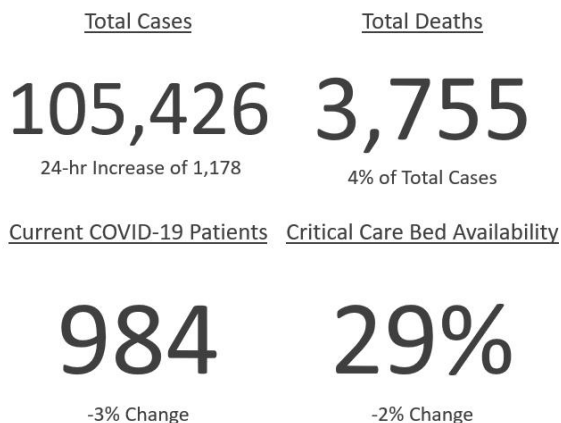

Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 1,178 (105,426) total new cases and 21 (3,755) deaths were below 21-day averages. There were 122 (12,023) hospitalizations and 22 (2,743) ICU admissions, which were above the 21-day averages.

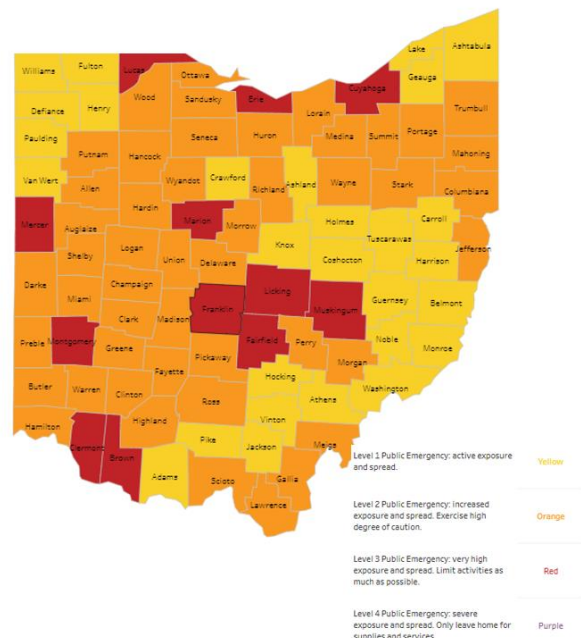
Warehouse capacity continues to be monitored as inbound supplies increase. State stockpiling and storage strategies continue to be developed through ESF-7 and the State EOC Unified Command.

State Community Lifeline Status

In-state Response | Ongoing External Support | Assistance Needed

Primary Lifeline



- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase.
- 7-day moving average of case by onset date steadily increased from mid-June to early July, with a modest decrease in recent weeks.
- Positivity rate has plateaued in recent weeks.
- Reproduction number is now ranging between 0.79-0.89 in the three clinical zones.
- ED visits showed a sustained increase from mid June to Mid July, followed by a sustained decline through early August.
- Limited access to nursing homes & similar facilities continues.
- Personal Protective Equipment, Mass Fatality, and Medical Surge workgroups continue efforts.
- One active RRF remain in-progress; 13 addressed and are no longer active.



- The Agriculture workgroup continues to monitor for issues of concern.
- All major pork processing plants impacting Ohio's processing are operating (statewide & nationally).
- Pork depopulation planning continues on account of processing interruption.
- Restaurants are open per the ODH Dine Safe Ohio Order (current as of May 21)
- Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues.
- Potential quarantine locations have been identified.
- Homelessness workgroup continues to update plans for response.



- First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19. ([ODH Order](#))
- Limited access to jails & detention facilities continues.
- ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across their statewide facilities.

State EOC Actions by Emergency Support Function

1 | Transportation

- Ohio Department of Transportation

Actions Taken:

- Utilized two semi's and drivers to transport pallets of water from Mansfield to Alum Creek.
- Secured semi's drivers to support the PPE mission on Monday.

Planned Actions:

- Will send two semi's and drivers to transport pallets of water from Mansfield to Alum Creek tomorrow.

3 | Engineering and Public Works

Planned Actions:

- Continue to monitor and support as needed.

4 | Firefighting

Planned Actions:

- Assist partners as needed.

- Ohio Fire Chiefs' Association

Planned Actions:

- Will continue to monitor the personnel needs survey along with follow-up when needed.

5 | Information & Planning

- State EOC Liaisons

Planned Actions:

- Support County EOCs and continue working with state agency partners as necessary (via deployment or virtual means).

6 | Mass Care

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency

Actions Taken:

- Participated on the ESF 8 touch point call.

Planned Actions:

- Sync call transition on Friday.

7 | Logistics

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency

Actions Taken:

- Distributed 3K gowns to the Ohio National Guard in support of their missions statewide.
- ODPS ACF completed the delivery of ~170,000 FEMA cloth face masks to Ohio Department of Aging identified recipients.
- On August 12, transferred 288,000 disposable isolation gowns from the Ohio Expo Center Kasich building to the ODH Adelaide warehouse.
- Prepared shipments for further deliveries until goal of 1,000,000 gowns are transferred.
- Project goal number to be fully transferred by August 17 – 18.

