital, discussed COVID-19 spread involving children.
- Dr. Adam Mezzoff, Dayton Children's Hospital, discussed what schools can do if they have COVID-19 cases in schools.

- 362 ONG personnel are supporting food banks around the State of Ohio.
- 2 specialists work in the ODH Labs.
- 138 medical professionals are part of the sample collection teams.
- 30 personnel provided COVID sample courier services on behalf of the Dept of Medicaid.
- 10 medical personnel are caring for patients at a Richland County nursing home.
- 36 pax are working in the RSS warehouse moving PPE.
- 19 persons are working the ODH PPE overflow warehouse at the state Expo Center.
- The Ohio National Guard has 766 people supporting COVID operations Monday.
- Courier teams plan to transport 4111 samples from 31 nursing homes on Tuesday.

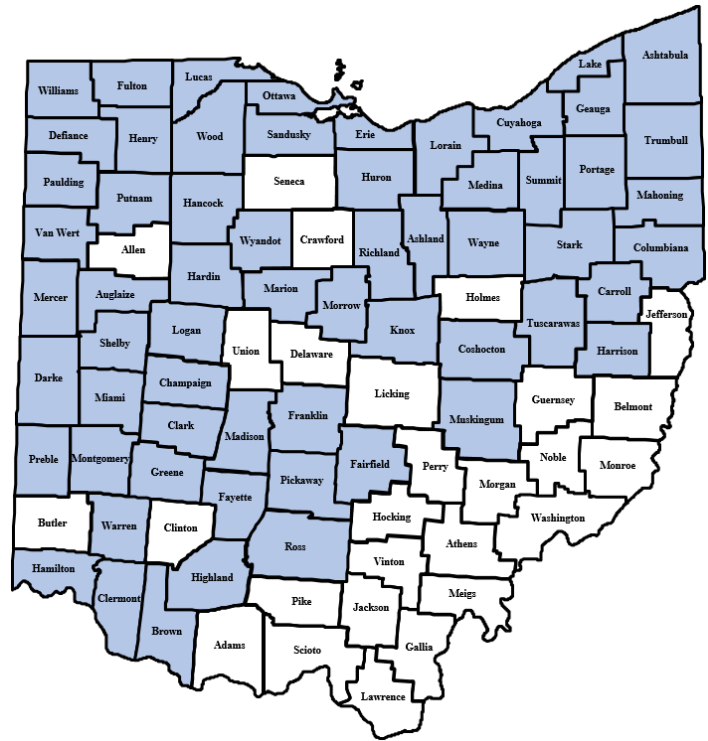

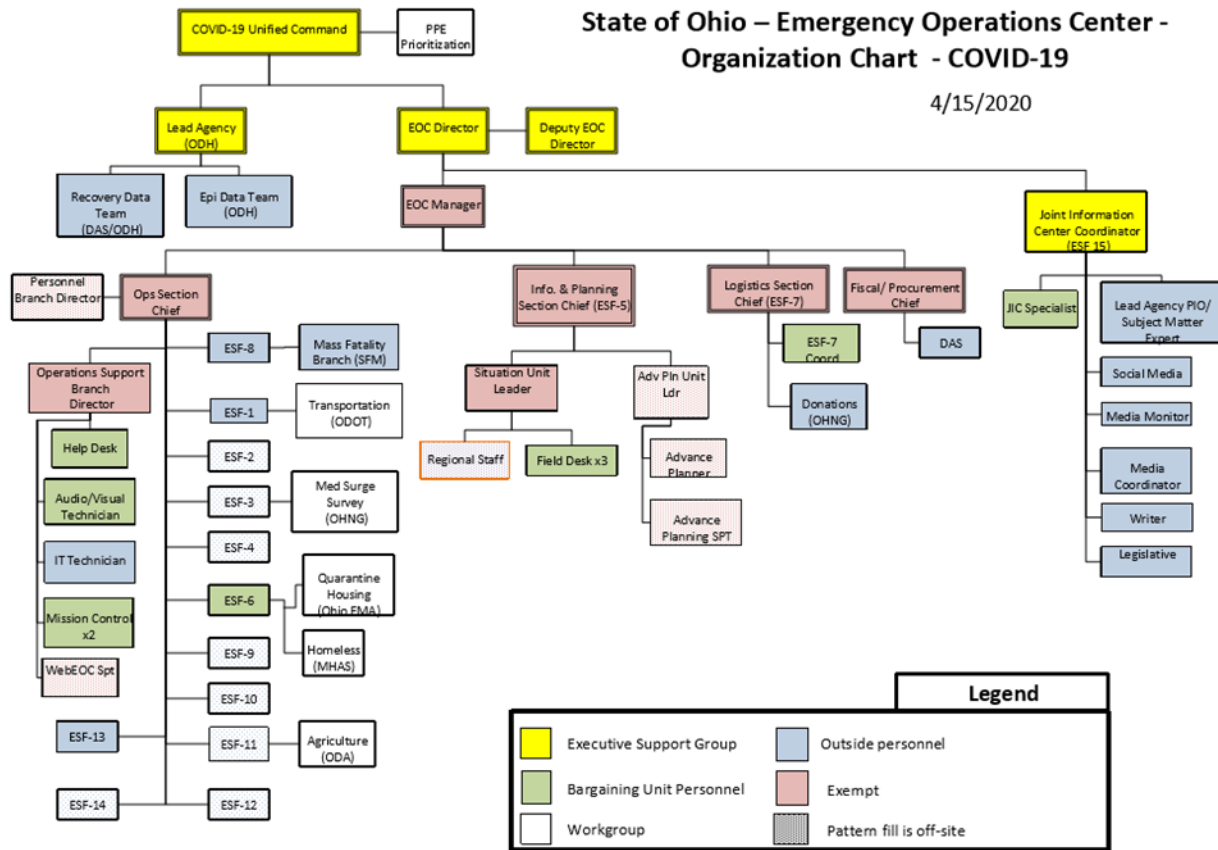