Planned Actions:

- Continue to receive overflow shipments of purchased PPE at the Ohio Expo Center.
- Continue to prepare shipments for transfer to the ODH, Adelaide warehouse.

8 | Public Health

- Ohio Department of Health

Actions Taken:

- Participated in the FEMA Region V Synchronization Meeting topics discussed: - OHNG T32 status details - COVID-19 Testing supplies – provided example list of items ODH may be challenged with providing stakeholders. - Whether FEMA foresees any future CRAFT Team visits to Ohio – “Not at this time”.
- Conducted the ESF-8 Partners Touchpoint.

Planned Actions:

- During this operational period ESF-8 Desk has not initiated any mission requests with State partners.
- Continues to collaborate on daily planning efforts and provide guidance and information to various ESF-8 partners and stakeholders.

9 | Search and Rescue

Planned Actions:

- Continue to monitor and support as needed.

11 | Agriculture

- Ohio Department of Agriculture

Planned Actions:

- Continue to monitor and support as needed.

13 | Law Enforcement

- Ohio State Highway Patrol

Actions Taken:

- Developed a notification for OP3 partners that includes a product from the FBI regarding PPE Fraud Scheme toward the Public Health Sector.

Planned Actions:

- Provide site security for the Ohio Department of Health. Provide perimeter security for the Chillicothe Correctional Institution.

- Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction

Actions Taken:

- ODRC continues to work towards incident objectives.

Planned Actions:

- ODRC has 1007 staff COVID-19 positive, 893 staff recovered, 114 active positives and 5 deaths.
- ODRC has 406 incarcerated adults COVID-19 active positive, 4,356 recovered and 77 deaths, 22,290 total tested.
- ODRC Special Operations team members working at Chillicothe Correctional Institution for a security mission and Chillicothe Correctional Institution, Madison Correctional Institution and Southern Ohio Correctional Facility for medical missions.
- Ohio State Highway Patrol assisting with perimeter security at Chillicothe Correctional Institution activated July 23, 2020.

- ODRC continues to have hot spots with staff and inmate positive COVID-19, most of the hot spot institutions reflect the hot spots (counties) in the State of Ohio.

14 | Mitigation and Recovery

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency

Actions Taken:

- Participated on calls with University Hospitals and the Cleveland Clinic.
- Gave an overview of the recent executive order that authorized FEMA's Other Needs Assistance (ONA) Program as it relates to unemployment assistance.

Planned Actions:

- Continue to provide technical assistance to applicants.
- Have a weekly call with various hospitals. More than 24 hours out, but on Monday, Ohio EMA will have a call with ODJFS to coordinate administration of the FEMA ONA Program.

15 | Public Affairs

- JIC

Actions Taken:

- Pop-Up Testing today: Hays Porter School, Cincinnati.
- Gov. DeWine's Aug. 13th media briefing notes:
 - Dr. Curt of OSU Wexner Medical Center discussed myocarditis – inflammation of the heart muscle – and its relation to COVID-19 and athletes. Noted 10%-13% of athletes who tested positive for COVID-19 have developed myocarditis.
 - Ohio National Guard community missions continue throughout Ohio.
 - Gov. DeWine showed comparison between Ohio's school districts' plans for in-person learning vs. the current Ohio Public Health Advisory map showing the three levels of public emergency. Red/Level 3 counties are outlined in the Education Restart Model map (see attached).
 - Introduction of the Ohio Governor's Equity Advisory Board. Dept. of Aging Dir. McElroy and RecoveryOhio Dir. Nelson noted how the new board is addressing the health and well-being of all Ohioans; addressing inequalities and promoting diversity and inclusion.
 - New release of Commitment to Equity – COVID-19 Ohio Minority Health Strike Force Blueprint.

Planned Actions:

- Pop-Up Testing tomorrow, Aug. 14 in Cincinnati and Athens (The Plains).

Other Partners

- Ohio National Guard

Actions Taken:

- The Ohio National Guard has 760 people supporting COVID operations Tuesday.
- Sampling teams expect to collect 2100 samples at two community based testing site on August 13.
- Sample courier missions will transport 6480 samples from 53 locations on Thursday.
- 358 ONG personnel work in food banks around the State of Ohio.
- 2 specialists support the ODH Labs.
- 137 medical professionals are part of the sample collection teams.
- 29 personnel provided COVID sample courier services on behalf of the Dept of Medicaid.
- 11 medical personnel are caring for patients at a Richland County nursing home.
- 36 pax are working in the RSS warehouse moving PPE.
- 19 persons are working the ODH PPE overflow warehouse at the state Expo Center.

Planned Actions:

- Collection teams will staff two sites on August 14 and plan to collect 1700 samples.
- Courier teams will transport 10,955 samples on Friday, 14 August.

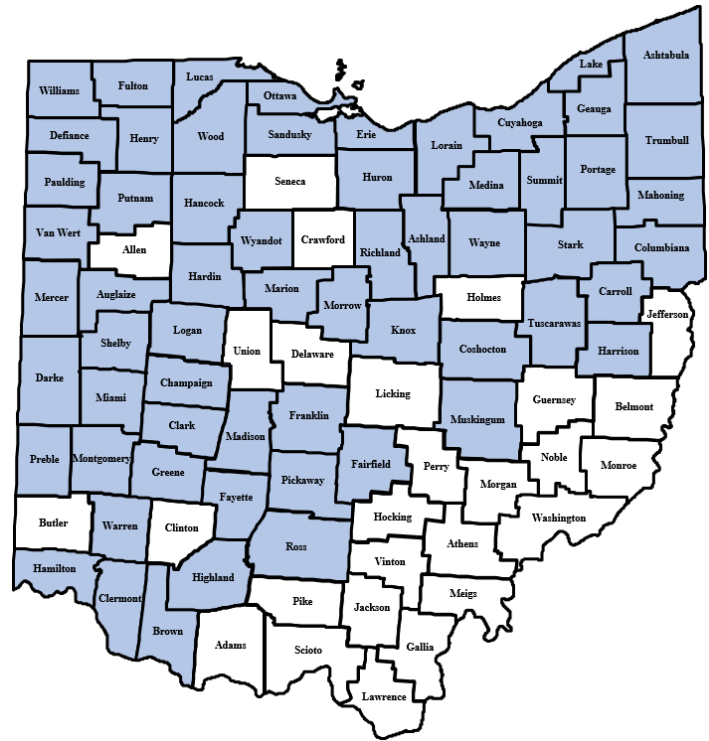

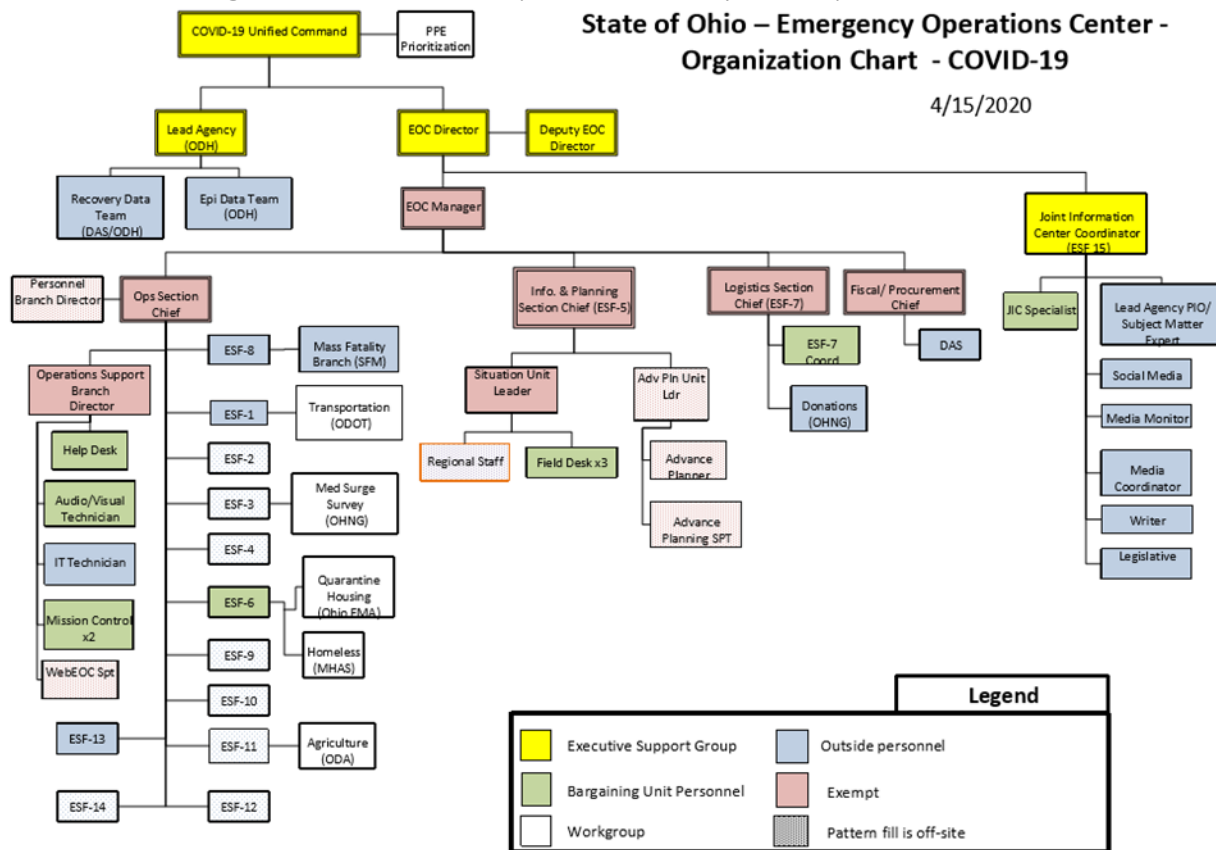
